

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

**INTRODUCED JANUARY 8, 1974** 

By Assemblymen GEWERTZ, FORAN, YATES, PERSKIE, BURSTEIN, GALLO, LEFANTE, WOODSON, STEWART, GORMAN and CHINNICI

(Without Reference)

An Act to amend \*and supplement\* "An act relating to excavation or blasting near pipes distributing or transmitting manufactured, mixed or natural gas," approved May 12, 1964 (P. L. 1964, c. 53).

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 1 of P. L. 1964, c. 53 (C. 2A:170-69.4) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 1. (a) No person shall discharge explosives in the ground within a distance of 200 feet of any pipe distributing or transmitting 4 manufactured, mixed or natural gas, \*or synthetic natural gas, 5 51 liquefied natural gas or propane gas,\* nor shall any person excavate in a street, highway, [or] public place, or private property, without 6 having first ascertained in the applicable manner prescribed herein 7 whether any pipe distributing or transmitting manufactured, mixed 8 or natural gas\*, or synthetic natural gas, liquefied natural gas or 9 propane gas\* is located within 200 feet of the place of discharge 10 or \*[within the area to be excavated]\* \*place of excavation\*. The 11 terms "excavate," "excavating" or "excavation," as used in this 12 act, shall not include the opening of the surface and the disturbance 13 of the subsoil thereunder of any street, highway, [or] public place 14 or private property for the purpose of installing or replacing poles 15and their appurtenances used or to be used in connection with the 16 17 supplying to the public of electricity for light, heat or power or of communication services. This act shall not apply to any work per-18 formed by or on behalf of the New Jersey \* Highway Depart-19 ment]\* \*Department of Transportation\*, New Jersey Highway 2021 Authority or New Jersey Turnpike Authority \*or by any person EXPLANATION-Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law,

excavating with nonpowered hand tools on private property to a
depth not to exceed 18 inches\*.

(b) Except as provided in subsections (c) \*[and]\* \*,\* (d) \*and  $\mathbf{24}$ 25 $(e)^*$  hereof the person responsible for the discharge of explosives or the excavation shall serve a written notice of intention at least 263 full working days (excluding Saturdays, Sundays and holidays) 2728prior to the discharge of explosives or commencement of any ex- $\mathbf{29}$ cavation on the person engaged in the distribution or transmission of manufactured, mixed or natural gas in the area. The said written 30 notice of intention shall be served personally or by registered or 31 certified mail, return receipt requested, on the person so engaged 3233in the transmission or distribution of the aforesaid gases and shall contain the name of the person responsible, the date, place and 34 type of discharge or excavation to be conducted. Service of a single 35notice of intention shall constitute compliance with this section 3637 when the discharge of explosives or the excavations take place on more than one day provided either or both are part of a single 38continuing project. Within 3 days after receipt of the notice of 39 intention, the person engaged in the distribution or transmission 40 41 of the aforesaid gases shall advise in writing or otherwise the 42 person named in the said notice of the location of all such pipes within 200 feet of the place of discharge or \* within the area to be 43excavated]\* \*place of excavation\*. 44

(c) In the event of an emergency involving danger to life, health
or property it shall be lawful to excavate without using explosives
if such notice and advice, in writing or otherwise, are given as soon
as reasonably possible.

(d) In the event of an emergency involving an immediate and
substantial danger of death or serious personal injury it shall be
lawful to discharge explosives in the ground if such notice and
advice, in writing or otherwise, are given at any time before any
such discharge is undertaken.

\*(e) In the event a public utility engaged in supplying electricity 54 for light, heat or power or in furnishing communication services 5556proposes to excavate in any private place, the notice provisions of 57subsection (b) hereof shall be inapplicable where said public utility 58has entered into a written agreement with a person engaged in the 59 distribution or transmission of manufactured, mixed or natural 60 gas, or synthetic natural gas, liquefied natural gas or propane gas 61 with respect to the securing of information as to the location of its transmission or distribution pipes within such place. 62 1 2. Section 2 of P. L. 1964, c. 53 (C. 2A:170-69.5) is amended to

2 read as follows:

2. Any such excavation or discharge shall be performed in such
manner as to avoid damage to any pipe distributing or transmitting
manufactured, mixed or natural gas or synthetic natural gas,
liquefied natural gas or propane gas. In the event that damage
does occur, the person distributing or transmitting manufactured,
mixed or natural gas, or synthetic natural gas, liquefied natural gas
or propane gas in the area shall be notified immediately.

3. No person who proposes to excavate or discharge explosives 1 2 shall be issued a building vermit, street opening vermit or other permit for such excavation or discharge of explosives until he pre-3 sents satisfactory proof to the issuing authority in the form of a 4 written statement that he has complied with the requirements of  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 this act. Upon issuance of such permit or permits the person proposing to excavate or discharge explosives shall be provided with 7 a placard not less than 8 1/2 inches by 11 inches by the issuing 8 authority which shall be prominently displayed at the site of the 9 excavation or discharge of explosives, clearly indicating that such 10 permit or permits have been issued and that the holder thereof has 11 12 complied with this act.

1 4. Section 3 of P. L. 1964, c. 53 (C. 2A:170-69.6) is amended to 2 read as follows:

- 3 3. Any person who [fails to give notice or advice as required by]
- 4 violates any provision of this act is a disorderly person.\*

1 **\*[2.]\*** \*5.\* This act shall take effect immediately.

OCTOBER 7, 1974 FOR INMEDIATE RELEASE POP FULLIER DEFENSION DECK GAUPDOLE Governor Brendan Byrne signed into How Monday a bill which prohibits certain excavations and the discharge of explosives without first determining whether gas lines are located within 200 feet.

The bill, <u>A-803</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Kenneth A. Gewertz, D-Gloucester, requires persons who are excavating to give three days notice to those engaged in the distribution or transmission of the affected gases in the area. The person engaged in distribution or transmission would then have three days to advise the location of all such pipes within 200 feet.

The affected gases are natural gas or synthetic natural gas, liquefied natural gas or propane gas.

The measure requires all excavations to be performed in a manner so as to avoid damage to any gas pipe.

The bill also provides that no one who proposes to excavate or discharge explosives shall be issued a building permit until proof is presented which shows compliance with the law.
