An Acr providing for the creation of solar easements and determining the requirements thereof.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Solar Ease-
- 2 ments Act."
- 1 2. Any easement obtained for the purpose of exposure of a solar
- 2 energy device shall be created in writing and shall be subject to
- 3 the same conveyancing and instrument recording requirements as
- 4 other easements.
- 1 3. Any instrument creating a solar easement shall include, but
- 2 the contents shall not be limited to:
- 3 a. The vertical and horizontal angles, expressed in degrees, at
- 4 which the solar easement extend over the real property subject to
- 5 the solar easement.
- 6 b. Any terms or conditions or both under which the solar ease-
- 7 ment is granted or will be terminated.
- 8 c. Any provisions for compensation of the owner of the property
- 9 benefiting from the solar easement in the event of interference with
- 10 the enjoyment of the solar easement or compensation of the owner
- 11 of the property subject to the solar easement for maintaining the
- 12 solar easement.
- 4. This act shall take effect 30 days following its enactment.

STATEMENT

This bill creates solar easements for the purpose of guaranteeing the exposure of a solar energy device to incident sunlight during the entire year and gives solar easement agreements legal standing.

The bill requires that the solar easment be subject to the same conveyance and recording requirements as other easements. The

legal instrument granting the easement must specifically include: the vertical and horizontal angles which define the extent of the solar easement; any terms or conditions under which the easement is granted or can be terminated; and any provisions for compensating the property owner benefiting from the solar easement in the event of solar interference, or for compensating the owner of the property subject to the use limitations necessary to maintain the easement.

This bill grants formal legal standing to solar easements and sets out minimum contents of such easement-creating instruments. One of the disincentives to solar use, especially in urban areas, is the fear on the part of the prospective solar consumer, that his structure's access to sunlight may subsequently be impaired and render his solar collector less efficient. This measure is a first step in addressing this problem.
