INTRODUCED JANUARY 27, 1969

An Act to amend the "New Jersey Higher Education Tuition Aid Act," approved, 1969 (P. L. 1968, chapter).

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 3 of New Jersey:
- 1. Section 4 of the act of which this act is amendatory is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 4. State tuition aid grants shall be awarded by the State Schol-
- 4 arship Commission to all eligible applicants without any limitation
- 5 on the number to be awarded in any year other than the amount of
- 6 appropriations available therefor. In the event that the amount
- 7 appropriated is insufficient for awards to all eligible applicants in
- 8 selecting among the eligible applicants, the State Scholarship Com-
- 9 mission shall consider need and demonstrated scholastic ability.
- 2. Section 7 of the act of which this act is amendatory is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 7. A college tuition aid grant shall be awarded annually to each
- 4 eligible, qualified full-time student enrolled in a curriculum leading
- 5 to a degree in an institution of collegiate grade in New Jersey
- 6 approved or accredited by the State Board of Higher Education in
- 7 accordance with the following:
- 8 (a) Eligibility. To each full-time resident student registered as
- 9 a freshman after September 1, 1968, as a freshman or sophomore
- 10 after September 1, 1969, as a freshman, sophmore or junior after
- 11 September 1, 1970, and as a freshman, sophomore, junior or senior
- 12 student after September 1971, the State shall grant an amount as
- 13 provided in paragraph (b) of this section 7. No student shall be
- 14 eligible for a grant unless he has certified in a form satisfactory
- 15 to the scholarship commission that the grant is essential to his
- 16 carrying out his plans for attending college. No student shall be
- 17 eligible for grants in more than the equivalent of 8 semesters of

- 18 undergraduate education. No student shall be eligible for grants
- 19 unless he maintains such minimum standards of academic perform-
- 20 ance as are required by the institution in which he is enrolled. No
- 21 student shall be eligible for a tuition aid grant who is enrolled
- 22 in a course of study leading to a degree in theology, divinity or
- 23 religious education.
- 24 In the event a student for any reason ceases to continue to be
- 25 enrolled or otherwise becomes ineligible during the course of an
- 26 academic year, he shall cease to be eligible for tuition aid.
- 27 (b) Amount of grant. The amount of tuition aid grant to any
- 28 student under this act for any semester shall not exceed the amount
- 29 of tuition normally charged a student at the institution of attend-
- 30 ance less \$225.00. The maximum tuition aid grant to any one stu-
- 31 dent in 1 academic year shall not exceed \$1,000.00.
- 32 No recipient of a State competitive scholarship shall receive
- 33 any tuition aid grant for any academic period for which he has
- 34 been awarded a State competitive scholarship.
- 35 The amount of grant to be paid for each semester or equivalent
- 36 shall be based on the figure represented by the effective income of
- 37 the eligible student together with the effective income of the parent
- 38 or parents providing a majority of the eligible student's support.
- 39 "Effective income" of the eligible student and his parents shall
- 40 be defined as total income subject to Federal income tax less per-
- 41 sonal dependent exemptions and standard or itemized deductions
- 42 as eligible under Federal income tax regulations pursuant to the
- 43 United States Internal Revenue Code as amended with a further
- 44 allowance of \$400.00 for each dependent.
- 44A The following schedule shall be used for determining grants:
- 45 Effective Income Amount of Grant Each Semester
- 46 -0- -\$5,000.00 \$500.00
- **47** \$5,001.00 \$6,000.00 \$400.00
- 48 \$6,001.00 \$7,000.00 \$300.00
- 49 \$7,001.00 \$8,000.00 \$200.00
- 50 \$8,001.00 \$9,000.00 \$100.00
- 1 3. This act shall take effect immediately provided that Senate
- 2 Bill No. 423 of the 1968 legislative session also becomes law.
