- 6 may designate]; providing, sufficient applications are on file with
- 7 the board. The time and place of holding such examinations shall

- 9 the board at least 30 days prior to the date of each examination [,
- 10 and held in a State, county or other public building.

Each member of the board shall receive \$50.00 for each day on which he is actually engaged in giving examinations, and \$25.00 4 for each day actually employed in the discharge of his official duties, 6 and in addition thereto all necessary expenses incurred by him in executing his functions under this act, upon certifying the same 7 8 to the State Treasurer; provided, however, that total salaries of the board per year shall not exceed [\$300.00] the amount appro-9 priated by law for such year after payment or provision for pay-10 ment of all costs or expenses other than such salaries. The com-11 pensation and expenses of the members of the board and the 12 expenses of the board that are necessary to carry out the provisions 13 of this act shall be paid by the State Treasurer from the fees 14 15 collected under section 7; provided, that such compensation and expenses shall not exceed the amount so collected as fees. No 16 additional employees shall be engaged in addition to the board itself. 17. 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

for each day actually employed in the discharge of his official 6 duties, and in addition thereto all necessary expenses incurred by 7 him in executing his functions under this act, upon certifying the 8 same to the State Treasurer; provided, however, that total salaries 9 of the board per year shall not exceed [\$300.00] the amount appro-10 priated by law for such year after payment or provision for payment of all costs or expenses other than such salaries. The com-11 12 pensation and expenses of the members of the board and the expenses of the board that are necessary to carry out the provisions 13 14 of this act shall be paid by the State Treasurer from the fees collected under section 7; provided, that such compensation and 15 expenses shall not exceed the amount so collected as fees. No 16 17 additional employees shall be engaged in addition to the board 18 itself, but this shall not preclude engaging any person or persons, 19 including any organization, to assist the board on a volunteer 20basis. The board may also designate one or more examiners to 21assist it in preparing, conducting and evaluating the results of ex-22aminations, and may from time to time appoint one or more com-23mittees composed of persons having knowledge, experience or skill which may be of value in the performance of the work of the board, 24such committee to serve in an advisory or consultative capacity. 25

4. This act shall take effect immediately.

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STATEMENT

The present statute limits the examinations for certified short-hand reporters to 2 each year. The current need for qualified reporters to staff the larger number of judges in the Superior and County Courts, coupled with the increased volume of depositions, makes it necessary to authorize more frequent examinations, as may be needed. This will also enable the board to give the examination to smaller groups of applicants under better testing conditions. To meet the cost of this change, the application fee of \$15.00, which was set in 1940, is increased to \$25.00, and the provision for free examinations after the first is eliminated. The compensation scale is adjusted to reflect the greater burden of examinations, but in other respects remains at the same rate. Total cost of the board's work cannot exceed the amount received in fees, thus avoiding any effect on the State's budget.
