# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### INTRODUCED MARCH 31, 1969

- AN ACT to amend "An act to provide for the employment and vocational training of certain prisoners confined in county institutions in certain cases," approved December 27, 1968 (P. L. 1968, c. 372).
- 1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 1 (C. 30:8-44) of P. L. 1968, chapter 372 is amended 2 to read as follows:

3 1. In any county in which the board of chosen freeholders, by  $\mathbf{4}$ resolution, approves the application of this act and designates a 5 county work release administrator who may be the sheriff, warden or other person, a person convicted of any offense and sentenced 6 7 to the county jail, workhouse or penitentiary of the county may be placed at outside labor or permitted to attend a vocational train-8 ing course operated or sponsored by a public or private agency in 9 the county by order of the court by which the sentence was imposed, 10 or by the assignment judge of the county in which the sentence was 11 imposed, at the time such person is sentenced or at any time there-12after during the term of the sentence. In the case of female 13 offenders a work release order may include permission for release 1415 from confinement during specified hours to care for her family. Such order may be revoked by the court which granted it at any 16 17time.

18 The Department of Institutions and Agencies shall prepare and 19 enforce regulations for the operation of this act in accordance 20 with the provisions thereof.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Governor Richard J. Hughes today signed the following bills:

Assembly Bill No. 367 -- which requires every constable to file with the governing body which appointed him, a monthly report of his official activities other than those connected with court or judicial proceedings. This monthly report is to be forwarded by the governing body to the municipal chief of police. The office of any constable who fails to file such a report for two consecutive months is to be deemed vacant by the governing body.

This bill is designed to promote the accountability of constables and should further the coordination of their activities with the operation of local law enforcement agencies. The burden placed on the individual constable by this requirement is a negligible one and one which should assist the constable in organizing and exercising his functions.

Assembly Bill No. 696 -- which provides for the uniform administration of the alternate programs of benefits for certain members of the faculty and other eligible employees of the New Jersey College of Medicine and Dentistry, Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, the Newark College of Engineering, the Department of Higher Education, and the State and county colleges.

Assembly Bill No. 771 -- which amends the Act passed in 1968 permitting the employment and vocational training of certain prisoners confined in County institutions. The amendment gives the assignment judge of the county within which a work release program has been instituted by the Freeholders the authority to order an individual's participation in such a program. Present law gives only the judge imposing sentence on the individual the power to order the individual's involvment in a work release program.
