INTRODUCED APRIL 21, 1969

AN ACT concerning the purchasing of materials, supplies or equipment by counties, municipalities and school districts, making an appropriation therefor and supplementing Title 52 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

Any county or municipality may, without advertising for bids,
or having rejected all bids obtained pursuant to advertising there for, purchase any materials, supplies or equipment pursuant to a
contract or contracts for such materials, supplies or equipment
entered into on behalf of the State by the Division of Purchase and
Property.

2. Any school district may, without advertising for bids, or 1 $\mathbf{2}$ having rejected all bids obtained pursuant to advertising therefor, purchase any materials, supplies or equipment pursuant to a con-3 4 tract or contracts for such materials, supplies or equipment entered into on behalf of the State by the Division of Purchase and Property. $\mathbf{5}$ 1 3. The Director of the Division of Purchase and Property may $\mathbf{2}$ include, in any such contract or contracts on behalf of the State, a 3 provision for the purchase of such materials, supplies or equip-4 ment by any county, municipality or school district from such contractor or contractors. The county, municipality or school district 5 shall have sole responsibility for any payment due the vendor for 6 7 any such purchase. All purchases shall be subject to audit and in-8 spection by the county, municipality or school district for which 9 made.

4. The director may, on the written request of any political sub division of this State, singly or jointly develop specifications or
establish approved brand name lists of commonly used commodities
or services, even though such commodities or services may not be

purchased or used by the State. In these cases, the resulting speci- $\mathbf{5}$ fications or approved brand name lists shall be submitted to the 6 political subdivision initiating the request for approval. After 7 8 approval by the parties concerned, the director may, at the request of the applicant political subdivision, solicit bids pursuant to chap-9 ter 48, P. L. 1964. After determining the lowest responsible bidder 10 meeting all of the specifications and conditions, the director shall 11 notify the applicant political subdivision of the results. 12

5. The Director of the Division of Purchase and Property shall distribute annually to each county, municipality and school district a list of all current contracts entered into on behalf of the State, setting forth the materials, supplies or equipment included therein and the prices, terms and conditions thereof.

6. The Director of the Division of Purchase and Property may make such rules and regulations as he may deem necessary to implement and facilitate the making of purchases by counties, municipalities and school districts through contracts entered into by the director.

7. There is hereby appropriated for the purpose of this act the
sum of \$35,000.00 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1970.

1 8. This act shall take effect July 1, 1969.
