AN ACT to amend the "New Jersey Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Control Act," approved January 14, 1969 (P. L. 1968, c. 409).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 28 of P. L. 1968, c. 409 is amended to read as follows:

2 28. This act shall take effect January 1, 1969, and remain in effect
3 until **[December 31, 1974]** ***[March 31, 1975]*** *June 30, 1975*.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

This bill would extend the life of the New Jersey Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Control Act for 6 months.

Presently, the law will expire on December 31, 1974. The bill as drafted would have extended that date to March 31, 1975. The committee amended the bill so that the law would expire on June 30, 1975.
