AN ACT concerning civil actions and supplementing chapter 15 of Title 2A of the New Jersey Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Any person, including his insurer, may make payments to, or 2 on behalf of, a potential plaintiff for losses or expenses resulting 3 from any accident, without any admission of liability. Any such 4 payment may be made without prejudice to the rights of any of the 5 parties, including the insurer, but shall not be recoverable from a 6 potential plaintiff. Any such payment shall be deducted from any 7 settlement or judgment.

2. This act shall take effect immediately.
