1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 14 of P. L. 1953, chapter 211 (C. 19:57-14) is amended 2 to read as follows:

3 14. Each absentee ballot to be used at any election to be held while this act is in effect shall be printed entirely in black ink and 4 shall conform generally to the ballot to be used at said election in 5 6 the absentee voter's election district and shall be so prepared that the absentee voter may indicate thereon his choice of such of the 7 candidates for the offices to be filled, and as to such public questions 8 to be voted upon, at said election by the voters of the entire State 9 10 or of the county in which such absentee voter's election district is situated, as shall be ascertained and known on the thirty-fourth day 11 preceding such election and sufficient space shall be provided thereon 1213 for such absentee voter to write in the name of and vote for any candidate for, or his personal choice for, any public office to be voted 14 for at such election in such election district. A list of the candidates 15 for the offices to be filled in each election district in the county, 16 whose names are known and ascertained on said thirty-fourth day 17 18 but do not appear upon said ballot, with a statement of the office for which each is a candidate, shall be forwarded with such ballot. 19 In the preparation of absentee ballots the name of any candidate 20 who has been nominated for any office shall be placed upon the 21

in the general election to be held in said year in each election district
in which he is a candidate, whether or not such candidate has ac-

25 cepted such nomination prior to said date; provided, that he has26 not prior to said date declined the same.

1 2. Section 19:49-4 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read 2 as follows:

19:49-4. a. The officer or officers whose duty it may be under 3 this subtitle to provide and furnish official ballots for any polling 4 $\tilde{\mathbf{0}}$ place where a voting machine is to be used shall also provide 2 6 sample ballots or more, or instruction ballots, which sample or in-7 struction ballot shall be arranged in the form of a diagram showing 8 such portion of the face of the voting machine as it will appear after the official ballots are arranged thereon or therein for voting on 9 10election day. Such sample or instruction ballots shall be open to the inspection of all voters on election day, in all elections where voting 11 machines are used. 12

13b. There shall be furnished a sufficient number of sample ballots printed entirely in black ink, a facsimile of the face of the machine, 14 of a reduced size, one of which sample ballots shall be mailed to each 15registered voter. Any reference to sample ballot envelopes in any 16 section of this Title to the contrary notwithstanding, in all counties 17 where voting machines are used and wherein the commissioner of 18registration has the facilities to mail out sample ballots direct to 19 the registrants of such county and has elected so to do, as otherwise 20in this Title provided, the commissioner of registration in any 21such county may request the county clerk of such county to have the 2222A sample ballots prepared in the manner following:

23(1) The county clerk shall have said sample ballots for all general and special elections printed in such manner that, when folded, 24the words "Official General Election Sample Ballot" or as the case 25may be, shall appear on the reverse side thereof, together with the 26words "In cases where the sample ballot is to be sent to an ad-27dressee who does not receive his mail by delivery to his home or 2829 through rural free delivery 'if not delivered within 5 days return to the commissioner of registration' and in all other cases 'if not 30delivered within 2 days return to the commissioner of registration.' 3132Do not Forward. Return Postage Guaranteed" over the return 33 address of the commissioner of registration. Such portion of the ballot may contain such additional words that conform with United 34State Postal regulations that will prevent such envelope from being 3536 forwarded to the voter at any other address than that appearing on the envelope, and that will cause such envelope to be returned to the 37 commissioner of registration, with information thereon from the 38post office showing the reason for nondelivery. 39

40 (2) The county clerk in drawing the specifications for the print-

41 ing of the official primary ballots shall include the requirement that 42the municipal clerks shall have primary sample ballots printed in such manner that, when folded, the words "Official Primary Elec-43 44 tion Sample Ballot" shall appear on the reverse side thereof, together with the words "In cases where the sample ballot is to be 4546sent to an addressee who does not receive his mail by delivery to 47 his home or through rural free delivery 'if not delivered within 5 48 days return to the commissioner of registration' and in all other $48_{\rm A}$ cases 'if not delivered within 2 days return to the commissioner of **4**9 registration.' Do Not Forward. Return Postage Guaranteed'' over the return address of the commissioner of registration. Such por-5051tion of the ballot may contain such additional words that conform 52with United State Postal regulations that will prevent such enve-53lope from being forwarded to the voter at any other address than that appearing on the envelope, and that will cause such envelope to 54be returned to the commissioner of registration, with information 55thereon from the post office showing the reason for nondelivery. 5657(3) Five sample ballots shall be posted as now required by law. 58c. For all general and special elections the county clerk, and for all primary and municipal elections the municipal clerks, shall, at 59least 30 days preceding any such election, make the arrangements 60 61 necessary to be made with the postmaster or postmasters in their 62respective counties and municipalities to have the said sample ballots mailed under the postal laws and regulations, and forthwith 63 notify the said commissioner of registration in writing to that effect. 64 1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to permit the printing of absentee and sample ballots entirely in black ink. Presently such ballots are printed in black ink for the names of candidates and red ink for public questions. This requirement will remain for names of candidates and public questions printed on the face of a voting machine, however, it is apparent that a voter can take much more time to study an absentee ballot or a sample ballot then he can take to study the face of a voting machine and the need for red ink to attract the voters attention is not present outside the voting booth. By allowing the ballot to be printed in entirely black ink, the several counties will realize an estimated printing cost saving in excess of \$200,000.00.
