An Act concerning the annual stated meetings of boards of chosen freeholders, and amending R. S. 40:20-75.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1. R. S. 40:20-75 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 40:20-75. The stated annual meeting of the boards of chosen free-
- 3 holders shall be held at the place of holding the County Court in and
- 4 for the respective counties at 12 noon on either the first or second
- 5 day of January or on some other hour on any day during the first
- 6 week in January, annually, as the board, by resolution passed before
- 7 said meeting, may determine. If the date so fixed shall fall upon a
- 8 Sunday the meeting shall be held the following day.
- 1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

R. S. 40:20-3, R. S. 40:20-23 and P. L. 1966, c. 62 provide that boards of chosen freeholders shall organize on the first annual stated meeting. This bill permits boards of chosen freeholders to hold such annual stated meetings on any day during the first week in January, thereby allowing counties the same discretion in organizing as now possessed by municipalities pursuant to P. L. 1956, c. 176 (C. 40:45A-1).
