P.L. 2018, CHAPTER 6, *approved April 17, 2018*Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly, No. 2014

1 AN ACT concerning voter registration and amending and 2 supplementing P.L.1994, c.182 and supplementing Title 19 of 3 the Revised Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. (New section) The Legislature finds and declares that:
- a. The right to vote is a fundamental right in New Jersey and for all citizens of the United States.
 - b. It is the responsibility of the State of New Jersey to:
- (1) ensure that every eligible State resident has the opportunity to register to vote;
- (2) promote policies that will grow voter registration rates and voter turnout;
- (3) guarantee that State voter registration systems are secure and maintained with accuracy and efficiency and with the best available technologies and procedures; and
- (4) safeguard New Jersey's voters from disenfranchisement on Election Day due to outdated or inaccurate voter roll information.
- c. In other states, automatic voter registration at state agencies has made state voter rolls more accurate while increasing voter registration rates and may have contributed to increased voter turnout, especially among populations that are less likely to participate in elections.
- d. It is, therefore, the purpose of this act, P.L. , c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill), to:
- (1) enable the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission and the Secretary of State to provide the opportunity to register all eligible State residents to vote with accurate, cost-efficient, and up-to-date procedures;
- 32 (2) modernize New Jersey's voter registration and voter list 33 maintenance procedures; and
- 34 (3) protect and enhance the integrity, accuracy, efficiency, and accessibility of the electoral process for all eligible State residents.

A change of address notification received by the Chief Administrator in paper format shall be reported to the Secretary of State no later than the 10th day following its receipt by the Division of Motor Vehicles and shall serve as notification for the change of address process, Chief Administrator. The Commissioner of Registration shall use the change of address notification to update an existing voter registration unless the [registrant] applicant declines the automatic voter registration pursuant to this section and indicates that the change of address is not for voter registration purposes. A change of address notification submitted to the commission, which is used for voter registration purposes, shall be subject to the provisions of section 1 of P.L.1994, c.148 (C.19:31-3.2) if the person submitting the change of address notification previously registered to vote in accordance with that section.

- e. If a person who is not entitled to vote becomes registered to vote pursuant to this section, that person's registration shall be presumed to have been effected with official authorization, and the person shall not be deemed to have committed a crime under R.S.19:34-1. This subsection shall not apply to a person who knowingly and willfully makes a false statement to effectuate voter registration.
- f. The Secretary of State, with the assistance of the Chief Administrator, shall take appropriate measures to educate the public about voter registration under this section.

For the purposes of this section, "eligible applicant" means a person submitting to the commission an application for a motor vehicle driver's license, an examination permit, a probationary driver's license, or a non-driver identification card who meets all requirements for eligibility to vote under R.S.19:4-1.

4. (New section) a. Any State agency, except for the Motor Vehicle Commission, that the Secretary of State verifies already collects documents that would provide proof of eligibility, including age, citizenship, and residence address, may establish and implement, upon approval by the Secretary of State, a procedure for

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automatically and electronically transmitting voter registration information to the Secretary of State of persons who are eligible to vote for the purpose of registering such persons to vote or updating their voter registration. Each person from whom such information is collected shall be offered an opportunity to decline automatic voter registration. Any such agency shall comply with the requirements, to the extent applicable as determined by the Secretary of State, as established in subsections b. through d. of section 24 of P.L.1994, c.182 (C.39:2-3.2).

b. Any additional agencies that are designated for automatic voter registration shall comply with the requirements, to the extent applicable as determined by the Secretary of State, as established in section 24 of P.L.1994, c.182 (C.39:2-3.2) for automatic voter registration and shall provide the notices required pursuant to subsection c. thereof to each person from whom such information is collected.

5. This act shall take effect on the first day of the seventh month next following the date of enactment, but the Chief Administrator may take such anticipatory administrative action in advance thereof as shall be necessary for the implementation of this act.

- I live at the address provided on the application.

ATTEMPTING TO VOTE KNOWING THAT I AM NOT

A separate statement shall be printed on the application for a special learner's permit, an examination permit, a probationary driver's license, a basic driver's license, or a nondriver identification card, in bold-faced capital letters, notifying the applicant that victims of domestic violence or stalking may decline the automatic voter registration and register to vote without disclosing the applicant's street address pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1994, c.148 (C.19:31-3.2).

If a person who is not entitled to vote becomes registered to vote pursuant to this section and votes or attempts to vote in an election held after the effective date of the person's registration under this section, then the person shall be presumed to have acted with official authorization and shall not be guilty of fraudulently voting or attempting to fraudulently vote pursuant to R.S.19:34-11 or R.S.19:34-12, respectively, unless the person willfully votes or attempts to vote knowing he is not entitled to vote.
- 4. This act shall take effect on the first day of the seventh month next following the date of enactment, but the Chief Administrator may take such anticipatory administrative action in advance thereof as shall be necessary for the implementation of this act.

STATEMENT

This bill requires the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) to automatically register to vote or automatically update a person's voter registration as part of the process of applying for or renewing a driver's license.

Under current law, each applicant for a driver's license or renewal of an existing license is offered an opportunity to simultaneously register to vote. The bill provides that the MVC would automatically register to vote any person who applies for a special learner's permit, examination permit, probationary driver's license, basic driver's license, or nondriver identification card, or for renewal of any license or identification card, according to the permanent address provided by the applicant, unless the applicant specifically declines the automatic voter registration.

The chief administrator of the MVC would forward the personal information required to register to vote to the Division of Elections in the Department of State in an electronic format. Submission of an application would serve as consent to be registered to vote at the

permanent address provided by the applicant, unless the applicant specifically declines the automatic registration.

3 The bill requires the chief administrator to provide for a 4 statement to be printed on the application for a special learner's 5 permit, an examination permit, a provisional driver's license, a basic driver's license, or a nondriver identification card informing 6 7 the applicant that by submitting the application, the applicant is 8 consenting to register to vote and is legally permitted to vote. A 9 separate statement must be printed on the application, in bold-faced capital letters, notifying the applicant that victims of domestic 10 11 violence or stalking may decline the automatic voter registration 12 and register to vote without disclosing the applicant's street 13 address.

The bill provides that a person who is not entitled to vote that becomes registered through the automatic registration provided for in the bill will not be guilty of fraudulently voting or attempting to fraudulently vote so long as the person does not willfully vote or attempt to vote knowing he is not entitled to vote.

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The bill requires the Chief Administrator of the Motor Vehicle Commission to provide for the following statement:

"By submitting this application, I am consenting to registering to vote in the State of New Jersey and I am swearing or affirming that: I understand that I must be a U.S. citizen to vote in the State of New Jersey.

I understand that I must be at least 18 years old on or before the day of the next election to vote in that election.

I understand that I must have resided in the State and county at least 30 days before the next election to vote in that election.

I live at the address provided on the application.

I am not on parole, probation, or serving a sentence due to a conviction for an indictable offense under any federal or State laws.

I UNDERSTAND THAT WILLFULLY VOTING OR ATTEMPTING TO VOTE KNOWING THAT I AM NOT ENTITLED TO VOTE MAY SUBJECT ME TO A FINE OF UP TO \$15,000, IMPRISONMENT UP TO FIVE YEARS, OR BOTH,

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably the Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill, No. 2014.

Under current law, each applicant for a driver's license or renewal of an existing license is offered an opportunity to simultaneously register to vote. This substitute requires the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) to automatically register to vote a person who is eligible to vote, or to automatically update a person's voter registration, as part of the process of applying for a driver's license, an examination permit, a probationary driver's license, or a non-driver identification card, unless the applicant specifically declines the automatic voter registration.

The Chief Administrator of the MVC will collect and promptly transmit the personal information required to register to vote to the Secretary of State in an electronic format. For applications received online for renewal of a driver's license or non-driver identification card, voter registration information will not be collected or transmitted electronically until online voter registration is implemented. For applications received through the mail for renewal of a driver's license or non-driver identification card, voter registration information will not be collected and transmitted until the Chief Administrator determines that the prompt electronic transmission of the information is practicable. The Chief Administrator is to inform the Governor and the Legislature every six months as to the practicability such collection and transmission. Notice provisions will not apply to either application until voter registration is effectuated therefrom. The amendments clarify that this exemption may not be construed to preclude the Motor Vehicle Commission from processing voter registration applications received in the manner in which those applications were processed in connection with renewals prior to the effective date the bill.

The following notices will be provided with every application for a driver's license or non-driver identification card and every related update, renewal, or change of address:

(1) a notice that the applicant will be registered to vote, if eligible, unless the applicant specifically declines the automatic voter registration;

- (2) a notice of the voter eligibility requirements and the penalties for false registration and illegal voting under State law, which must include an affirmation that the applicant meets those requirements and require the applicant's signature, under penalty of law; and
- (3) a notice that an applicant who is a victim of domestic violence or stalking may decline the automatic voter registration and register to vote without disclosing the applicant's street address.

Change of address notifications submitted to the Chief Administrator will be promptly reported to the Secretary of State. A change of address notification in paper format is to be reported to the Secretary of State within 10 days, and the Secretary of State will use the notification to update an existing voter registration, unless the applicant declines.

The bill provides that if a person who is not entitled to vote becomes registered to vote pursuant to the bill, that person's registration will be presumed to have been effected with official authorization, and the person will not be deemed to have committed a crime under N.J.S.A.19:34-1 for false registration. However, this presumption does not apply to a person who knowingly and willfully makes a false statement to effectuate voter registration.

The Office of Legislative Services finds that the bill will result in an indeterminate increase in State and county costs. These costs will result primarily from the likely increase in the number of registered voters that result from shifting the voter registration process through driver's license applications and renewals from "opt-in" to "opt-out." This means that when applying for or renewing a driver's license, the information will be used to automatically register that person to vote, unless the applicant specifically requests not to be registered. This differs from the current law that requires that every applicant be offered the opportunity to register as part of the driver's license application and renewal process.

Registered voters typically receive a voter acknowledgement card in the mail as well as sample ballots leading up to elections. The cost of these mailings to newly registered voters will fall upon counties who send out the mailings. The magnitude of this cost increase is unclear, because it is not clear how many additional residents will be registered to vote as a result of this bill.

State costs will accrue to the commission for computer programming changes to the software used for driver's license applications and renewals, to facilitate the shift from an "opt-in" to an "opt-out" system. These changes are likely to not be extensive because the existing process already collects all necessary information to register a voter and a system has already been established to transfer this information to the State's voter registration records system. However, the cost of such changes are indeterminate and cannot be determined without additional information about the nature of the software changes required by the commission and the terms of the contract that the commission has with its software vendors to make those changes.

The State will also realize costs to the Department of State for the measures that they are required to take to educate the public about this automatic voter registration requirement. The bill is silent about the actual education measures, so it cannot be determined what the department will do and the resultant cost. Posting notification on State websites may potentially be accomplished at no cost by utilizing existing State staff. However, the publication of informational brochures or a media campaign could cost millions of dollars.

- This change will likely increase the number of people registered to vote in New Jersey by an
 indeterminate amount. Many of these additional registered voters will receive voter
 acknowledgement cards and a sample ballot before elections. These mailings will represent
 an additional cost for counties to print and mail.
- The commission may need to make computer programming changes for its driver's license application and renewal process to shift from an "opt-in" to an "opt-out" system. These changes are not likely to be extensive because the existing process already collects all necessary information to register a voter and a system has already been established to transfer this information to the State voter registration record system.



• The Department of State may incur costs in taking measures to educate the public about this automatic voter registration process. The cost is unclear because the bill does not proscribe the educational measures that the Department of State is required to take.

BILL DESCRIPTION

Under current law, each applicant for a driver's license or renewal of an existing license is offered an opportunity to simultaneously register to vote. This substitute requires the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) to automatically register to vote a person who is eligible to vote, or to automatically update a person's voter registration, as part of the process of applying for a driver's license, an examination permit, a probationary driver's license, or a non-driver identification card, unless the applicant specifically declines the automatic voter registration.

The Chief Administrator of the MVC will collect and promptly transmit the personal information required to register to vote to the Secretary of State in an electronic format. For applications received online for renewal of a driver's license or non-driver identification card, voter registration information will not be collected or transmitted electronically until online voter registration is implemented. For applications received through the mail for renewal of a driver's license or non-driver identification card, voter registration information will not be collected and transmitted until the Chief Administrator determines that the prompt electronic transmission of the information is practicable. The Chief Administrator is to inform the Governor and the Legislature every six months as to the practicability such collection and transmission. Notice provisions will not apply to either application until voter registration is effectuated therefrom. The amendments clarify that this exemption may not be construed to preclude the Motor Vehicle Commission from processing voter registration applications received in the manner in which those applications were processed in connection with renewals prior to the effective date the bill.

The following notices will be provided with every application for a driver's license or nondriver identification card and every related update, renewal, or change of address:

- (1) a notice that the applicant will be registered to vote, if eligible, unless the applicant specifically declines the automatic voter registration;
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- (3) a notice that an applicant who is a victim of domestic violence or stalking may decline the automatic voter registration and register to vote without disclosing the applicant's street address.

Change of address notifications submitted to the Chief Administrator will be promptly reported to the Secretary of State. A change of address notification in paper format is to be reported to the Secretary of State within 10 days, and the Secretary of State will use the notification to update an existing voter registration, unless the applicant declines.

The bill provides that if a person who is not entitled to vote becomes registered to vote pursuant to the bill, that person's registration will be presumed to have been effected with official authorization, and the person will not be deemed to have committed a crime under N.J.S.A.19:34-1 for false registration. However, this presumption does not apply to a person who knowingly and willfully makes a false statement to effectuate voter registration.

The Secretary of State, with the assistance of the Chief Administrator, is to take appropriate measures to educate the public about voter registration under the bill.

Any other State agency that already collects documents that would provide proof of eligibility, including age, citizenship, and residence address, may establish and implement, upon

approval by the Secretary of State, a procedure for automatic voter registration that, to the extent applicable as determined by the Secretary of State, will comply with the requirements in the bill. Any additional agencies that are designated for automatic registration must comply with the same requirements and must provide the same notices.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The Office of Legislative Services finds that the bill will result in an indeterminate increase in State and county costs. These costs will result primarily from the likely increase in the number of registered voters that result from shifting the voter registration process through driver's license applications and renewals from "opt-in" to "opt-out." This means that when applying for or renewing a driver's license, the information will be used to automatically register that person to vote, unless the applicant specifically requests not to be registered. This differs from the current law that requires that every applicant be offered the opportunity to register as part of the driver's license application and renewal process.

Registered voters typically receive a voter acknowledgement card in the mail as well as sample ballots leading up to elections. The cost of these mailings to newly registered voters will fall upon counties who send out the mailings. The magnitude of this cost increase is unclear, because it is not clear how many additional residents will be registered to vote as a result of this bill

State costs will accrue to the commission for computer programming changes to the software used for driver's license applications and renewals, to facilitate the shift from an "opt-in" to an "opt-out" system. These changes are likely to not be extensive because the existing process already collects all necessary information to register a voter and a system has already been established to transfer this information to the State's voter registration records system. However, the cost of such changes are indeterminate and cannot be determined without additional information about the nature of the software changes required by the commission and the terms of the contract that the commission has with its software vendors to make those changes.

The State will also realize costs to the Department of State for the measures that they are required to take to educate the public about this automatic voter registration requirement. The bill is silent about the actual education measures, so it cannot be determined what the department will do and the resultant cost. Posting notification on State websites may potentially be accomplished at no cost by utilizing existing State staff. However, the publication of informational brochures or a media campaign could cost millions of dollars.

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Governor Murphy Signs Landmark Legislation Expanding Voter Registration and Protecting Voting Rights

04/17/2018

Trenton - Governor Phil Murphy today signed into law one of the most expansive Automatic Voter Registration policies in the nation, strengthening and enhancing voting rights for eligible New Jersey residents.

"Today, New Jersey proudly joins a select group of states – 11 plus the District of Columbia – that have enacted automatic voter registration to expand and protect the voting rights of their citizens," **said Governor Murphy.** "This stands in stark contrast to those whose only interest lays in restricting voting rights and suppressing voters' voices. In New Jersey, we recognize our democracy is stronger when more people are given the opportunity to participate and when the residents of our state are empowered to be part of the democratic process."

The legislation, **A2014**, requires the Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) to automatically register to vote any eligible person who applies for a permit, license, or ID card unless the applicant declines the automatic voter registration. The MVC's chief administrator is required to ensure that all information necessary for voter registration is collected and promptly transmitted electronically to the Secretary of State, with an exception if a person declined to register to vote.

Additionally, the bill expands automatic voter registration to any other state agency that collects proof of voter eligibility, as verified by the Secretary of State. Upon the Secretary's approval, the agency may implement automatic voter registration for eligible individuals. The agency must comply to the extent applicable, as determined by the Secretary, with the procedures for automatic voter registration established in the bill for the MVC. New Jersey is now only the fourth state to take this additional step.

"Today, we are moving New Jersey forward in its effort to register all eligible citizens," **Secretary of State Tahesha Way added**. "By using existing technology to advance our voter registration efforts, the State is demonstrating its commitment to increasing civic participation within our current infrastructure, without sacrificing voter integrity or security. As the State's chief election official, I'm working across levels of government to ensure that all eligible voters can cast a safe and secure ballot at election time."

"Democracy works better when more people vote," **said Acting Motor Vehicle Commission Chair and Chief Administrator Sue Fulton**. "We are proud to serve the people of New Jersey every day, and we are proud to join the ranks of other states that offer automatic voter registration to their residents. We look forward to working with Governor Murphy to ensure that all eligible New Jerseyans have access to the polls."
