### P.L. 2019, CHAPTER 281, approved January 9, 2020 Senate, No. 1874 (Second Reprint)

1 AN ACT concerning special "Breast Cancer Awareness" license 2 plates and supplementing chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised 3 Statutes.

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. Upon proper application, the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission shall issue special license plates supporting Breast Cancer Awareness for any motor vehicle owned or leased and registered in the State. In addition to the registration number and other markings or identification otherwise prescribed by law, the license '[plate] plates' shall display the slogan '[supporting]' "Early Detection Saves Lives." The chief administrator shall select the design, including an emblem and color scheme, in consultation with a breast cancer awareness organization selected by the Governor. Breast Cancer Awareness license plates shall be subject to the provisions of chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes, except as hereinafter otherwise specifically provided.
  - b. Application for issuance of Breast Cancer Awareness license plates shall be made to the chief administrator on forms and in a manner prescribed by the chief administrator. In order to be deemed complete, an application shall be accompanied by a fee of \$50, payable to the commission, which shall be in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of a motor vehicle. The chief administrator shall collect annually, subsequent to the year of issuance of the Breast Cancer Awareness license <sup>1</sup>[plate] plates <sup>1</sup>, a \$10 fee for the license <sup>1</sup>[plate] plates <sup>1</sup> in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of a motor vehicle. amount collected from all license plate fees collected pursuant to subsection b. of this section, less the amounts necessary to reimburse the commission for administrative costs pursuant to subsection d. of this section. Monies deposited in the fund shall be equally distributed for the purpose of funding breast cancer research and mammograms for uninsured women in New Jersey. <sup>2</sup>Of the amount of monies distributed in the fund for the purpose of funding breast cancer research, 30 percent of those monies deposited shall be distributed for the purpose of funding metastatic breast cancer research.<sup>2</sup> Monies deposited in the fund shall be held in interest-bearing accounts in public depositories as defined pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1970, c.236 (C.17:9-41), and may be invested or reinvested in securities approved by the State Treasurer. The chief administrator shall annually certify to the State Treasurer the average cost per license plate incurred in the immediately preceding year by the commission in producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the Breast Cancer Awareness license plates. The annual certification of the average cost per license plate shall be approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor.

In the event that the average cost per license plate as certified by the chief administrator and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor, is greater than the \$50 application fee established in subsection b. of this section in two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the issuance of Breast Cancer Awareness license plates.

e. The chief administrator shall notify eligible motorists of the opportunity to obtain Breast Cancer Awareness license plates by publicizing the availability of the license plates on the website of the commission. The breast cancer awareness organization selected by the Governor pursuant to subsection a. of this section, and any other individual or entity designated by that organization, may

publicize the availability of Breast Cancer Awareness license plates in any manner the organization deems appropriate.

The chief administrator and the breast cancer awareness organization selected by the Governor pursuant to subsection a. of this section shall develop and enter into a memorandum of agreement setting forth the procedures to be followed in carrying out their respective responsibilities under P.L. , c. In addition to the registration number and other markings or identification otherwise prescribed by law, these license plates would display the words "Early Detection Saves Lives" and may include a breast cancer awareness emblem to be designed by the chief administrator in consultation with a breast cancer awareness organization selected by the Governor.

An application fee of \$50 and an annual renewal fee of \$10 would be required for the special plates in addition to all fees otherwise required by law for the registration of the motor vehicle. These additional fees, after the deduction of the cost of producing and publicizing the plates, are to be deposited in a special non lapsing account known as the "Breast Cancer Awareness License Plate Fund." The proceeds are to be distributed toward the funding of mammograms for uninsured woman and breast cancer research in New Jersey.

State and other public funds are not permitted to be used by the commission for the initial cost of the special license plates. The chief administrator is required to certify the average cost per unit in producing, issuing and publicizing the "Breast Cancer Awareness"

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license plates each year. If the average cost exceeds \$50 for two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the license plate program. The chief administrator would also be responsible for notifying eligible motorists of the availability of the plates.

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The bill will remain inoperative until the first day of the 13th month following the provision to the commission by the breast cancer awareness organization of 500 completed applications for the Breast Cancer Awareness license plates and an amount of money determined by the chief administrator, not to exceed \$25,000, to offset initial costs incurred by the commission. If the breast cancer awareness organization does not satisfy these requirements by the last day of the 12th month following enactment, the provisions of the bill expire.

The Assembly Women and Children Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1874 (2R).

This bill requires the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission to establish special Breast Cancer Awareness license plates for motor vehicles registered in New Jersey. The license plates are to display the words "Early Detection Saves Lives" and are to be designed by the chief administrator in consultation with a breast cancer awareness organization selected by the Governor.

An application fee of \$50 and an annual renewal fee of \$10 is required for the special plates in addition to all fees otherwise required by law for the registration of a motor vehicle. These additional fees, after the deduction of the cost to implement the plates, are to be deposited into the "Breast Cancer Awareness License Plate Fund" established under the bill. The proceeds are to be distributed toward the funding of mammograms for uninsured women and breast cancer research in New Jersey.

The chief administrator is required to annually certify the average cost or producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the license plates. If the average cost per plate exceeds \$50 for two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the license plate program. The chief administrator is also responsible for notifying eligible motorists of the availability of the license plates. The bill also requires that the organization appoint a liaison to represent the organization in all communications with the commission regarding the license plates.

State and other public funds may not be used by the commission for the initial cost to implement the license plate program. The bill requires a representative designated by the organization selected by the Governor to contribute non-public monies, not to exceed \$25,000, to offset the initial cost to design, produce, issue, and publicize the license plates and for any computer programming necessary to implement the program. The bill authorizes the organization to receive funds from private sources to be used to offset the initial costs.

The bill prohibits the commission from designing, producing, issuing or publicizing the availability of the Breast Cancer Awareness license plates, or making any necessary programming changes, until: (1) the organization selected by the Governor, or its designee, has provided the commission with the money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the license plate program; and (2) the organization, or its designee, has provided the commission with a minimum of 500 completed applications for the license plates, upon the availability for purchase of those license plates.

The Governor is to select an organization upon enactment of the bill; however, the other provisions of the bill will remain inoperative until the first day of the 13th month following the date on which the appropriate applications and fees required to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission are provided to the commission. The bill expires on the last day of the 12th month after enactment if sufficient applications and fees to offset the initial costs are not received.

As reported by the committee, Senate Bill No. 1874 (2R) is identical to Assembly Bill No. 921, which was also reported by the committee on this date, with amendments.

The Senate Transportation Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 1874.

As amended and reported, this bill requires the Chief Administrator (chief administrator) of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (commission) to establish special "Breast Cancer Awareness" license plates for motor vehicles registered in New Jersey. The bill prohibits the commission from designing, producing, issuing or publicizing the availability of the "Breast Cancer Awareness" license plates, or making any necessary programming changes, until: (1) the organization, or its designee, has provided the commission with the money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the license plate program; and (2) the organization, or its designee, has provided the commission with a minimum of 500 completed applications for the license plates, upon the availability for purchase of those license plates.

The Governor is to select an organization upon enactment of the bill; however, the other provisions of the bill will remain inoperative until the first day of the 13th month following the date on which the appropriate applications and fees required to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission are provided to the commission. The bill expires on the last day of the 12th month after enactment if sufficient applications and fees to offset the initial costs are not received.

The committee amended the bill to provide that the commission is to be reimbursed for all costs reasonably and actually incurred for any computer programming changes necessary to implement the "Breast Cancer Awareness" license plate program in an amount not to exceed \$150,000. The committee amendments clarify that monies provided by a representative designated by the organization to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission to implement the license plate program are to be non-public monies. - The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) finds that the bill will produce annual State revenue and expenditure increases that will likely offset one another. The OLS notes, however, that the implementation of the bill is conditioned upon the receipt by the commission of a minimum of 500 applications for the new specialty license plate.
- The bill establishes the Breast Cancer Awareness license plate program in a manner that will likely allow the MVC to fully recover the expenses incurred in administering the program. The MVC has identified its initial cost of designing and establishing a new license plate series as \$65,700 for computer system changes and the initial print of 550 license plates.

The initial fee collections will likely reimburse the commission for the expenses it incurs in administering the license plate program. The MVC will be permitted to retain additional fee amounts until its costs are fully reimbursed.



• After the MVC recovers the license program administration costs, the State may realize any positive revenue generated by the plate fees, estimated between \$15,000 and \$275,000, as the recipient of the dedicated cause funds. This revenue is considered State revenue since the bill is not clear to which entity that the State is required to appropriate the funds for the purposes of fulfilling the bill's mandate to fund mammograms for uninsured women and breast cancer research. These funds could be appropriated to the Department of Health (DOH) or various non-profit organizations for the purposes of fulfilling the bill's mandate. It is unclear whether these funds would supplement or replace existing State funding currently appropriated for this purpose. It is also unclear whether the sales of the Breast Cancer Awareness license plates will have an impact on the sales of existing Conquer Cancer license plates as the license plates embody similar causes.

### **BILL DESCRIPTION**

This bill requires the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission to establish special Breast Cancer Awareness license plates for motor vehicles registered in the State.

An application fee of \$50 and an annual renewal fee of \$10 is required for the special plates in addition to all fees otherwise required by law for the registration of a motor vehicle. These additional fees, after the deduction of the cost to implement the plates, are to be deposited into the "Breast Cancer Awareness License Plate Fund" established under the bill. The proceeds are to be distributed toward the funding of mammograms for uninsured women and breast cancer research in New Jersey with 30 percent of those proceeds to be distributed for the purpose of funding metastatic breast cancer research.

The chief administrator of the commission is required to annually certify the average cost or producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the license plates. The bill requires a representative designated by a breast cancer awareness organization selected by the Governor to contribute non-public monies, not to exceed \$25,000, to offset the initial cost to design, produce, issue, and publicize the license plates and for any computer programming necessary to implement the program. The bill authorizes the organization to receive funds from private sources to be used to offset the initial costs.

#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **EXECUTIVE BRANCH**

The Executive has not submitted a formal, written fiscal note for this bill. However, in response to an OLS Discussion Point in the FY 2017-2018 Department of Transportation and New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission Budget Analysis, the MVC indicated that its upfront cost was \$65,700 to set up a license plate program, which includes computer changes and the initial print run of 550 plates.

In response to an OLS Discussion Point in FY 2019-2020 Department of Transportation and New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission Budget Analysis, the MVC indicated that the projected revenue collection is \$236,326 for FY 2019 and \$238,689 for FY 2020 for the existing Conquer Cancer license plates established pursuant to P.L.1997, c.92 (C.39:3-27.90).

#### OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The OLS finds that the bill will produce annual State revenue and expenditure increases that will likely offset one another. The OLS cannot quantify the annual increases because it is unclear how many applications for the new specialty license plate the commission will receive.

The bill establishes the Breast Cancer Awareness license plate program in such a manner that the MVC is likely to fully recover the expenses that it incurs in administering the license plate program. If the number of license plate applications is below 500 in the first 12 months following the effective date, the bill may expire without the creation of the license plate program. Conversely, if the number of applications is equal to or greater than 500, the commission is likely to recover its costs within no more than three years of the creation of the license plate program.

Prior to designing and producing the license plates, an individual or entity designated by an breast cancer awareness organization selected by the Governor is required to provide up to \$25,000 and the organization is required to pre-register 500 applicants for the license plates. This requirement ensures that the commission will able to recover its initial costs in producing the license plates and, if enough funds are not provided, the commission will not be required to produce the license plates. The payment of up to \$25,000 is required to come from private sources so the amount is not expected to be a State or local cost.

Upon production of the license plates, the MVC may still discontinue the program if the production cost in two consecutive fiscal years exceeds \$50 per license plate, which is the initial fee that the commission is required, pursuant to the bill, to collect for each set of license plates. This ensures that the MVC will not experience any net costs in the administration of this license plate program. The current cost per specialty license plate to the MVC is \$6.60 so it is unlikely that the commission will experience any net cost in the administration of the program.

The MVC indicated in response to a FY 2017-2018 OLS Discussion Point that it faced an upfront cost of \$65,700 to initiate a license plate program, which includes computer changes and the initial print of 550 license plates. Pursuant to the bill, the MVC would obtain the first \$50,000 of those costs through the initial \$25,000 fee received from the individual or entity designated by the breast cancer awareness organization and the fees generated through the first 500 license plate sales. The remaining \$15,700 will likely be recovered through the sale of additional Breast Cancer Awareness license plates or by retaining collections from the \$10 annual fee from the original license plate customers. The first 500 license plate sales will generate \$5,000 per year from the \$10 annual renewal fee. So in the event that no other plates were purchased under the program, the MVC could recover the remaining costs after three years of collecting the annual fee.

The bill prevents the MVC from realizing net revenues in administering the program by requiring the commission to deposit all program fees into a special fund to be appropriated for the purposes of funding mammograms for uninsured women and breast cancer research, once the commission has deducted its costs in administering the program. The combination of guaranteed fee collection for the commission and the limit on retaining any fees greater than its cost creates a scenario where there is likely to be no net fiscal impact to the commission in the administration of this license plate program.

The State is likely to realize net revenues through the program if there are a sufficient number of applicants for the Breast Cancer Awareness license plates. The bill is unclear to which entity that the State is required to appropriate the funds for the purposes of fulfilling the bill's mandate to fund mammograms for uninsured women and breast cancer research. These funds could be appropriated to the DOH or various non-profit organizations for purposes of fulfilling the bill's mandate.

It is unclear whether these funds would supplement or replace existing State funding currently appropriated for this purpose. If plate production begins the State would be expected to realize between \$5,000 and \$275,000 per year for the department or entity that will receive the funds, based on FY 2019-2020 Budget data from existing dedicated cause plates. Any new revenues realized from the license plates could be used for breast cancer screenings or breast cancer research. It is also unclear whether the sales of the Breast Cancer Awareness license plates will have an impact on the sales existing Conquer Cancer license plates, which shares a similar mission to the Breast Cancer Awareness license plates. The MVC indicated in response to a FY 2019-2020 OLS Discussion Point that the projected revenues are \$236,326 for FY 2019 and \$238,689 for FY 2020 for the Conquer Cancer license plates. The revenues collected from the Conquer Cancer license plates are appropriated annually to the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research. Due to the fact that the license plates would support similar objectives in funding cancer research, there is a possibility the two sets of license plates could compete and impact the sales of the other set of license plates.

The proceeds are to be distributed toward the funding of mammograms for uninsured women and breast cancer research in New Jersey with 30 percent of those proceeds to be distributed for the purpose of funding metastatic breast cancer research.

The chief administrator of the commission is required to annually certify the average cost or producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the license plates. If the average cost per plate exceeds \$50 for two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the license plate program.

The bill provides that no State and other public funds will be used by the commission for the Breast Cancer Awareness license plate program, but will be funded by license plate application and renewal fees and \$25,000 from private donations. The bill requires a representative designated by a breast cancer awareness organization selected by the Governor to contribute non-public monies, not to exceed \$25,000, to offset the initial cost to design, produce, issue, and publicize the license plates and for any computer programming necessary to implement the program. The bill authorizes the organization to receive funds from private sources to be used to offset the initial costs.

The bill prohibits the MVC from designing, producing, issuing or publicizing the availability of the Breast Cancer Awareness license plates, or making any necessary programming changes, until: (1) the breast cancer awareness organization selected by the Governor, or its designee, has provided the commission with the money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the license plate program; and (2) the organization, or its designee, has provided the commission with a minimum of 500 completed applications for the license plates, upon the availability for purchase of those license plates.

The Governor is to select an organization upon enactment of the bill; however, the other provisions of the bill will remain inoperative until the first day of the 13th month following the date on which the appropriate applications and fees required to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission are provided to the commission. The bill expires on the last day of the 12th month after enactment if sufficient applications and fees to offset the initial costs are not received.

### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **EXECUTIVE BRANCH**

The Executive has not submitted a formal, written fiscal note for this bill. However, in response to an OLS Discussion Point in the FY 2017-2018 Department of Transportation and New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission Budget Analysis, the MVC indicated that its upfront cost was \$65,700 to set up a license plate program, which includes computer changes and the initial print run of 550 plates.

In response to an OLS Discussion Point in FY 2019-2020 Department of Transportation and New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission Budget Analysis, the MVC indicated that the projected revenue collection is \$236,326 for FY 2019 and \$238,689 for FY 2020 for the existing Conquer Cancer license plates established pursuant to P.L.1997, c.92 (C.39:3-27.90).

#### OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The OLS finds that the bill will produce annual State revenue and expenditure increases that will likely offset one another. The OLS cannot quantify the annual increases because it is unclear how many applications for the new specialty license plate the commission will receive.

The bill establishes the Breast Cancer Awareness license plate program in such a manner that the MVC is likely to fully recover the expenses that it incurs in administering the license plate program. If the number of license plate applications is below 500 in the first 12 months following the effective date, the bill may expire without the creation of the license plate program. Conversely, if the number of applications is equal to or greater than 500, the commission is likely to recover its costs within no more than three years of the creation of the license plate program.

Prior to designing and producing the license plates, an individual or entity designated by an breast cancer awareness organization selected by the Governor is required to provide up to \$25,000 and the organization is required to pre-register 500 applicants for the license plates. This requirement ensures that the commission will able to recover its initial costs in producing the license plates and, if enough funds are not provided, the commission will not be required to produce the license plates. The payment of up to \$25,000 is required to come from private sources so the amount is not expected to be a State or local cost.

Upon production of the license plates, the MVC may still discontinue the program if the production cost in two consecutive fiscal years exceeds \$50 per license plate, which is the initial fee that the commission is required, pursuant to the bill, to collect for each set of license plates. This ensures that the MVC will not experience any net costs in the administration of this license plate program. The current cost per specialty license plate to the MVC is \$6.60 so it is unlikely that the commission will experience any net cost in the administration of the program.

The MVC indicated in response to a FY 2017-2018 OLS Discussion Point that it faced an upfront cost of \$65,700 to initiate a license plate program, which includes computer changes and the initial print of 550 license plates. Pursuant to the bill, the MVC would obtain the first \$50,000 of those costs through the initial \$25,000 fee received from the individual or entity designated by the breast cancer awareness organization and the fees generated through the first 500 license plate sales. The remaining \$15,700 will likely be recovered through the sale of additional Breast Cancer Awareness license plates or by retaining collections from the \$10 annual fee from the original license plate customers. The first 500 license plate sales will generate \$5,000 per year from the \$10 annual renewal fee. So in the event that no other plates were purchased under the program, the MVC could recover the remaining costs after three years of collecting the annual fee.

The bill prevents the MVC from realizing net revenues in administering the program by requiring the commission to deposit all program fees into a special fund to be appropriated for the purposes of funding mammograms for uninsured women and breast cancer research, once the commission has deducted its costs in administering the program. The combination of guaranteed fee collection for the commission and the limit on retaining any fees greater than its cost creates a scenario where there is likely to be no net fiscal impact to the commission in the administration of this license plate program.

The State is likely to realize net revenues through the program if there are a sufficient number of applicants for the Breast Cancer Awareness license plates. The bill is unclear to which entity that the State is required to appropriate the funds for the purposes of fulfilling the bill's mandate to fund mammograms for uninsured women and breast cancer research. These funds could be appropriated to the DOH or various non-profit organizations for purposes of fulfilling the bill's mandate.

It is unclear whether these funds would supplement or replace existing State funding currently appropriated for this purpose. If plate production begins the State would be expected to realize between \$5,000 and \$275,000 per year for the department or entity that will receive the funds, based on FY 2019-2020 Budget data from existing dedicated cause plates. Any new revenues realized from the license plates could be used for breast cancer screenings or breast cancer research. It is also unclear whether the sales of the Breast Cancer Awareness license plates will have an impact on the sales existing Conquer Cancer license plates, which shares a similar mission to the Breast Cancer Awareness license plates. The MVC indicated in response to a FY 2019-2020 OLS Discussion Point that the projected revenues are \$236,326 for FY 2019 and \$238,689 for FY 2020 for the Conquer Cancer license plates. The revenues collected from the Conquer Cancer license plates are appropriated annually to the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research. Due to the fact that the license plates would support similar objectives in funding cancer research, there is a possibility the two sets of license plates could compete and impact the sales of the other set of license plates.

# Governor Murphy Takes Action on Legislation

**TRENTON** – Today, Governor Phil Murphy signed the following bills into law:

**S446 (Addiego, Madden/DeAngelo, Houghtaling, Wirths) -** Provides preferences for certain businesses applying for workforce development grants.

**S1242 (Turner, Greenstein/Benson, DeAngelo, Pinkin)** - Requires boil water notices be provided to municipal officials within one hour.

**S1712 (Beach, Turner/Lampitt, Chaparro, Houghtaling)** - Requires consumer notification of vehicle warranty for aftermarket and recycled parts.

**S1874 (Ruiz, Greenstein/Giblin, Webber, Wimberly, Chiaravalloti) -** Establishes special license plates to bring awareness to breast cancer.

**S2055 (Cunningham, Ruiz/Sumter, Jasey, Jones)** - Permits incarcerated persons to receive student financial aid.

**S2106 (Bucco, Bucco/Dancer, Pinkin)** - Requires Adjutant General of DMVA to issue State flag to resident enrolling in federal service academy.

**S2656 (Pou, Cruz-Perez, Ruiz/Lopez, Mejia, Chaparro)** - Establishes 35 member New Jersey Puerto Rico Commission in Department of State.

**S2905 (Singleton/Mukherji, Armato, Mazzeo)** - Prohibits certain possession, sale, trade, distribution, or offering for sale of shark fins.

**S3594 (Singer, Singleton/Quijano)** - Provides certain employment protections for National Guard members employed in New Jersey.

**SJR36 (Weinberg/Mosquera, Lampitt, Webber) -** Designates October of each year as "Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Month" in New Jersey.

**SJR59 (Doherty, Madden/Mosquera, Moriarty, Dancer) -** Designates May of each year as "Civil War Veterans Recognition Month," in honor of the Grand Army of the Republic and the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War.

**SJR83 (Van Drew/Armato, Mazzeo, DeAngelo)** - Expresses support for United States Air Force to base F-35 fighter jets at 177th Fighter Wing in Atlantic City.

**A5070 (Speight, Tucker, Pintor Marin/Ruiz, Rice, Cunningham)** - Authorizes certain municipalities to impose parking taxes to fund projects to improve pedestrian access to mass transit.

Governor Murphy conditionally vetoed the following bill:

**S2389 (Singleton/Quijano, Downey, Houghtaling, Moriarty)** – Requires New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy to establish prescription drug pricing disclosure website and certain pharmaceutical manufacturing companies to provide prescription drug price information.
