AN ACT permitting political subdivisions to set aside funds from 2 public works contracts for programs to recruit and train women 3 and minority group members and promote employment of local 4 residents, and amending P.L.2009, c.313.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. Section 1 of P.L.2009, c.313 (C.52:38-7) is amended to read as follows:
- 11 1. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of any law or regulation 12 to the contrary, upon entering into any public works contract in 13 excess of \$1,000,000 which is funded, in whole or in part, by funds 14 of a public body, or any public works contract of any size which is 15 funded, in whole or in part, by funds provided to the public body 16 pursuant to the "American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 17 2009," Pub.L.111-5, the public body entering into the contract shall 18 transfer an amount equal to one half of one percent of the portion of 19 the contract amount funded by funds of the public body, or provided 20 to the public body pursuant to the "American Recovery and 21 Reinvestment Act of 2009," Pub.L.111-5, to the Department of 22 Labor and Workforce Development, except that any Statewide 23 authority which enters into the contract and administers a program 24 which meets the requirements of this section may retain all or a 25 portion of the one half of one percent share of the funds under the 26 contract as is necessary for the operation of the program, but shall 27 transfer to the department any portion of the funds not necessary for the program, and except that funds shall not be transferred or 28 29 retained pursuant to this section if the transfer or retaining of the 30 funds is contrary to any federal requirement and may result in the 31 loss of federal funds. For a project in which federal and State funds 32 are combined, the entire amount may be transferred or retained 33 from the State portion of the funds if doing so is necessary to 34 prevent any loss of federal funds. A political subdivision may elect, 35 but is not required, to transfer to the department or retain, for any one or more of the purposes indicated in subsection b. of this 36 37 section or for the purpose of providing incentives or otherwise 38 facilitating a local hiring and employment program, an amount 39 equal to one half of one percent of the portion of any public work 40 contract of the political subdivision.

The department, political subdivision, or authority shall use funds transferred or retained pursuant to this section to provide grants to implement such programs to consortia which include those community-based organizations, faith-based organizations, labor organizations, employers, contractors and trade organizations, institutions of higher education, and schools and other local public agencies which the department, political subdivision, or authority determines are best able to facilitate entry and success of minority group members and women into training and long-term trade and professional employment in the construction industry, and may use a portion of the funds for initiatives to prepare minority group members and women for registered apprenticeship programs and related post-secondary education, such as grants to consortia provided pursuant to the "Youth Transitions to Work Partnership Act," P.L.1993, c. 268 (C.34:15E-1 et seq.), and for initiatives, such as those of the NJ PLACE program established pursuant to P.L.2009, c.200 (C.34:15D-24 et al.), to facilitate the coordination and articulation of registered apprenticeship programs with degree programs in institutions of higher education, including initiatives to articulate programs in a manner which may assist in providing transitions from trade occupations to professional occupations utilized in the construction industry. 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STATEMENT

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This bill amends section 1 of P.L.2009, c.313 (C.52:38-7) to provide that any political subdivision of the State, including a

school district, may elect, but is not required, to transfer to the Department of Labor and Workforce Development, or retain, an amount equal to one half of one percent (0.5%) of the portion of any public work contract of the political subdivision for the recruitment and training of women and minorities in the construction industry or for the purpose of providing incentives or otherwise facilitating a local hiring and employment program.

That law currently requires the set-aside of 0.5% of the value of public work contacts of the State and State authorities for the recruitment and training of women and minorities in the construction industry. This bill extends to political subdivisions the authority to set aside 0.5% of the value of their public works contracts for such recruitment and training programs and other programs to promote local hiring in public works, but gives the political subdivisions full discretion whether or not to have the set-asides and programs.

The Assembly Labor Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 368.

This bill amends section 1 of P.L.2009, c.313 (C.52:38-7) to provide that any political subdivision of the State, including a school district, may elect to retain or transfer to the Department of Labor and Workforce Development an amount equal to one half of one percent of the portion of any public work contract of the political subdivision for the: (1) recruitment and training of women and minorities in the construction industry; or (2) purpose of providing incentives or otherwise facilitating a local hiring and employment program.

Current law provides a set-aside of one half of one percent of the value of public work contracts of the State and State authorities, to be used for the recruitment and training of women and minorities in the construction industry. This bill provides political subdivisions with the authority to use a portion of local public work contracts for a similar purpose. However, the provisions of the bill are elective. Accordingly, political subdivisions would have discretion to implement set-asides and programs, but would not be required to do so.

The Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 368.

This bill amends section 1 of P.L.2009, c.313 (C.52:38-7) to provide that any political subdivision of the State, including a school district, may elect to retain or transfer to the Department of Labor and Workforce Development an amount equal to one half of one percent of the portion of any public work contract of the political subdivision for the: (1) recruitment and training of women and minorities in the construction industry; or (2) purpose of providing incentives or otherwise facilitating a local hiring and employment program.

Current law provides a set-aside of one half of one percent of the value of public work contracts of the State and State authorities, to be used for the recruitment and training of women and minorities in the construction industry. This bill provides political subdivisions with the authority to use a portion of local public work contracts for a similar purpose. However, the provisions of the bill are elective. Accordingly, political subdivisions would have discretion to implement set-asides and programs, but would not be required to do so.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2018-2019 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.



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2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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school district, may elect, but is not required, to transfer to the
Department of Labor and Workforce Development, or retain, an
amount equal to one half of one percent (0.5%) of the portion of
any public work contract of the political subdivision for the
recruitment and training of women and minorities in the
construction industry or for the purpose of providing incentives or
otherwise facilitating a local hiring and employment program.

8 That law currently requires the set-aside of 0.5% of the value of 9 public work contacts of the State and State authorities for the 10 recruitment and training of women and minorities in the construction industry. This bill extends to political subdivisions the 11 12 authority to set aside 0.5% of the value of their public works 13 contracts for such recruitment and training programs and other 14 programs to promote local hiring in public works, but gives the 15 political subdivisions full discretion whether or not to have the set-16 asides and programs.

The Assembly Labor Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 4817.

This bill amends section 1 of P.L.2009, c.313 (C.52:38-7) to provide that any political subdivision of the State, including a school district, may elect to retain or transfer to the Department of Labor and Workforce Development an amount equal to one half of one percent of the portion of any public work contract of the political subdivision for the: (1) recruitment and training of women and minorities in the construction industry; or (2) purpose of providing incentives or otherwise facilitating a local hiring and employment program.

Current law provides a set-aside of one half of one percent of the value of public work contracts of the State and State authorities, to be used for the recruitment and training of women and minorities in the construction industry. This bill provides political subdivisions with the authority to use a portion of local public work contracts for a similar purpose. However, the provisions of the bill are elective. Accordingly, political subdivisions would have discretion to implement set-asides and programs, but would not be required to do so.

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Governor Murphy Takes Action on Legislation

Trenton – Today, Governor Phil Murphy signed the following bills into law:

\$368 (Rice, Turner/Verrelli, Reynolds-Jackson, Swain) – Authorizes political subdivisions to set aside 0.5 percent of public works funds to recruit and train women and minorities and promote local hiring.

\$768 (Cunningham, Cruz-Perez/Pinkin, Jasey, DeAngelo, Danielsen, Wimberly, McKnight, Taliaferro) – Requires institutions of higher education to develop open textbook plan.

\$1857 (Turner, Diegnan/Pinkin, Jasey, Karabinchak, Holley) – Designates Thomas Alva Edison as State Inventor.

A4897 (Lopez, Benson/O'Scanlon, Singleton) – Permits 20 year ferry boat local public contracts; permits 50 year local public contracts for certain capital improvements and extends prevailing wage requirements to certain work performed under those contracts.

A5159 (Reynolds-Jackson, Verrelli, Karabinchak/Diegnan, Greenstein) – Permits county commissioner of registration and board of elections to use electronic poll books

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
