- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

- 1. N. J. S. 40A:9-1 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 40A:9-1. Except in the case of counsel, attorney, engineer, health
- 3 officer, auditor, comptroller, appointed tax collector, appointed tax
- 4 assessor, or members of boards of assessors or as otherwise pro-
- 5 vided by law, every person holding an office, the authority and
- 6 duties of which relate to a county only, to a municipality only, shall
- 7 reside within said county or municipality, as the case may be.
- 8 Any person holding or attempting to hold any such office in a
- 9 county or municipality in violation hereof, may be ousted in a pro-
- 10 ceeding in lieu of preprogative writ.

Senate Bill No. 1356 concerns the waiver of residency requirements for certain local officials.

This bill authorizes any municipality, if it so chooses, to appoint a nonresident to the office of tax collector.
