The Senate Education Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 165.

In order to be eligible for the teacher leader endorsement, an applicant will be required to: complete a program of study equivalent to, at a minimum, 12 graduate credits or 180 clock hours; and complete five years of full-time teaching under a valid provisional or standard certificate, or a combination thereof, issued by the State Board of Examiners.

The bill establishes a Teacher Leader Endorsement Advisory Board in the Department of Education which will make recommendations to the Department of Education and State Board of Education regarding the program of study for the teacher leader endorsement. The advisory board will continue to meet after the recommendations are made in order to continue to advise the department regarding any necessary adjustments to the program of study for the teacher leader endorsement and to assess the outcomes associated with the various providers of the program of study for the endorsement. No later than five years after the bill's effective date, the advisory board will make recommendations to the State board regarding non-supervisory roles and responsibilities for which a teacher leader endorsement should be required.

Under the provisions of the bill, a State institution of higher education, an educational organization, or other non-profit entity, or a combination thereof, may apply to the Department of Education to offer a program of study leading to the issuance of the teacher leader endorsement. The State Board of Education is required to promulgate regulations that set standards for the approval of these providers, and the department will, in accordance with those standards, approve providers.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2014-2015 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.

These Assembly amendments:

- eliminate the requirements that an applicant for a teacher leader endorsement to the instructional certificate:
 - complete a program of study equivalent to 12 graduate credits, or 180 clock hours; the amendments do not specify any minimum;
 - complete five years of full-time teaching under a valid provisional or standard certificate;
- remove the provision that the officer or employer of the Department of Education who serves on the Teacher Leader Endorsement Advisory Board be a non-voting member;
- make the advisory board responsible for making recommendations to the Commissioner of Education and the State Board of Education regarding the requirements to be eligible to receive the teacher leader endorsement;
- allow an institution of higher education not located in the State to apply to offer a program of study for the teacher leader endorsement;
- eliminate the specific details that would be included in an application to offer a program of study for the teacher leader endorsement; and
- delete the requirement that the department collect data from the approved providers of the program of study, while stipulating that any data collected from providers must protect individuals' privacy. Any data collected would not be accessible to the public under the State's open public records act.

AN ACT concerning teacher certification and supplementing chapter
 26 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

7 1. The State Board of Education shall authorize a teacher
8 leader endorsement to the instructional certificate. To be eligible
9 for the teacher leader endorsement an applicant shall:

a. Complete a program of study equivalent to, at a minimum,
12 graduate credits or 180 clock hours, or a combination thereof,
with an approved provider of a program of study for the teacher
leader endorsement; and

b. Complete five years of full-time teaching under a valid
provisional or standard certificate, or a combination thereof, issued
by the State Board of Examiners.

2. a. There shall be established an 11-member Teacher Leader 18 19 Endorsement Advisory Board in the Department of Education. The members of the advisory board shall be appointed by the 20 Commissioner of Education as follows: one officer or employee of 21 22 the department; four members upon the recommendation of the New Jersey Education Association; one member upon the 23 24 recommendation of the American Federation of Teachers-New 25 Jersey; two members upon the recommendation of the New Jersey Principals and Supervisors Association; one member upon the 26 27 recommendation of the New Jersey Association of School 28 Administrators; one member upon the recommendation of the New 29 Jersey School Boards Association; and one member upon the 30 recommendation of the New Jersey Association of Colleges for 31 Teacher Education. The member who is an officer or employee of the department shall be a non-voting member of the advisory board. 32

Members of the advisory board, other than the member who 33 b. 34 is an officer or employee of the department, shall serve for a three-35 year term; except that of the initial appointees, the member 36 appointed upon the recommendation of the New Jersey Association of Colleges for Teacher Education, one of the members appointed 37 38 upon the recommendation of the New Jersey Principals and 39 Supervisors Association, and one of the members appointed upon the recommendation of the New Jersey Education Association shall 40 41 serve for a term of three years; the members appointed upon the recommendation of the American Federation of Teachers-New 42 43 Jersey and the New Jersey Association of School Administrators, 44 and one of the members appointed upon the recommendation of the 45 New Jersey Education Association shall serve for a term of two 46 years; and the member appointed upon the recommendation of the 47 New Jersey School Boards Association, one of the members

c. The advisory board shall organize no later than two months
following the effective date of this section, and shall elect a chair

The advisory board shall, no later than six months following 9 its organization, make recommendations to the Department of 10 Education and the State Board of Education regarding the program of study for the teacher leader endorsement. The recommendations 11 12 shall be aligned with the teacher leader model standards set forth in 13 subsection f. of this section. The recommendations regarding the 14 program of study may include, but need not be limited to, field 15 experiences and additional coursework acquired beyond the 16 standards.

 modeling reflective practice based on student needs, and coaching

 instructional practices are aligned to a shared mission, vision, and

7 (6) Promote the use of assessments and data for school and 8 district improvement, which shall include being knowledgeable 9 about research on current classroom- and school-based design and 10 selection of appropriate formative and summative assessment methods, sharing that knowledge, and collaborating with colleagues 11 12 in using assessments and other data to make informed decisions 13 regarding student learning and in influencing school improvement 14 practices, district improvement practices, or both;

(8) Advocate for student learning and the teaching andeducation profession.

g. No later than five years following the effective date of
P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill), the
advisory board shall evaluate programmatic and other data collected
by the department pursuant to subsection d. of section 3 of P.L.
c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill), and make

recommendations to the State board regarding non-supervisory
roles and responsibilities for which a teacher leader endorsement
should be required.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

The Assembly Education Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 448.

This bill authorizes a teacher leader endorsement to a teacher's instructional certificate. In order to be eligible for the teacher leader endorsement, an applicant will be required to: complete a program of study equivalent to, at a minimum, 12 graduate credits or 180 clock hours; and complete five years of full-time teaching under a valid provisional or standard certificate, or a combination thereof, issued by the State Board of Examiners.

The bill establishes a Teacher Leader Endorsement Advisory Board in the Department of Education which will make recommendations to the Department of Education and State Board of Education regarding the program of study for the teacher leader endorsement. The advisory board will continue to meet after the recommendations are made in order to continue to advise the department regarding any necessary adjustments to the program of study for the teacher leader endorsement and to assess the outcomes associated with the various providers of the program of study for the endorsement. No later than five years after the bill's effective date, the advisory board will make recommendations to the State board regarding non-supervisory roles and responsibilities for which a teacher leader endorsement should be required.

Under the provisions of the bill, a State institution of higher education, an educational organization, or other non-profit entity, or a combination thereof, may apply to the Department of Education to offer a program of study leading to the issuance of the teacher leader endorsement. The State Board of Education is required to promulgate regulations that set standards for the approval of these providers, and the department will, in accordance with those standards, approve providers.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2014-2015 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.

STATEMENT TO

ASSEMBLY, No. 448

with Assembly Floor Amendments (Proposed by Assemblywoman JASEY)

ADOPTED: JUNE 11, 2015

These Assembly amendments:

- eliminate the requirements that an applicant for a teacher leader endorsement to the instructional certificate:
 - complete a program of study equivalent to 12 graduate credits, or 180 clock hours; the amendments do not specify any minimum;
 - complete five years of full-time teaching under a valid provisional or standard certificate;
- remove the provision that the officer or employer of the Department of Education who serves on the Teacher Leader Endorsement Advisory Board be a non-voting member;
- make the advisory board responsible for making recommendations to the Commissioner of Education and the State Board of Education regarding the requirements to be eligible to receive the teacher leader endorsement;
- allow an institution of higher education not located in the State to apply to offer a program of study for the teacher leader endorsement;
- eliminate the specific details that would be included in an application to offer a program of study for the teacher leader endorsement; and
- delete the requirement that the department collect data from the approved providers of the program of study, while stipulating that any data collected from providers must protect individuals' privacy. Any data collected would not be accessible to the public under the State's open public records act.

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Governor Christie Signs Education Reform Agenda Initiative Into Law To Expand Teacher Leadership and Mentoring Opportunities

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Measure Supports Professional Development and Peer Leadership Among New Jersey's Educators

Trenton, NJ - Acting on a commitment to provide teachers with opportunities for professional advancement, Governor Christie today signed into law a measure that will allow outstanding teachers the opportunity to earn a "teacher-leader" designation as part of their teaching certificate. The specialized endorsement is intended to extend career ladders for teachers seeking to advance as leaders while remaining in the classroom, and to further support these teachers as they build upon their capacity to design, lead, and support professional learning opportunities for local schools and districts.

The measure matches an initiative first called for by Governor Christie in 2011 as part of his far-reaching Education Reform Agenda to establish new career credentials, ladders, and professional development opportunities for New Jersey's best teachers. Under the new law, the "teacher-leader" designation will allow our state's most effective teachers to grow professionally, expand their roles in their schools, and mentor their peers, all while allowing them to stay in the classroom practicing their craft.

"This bill makes good on an important reform I have called for since 2011 by creating a pathway for growth, professional development, and peer leadership for our best, most inspiring and innovative teachers," said Governor Chris Christie. "The reality is that we know great teachers are already leaders in their schools and communities, but this law honors and recognizes those contributions and designates that leadership in a real way, without making them go outside the classroom to pursue those opportunities. This goal – to provide teachers with career ladders – is an essential component of this Administration's education reform agenda."

The bill signed today, S-165, affords educators the opportunity to earn a "teacher-leader" designation on their teaching certificate upon the successful completion of an approved program of study. An 11-member Teacher Leader Endorsement Advisory Board will make recommendations to the State Department of Education about the requirements for eligibility and the program of study for the endorsement. The advisory board will represent teachers, principals, superintendents, school boards, and teacher-preparation programs and is expected to provide its recommendations within six months after its formation.

According to the legislation, the "teacher-leader" endorsement will prepare educators to meet a number of expectations, such as fostering a collaborative culture to support educator development and student learning; supporting professional learning communities; using research and facilitating improvements to advance student learning; and improving collaboration with families and the community.

Commissioner of Education David C. Hespe pointed to the importance of extended roles for New Jersey's top teachers. "As we continue to identify outstanding educators across the state," he explained, "this legislation will provide another avenue for those individuals to grow and to share their expertise with their colleagues. The key to improving student achievement lies in improving classroom instruction, and this legislation helps get to the heart of the matter."

Commissioner Hespe added, "We are excited about the potential for this endorsement to serve as another way to attract and retain outstanding teachers in New Jersey, and to promote authentic professional learning that drives

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student success."

Legislative sponsors include Senators Jim Whelan (Atlantic) and Teresa Ruiz (Essex) as well as Assemblypersons Mila M. Jasey (Essex/Morris), Patrick J. Diegnan, Jr., (Middlesex), David W. Wolfe (Ocean), Ralph R.Caputo (Essex) and Angelica M. Jimenez (Bergen/Hudson).

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
