This bill amends the State's basic civil rights law to ensure that persons who are mentally and developmentally handicapped receive the same protections as are afforded to other citizens. The definition of "handicapped" is extended in this bill to include persons suffering from any mental, psychological or developmental disability resulting from anatomical, psychological or neurological conditions which prevents the normal exercise of any bodily or mental functions or is demonstrable, medically or psychologically, by accepted clinical or laboratory techniques. It also includes persons who have been handicapped.

Covernor Brendan Eyrnf 18 3 to 1179 bills sponsored by Assemblyman Peter Shapiro today in a ceremony at the College of State Street, and Dentistry of New Jersey in Newark.

The first bill, A-1682, Treffrobriates \$2,158,000 from the \$25 million State Medical Education Facilities fund established by the New Jersey Medical Facilities Bond Act of 1977, for the construction of a 33-bed in-patient psychiatric unit at CMDNJ's Community Mental Health Center in Newark.

Byrne said the construction of the new unit is "an outstanding example of the benefits of refinancing.

"A similar issue will be presented to the voters as Public Question #3 on Tuesday's ballot, which would authorize the State to refinance the bonds of the Meadowlands Sports Complex."

"The College Hospital was refinanced last year with State General Obligation bonds which sold at a considerably lower rate of interest than the revenue bonds which they replaced," he said.

"As a result of the \$25 million in savings we realized from that transaction, this new facility is now being built at no cost to the State."

"If the voters approve Question #3 on Tuesday, we will be able to save more than \$100 million over the next thirty years in interest payments on the Meadowlands Sports Complex bonds," Byrne said.

The new psychiatric unit will replace the outdated facilities at Martland Medical Center in Newark.
