The Assembly Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee reports favorably an Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 3502.

This committee substitute provides that a dog placed in a foster home for training as a guide or service dog does not have to be licensed or registered, as is the case with all other dogs.

Specifically, the substitute amends section 2 of P.L.1941, c.151 (C.4:19-15.2) to exempt a person or group temporarily caring for a dog placed in a foster home as part of a formalized training to be a guide dog or service dog from applying for and procuring a license and registration tag for the dog while the dog remains in the foster home. Current law requires an owner or keeper of a dog which is seven months of age or older to apply for and procure a dog license and a registration tag for the dog.

The substitute also amends section 3 of P.L.1941, c.151 (C.4:19-15.3) to specify that a dog temporarily placed in a foster home as part of a formalized training to be a guide dog or service dog is not required to be licensed and registered while in the foster home. Current law requires all dogs, including guide dogs and service dogs, to be licensed and registered.

As defined under the substitute:

- 1) "guide dog" means a dog used to assist deaf persons or which is fitted with a special harness so as to be suitable as an aid to the mobility of a blind person, and is used by a blind person who has satisfactorily completed a specific course of training in the use of such a dog, and has been trained by an organization generally recognized by agencies involved in the rehabilitation of the blind or deaf as reputable and competent to provide dogs with training of this type; and
- 2) "service dog" means any dog individually trained to the requirements of a person with a disability including, but not limited to minimal protection work, rescue work, pulling a wheelchair or retrieving dropped items, and including seizure dogs trained to alert or otherwise assist persons subject to epilepsy or other seizure disorders.

The Senate Economic Growth Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 2281.

As amended and reported, this bill exempts a person or group temporarily caring for a dog placed in a foster home as part of a formalized training to be a "guide dog" or "service dog," as those terms are defined in current law, from applying for and procuring a license and registration tag for the dog while the dog remains in the foster home.

Under current law, a "guide dog" is defined as a dog used to assist deaf persons or which is fitted with a special harness so as to be suitable as an aid to the mobility of a blind person, and is used by a blind person who has satisfactorily completed a specific course of training in the use of such a dog, and has been trained by an organization generally recognized by agencies involved in the rehabilitation of the blind or deaf as reputable and competent to provide dogs with training of this type. Further, "service dog" is defined as a dog individually trained to the requirements of a person with a disability including, but not limited to, minimal protection work, rescue work, and pulling a wheelchair or retrieving dropped items, and a seizure dog trained to alert or otherwise assist persons subject to epilepsy or other seizure disorders.

The committee amended the bill to remove references to "seeing eye dog" and "hearing dog" and replace the references with "guide dog" and "service dog."

As amended and reported, Senate Bill No. 2281 is identical to Assembly Bill No. 3502 (ACS), which was also reported by the committee on this date.
