Comment on this bill:

This bill establishes January 1, 1968 as the cut-off date for applying for aid under the Emergency School Building Construction Act. This Act was passed in July of 1968 and many districts who had received voter approval on their bond issues prior to January 1, 1968 applied for aid under the Emergency School Building Construction Act. A cut-off date is necessary; therefore, the Legislative Committee recommends support.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 599

To the General Assembly:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14(b) of the Constitution, I herewith return Assembly Bill No. 599, with my objections, for reconsideration.

This bill is intended as an amendment to Section 4 of Chapter 177 of the Laws of 1968 which I approved on July 19, 1968. On July 3, 1969 I approved Chapter 136 of the Laws of 1969 (Assembly Bill No. 1051) which, among other things, amended Section 4 of Chapter 177 of the Laws of 1968. In order to avoid the possibility that the amendments contained in this bill may be interpreted so as to imply a repeal of the amendments contained in Chapter 136 of the Laws of 1969, I recommend the following technical changes be made:

1. Title: Delete the present language and insert in lieu thereof the following:

"An Act Amending 'An Act Concerning Education and Supplementing Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes,' approved July 19, 1968 (P.L. 1968, c. 177)."

2. Page 1, Section 1, Lines 1 through 19: Delete the present language and insert in lieu thereof the following:

"1. Section 4 of the act of which this act is amendatory (C. 18A:58-33.5) is amended to read as follows:

4. If the determinations, approvals or consents provided for by this act shall have been made or given, such school districts shall be entitled to receive annually the amount of the additional state school building aid stipulated in the resolutions of the State Board of Education and the State Board of Education shall include such amounts in its annual budget for building aid for the school district. Amounts of such building aid paid under this section shall only be used for the payment of debt service (interest and principal) on bonds entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this act, in accordance with said resolutions; provided,

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that the proposal was not approved prior to January 1, 1968 by either the voters or Board of School Estimate, as the case may be, and that no permanent bonds had been issued, and that the total amount of bonds entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this act in accordance with resolutions adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant to the provisions of this act, and for the payment of the debt (interest and principal) as to which bonds additional school building aid may be paid pursuant to this act, shall not exceed the sum of \$90 million."
