The Senate Military and Veterans' Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 1812.

This bill establishes in the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority the Military Dependents Scholarship Fund. The fund will be used to provide scholarships to the spouse, child, or other eligible dependent of a New Jersey resident who is killed, missing in action or totally and permanently disabled as a consequence of Operation Noble Eagle, Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Iraqi Freedom, or Operation New Dawn. The scholarships will be provided to pay for the costs of undergraduate study at a public or independent institution of higher education.

As amended, the bill establishes a board of trustees of the fund which is authorized to award scholarships from the Military Dependents Scholarship Fund. The board will consist of the State Adjutant General, the State Treasurer, the executive director of the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority, the Secretary of Higher Education, or their designees, and nine public members appointed as follows: two by the President of the Senate, two by the Speaker of the General Assembly and five by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate. At least five of the public members are required to be persons who were directly affected by Operation Noble Eagle, Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Iraqi Freedom, or Operation New Dawn. The board will have the following duties: determine eligibility for a scholarship from the fund; determine the amount of each scholarship award; report annually to the Governor and the Legislature on the performance of its duties; solicit and raise private funds to finance the Military Dependents Scholarship Program; and receive and disburse such contributions to the fund as may be forthcoming from private and public sources.

In order to receive a scholarship the applicant will have to demonstrate that the applicant will be or is enrolled in a full-time undergraduate program of study leading to a degree at an institution of higher education and has complied with all rules and regulations for the award, regulation and administration of scholarships from the fund. Eligibility for the scholarship program, in the case of a spouse, will be limited to a period of 15 years from the date of death of the person, the date the person is officially listed as "Missing in Action" or the date upon which the person is certified to have been totally and permanently disabled for initial receipt of the benefits. In the case of a dependent child, eligibility will be limited to a period of eight years following graduation from high school.

As amended, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2849 (1R).

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amended the bill to update an agency name change and to add one member to the board of trustees to create an odd number of board members.

These amendments make this bill identical to Assembly Bill No. 2849 (1R).
