## SENATE, No. 548

### STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 17, 1969

### By Senators McDERMOTT, LACORTE, RINALDO, FARLEY and SCHIAFFO

Referred to Committee on County and Municipal Government

- AN ACT concerning the Police and Firemen's Retirement System of New Jersey, and amending section 16 of chapter 241 of the laws of 1964.
- 1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. Section 16 of P. L. 1964, chapter 241 (C. 43:16A-11.1) is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 16. Should a member resign after having established 25 years of creditable service [before reaching age 55] and having attained the age of 51 years but not the age of 55 years, he may elect to receive, in lieu of the payment provided in section 11, a retirement allowance which shall consist of:
- 8 (1) An annuity which shall be the actuarial equivalent of his9 aggregate contributions, and
- (2) A pension in the amount, which when added to the member's 10 annuity will provide a total retirement allowance of 2% of his 11 12average final compensation multiplied by the number of years of his creditable service up to 25 plus 1% of his average final com-13 pensation multiplied by the number of years of creditable service 14 over 25[; provided, however, that such retirement allowance shall 15 be reduced in accordance with a table of actuarial equivalents 16 recommended by the actuary and adopted by the board of trustees 17reflecting all months that the member lacks of being age 55]. 18
- 19 Upon the receipt of proper proofs of the death of such a retired 20 member, there shall be paid to his beneficiary an amount equal to 21 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of the compensation upon which contributions by the member 22 to the annuity savings fund were based in the last year of creditable 23 service.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

EXPLANATION-Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

### FISCAL NOTE TO SENATE, No. 548

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### **DATED: MARCH 24, 1969**

Senate Bill No. 548 would permit a policeman or fireman with 25 years of creditable service, having attained the age of 51 years but not 55, to receive a retirement allowance.

Enactment of this legislation would not require the expenditure of any State funds, as local employers pay the costs of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System.

The Division of Pensions estimates that enactment of Senate Bill No. 548 would require an expenditure by local employers of \$2,491,583.00 in fiscal 1969-70 and \$2,755,691.00 in fiscal 1970-71.

In compliance with written request received, there is hereby submitted a fiscal estimate for the above bill, pursuant to P. L. 1962, c. 27.
