INTRODUCED MARCH 24, 1969

AN ACT concerning education, and amending section 18A:46-13
of the New Jersey Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 18A:46-13 of the New Jersey Statutes is amended
2 to read as follows:

3 18A:46-13. It shall be the duty of each board of education to
4 provide suitable facilities and programs of education for all the
5 children who are classified as handicapped under this chapter except
6 those so mentally retarded as to be neither educable or trainable.
7 The absence or unavailability of a special class facility in any dis-
8 trict shall not be construed as relieving a board of education of the
9 responsibility for providing education for any child who qualifies
10 under this chapter.

11 *A board of education is not required to provide any further*
12 *educational program for children who have been admitted to the*
13 *Marie H. Katzenbach School for the Deaf but shall be required to*
14 *furnish necessary *daily* transportation *Monday through*
15 *Friday* to and from the school *for nonboarding pupils* when*
16 *such transportation is approved by the county superintendent of*
17 *schools in accordance with such rules and regulations as the State*
18 *board shall promulgate for such transportation.*

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

FISCAL NOTE TO
SENATE, No. 631

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: APRIL 14, 1969

Senate Bill No. 631 pertains to the providing of certain transportation for children who have been admitted to the Marie H. Katzenbach School for the Deaf.

The Division of Budget and Accounting estimates that enactment of this legislation would require the expenditure in fiscal 1969-70 of \$47,812.00 in State funds and \$15,938.00 in local funds. In fiscal 1970-71, it is estimated by Budget and Accounting that \$53,437.00 in State funds would be required and \$17,813.00 in local funds.

These figures are based on the assumption that Senate Bill No. 631 is amended to change "necessary transportation" to "furnish necessary daily transportation Monday through Friday to and from schools for nonboarding pupils."

In making its computation, the Division of Budget and Accounting has used the offset of \$150.00 per student which is currently provided in the Private School Busing Law.

It is further estimated State expenditures would increase by about 10% annually in the years thereafter.

In compliance with written request received, there is hereby submitted a fiscal estimate for the above bill, pursuant to P. L. 1962, c. 27.

S-576 Woodcock, Knowlton, Schiaffo—March 10—Provides that notwithstanding any provisions of any general, special or local law, whenever it is required that certain information be published by printing and publishing in a newspaper, there shall be no requirement that the newspaper be printed in a particular county or municipality, provided it is printed in the State.

March 10—County and Municipal Government Committee.

The Legislative Committee is in support of this bill. Municipal governments already have this privilege.

S-588 Crabiel—March 17—Designated the "Public Entity Contractual Liability Act," imposes contractual liability upon the State and all political subdivisions thereof.

March 17—State Government Committee.

No position.

S-589 Crabiel—March 17—Permits a board of education to request, with the approval of the Commissioner of Education, a 3% increase in its appropriation if an emergency arises during the school year.

March 17—Education Committee.

Support is recommended by the Federation's Legislative Committee. This bill provides flexibility needed in an emergency situation.

S-596 Sciro—March 17—Provides additional state aid to local school districts for pupils residing on land owned by the State and non-resident pupils kept in the home of a district resident.

March 17—Education Committee.

The Legislative Committee approves the intent of this bill but prefers to support A-284, entered at the request of the Federation. (See LEGISLATIVE BULLETIN, Volume 17, Number 2, page 14.)

S-631 Bateman—March 24—Provides that a board of education is not required to provide any further educational program, except transportation, for children who have been admitted to the Marie H. Katzenbach School for the Deaf.

March 24—Education Committee.
April 10—Reported, 2nd reading.

Support of this bill is recommended by the Legislative Committee.

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
