An Acr to amend "An act authorizing and empowering the Delaware River Port Authority, a body corporate and politic, functioning under the legislation enacted by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the State of New Jersey, and the express consent of the Congress of the United States, to appoint policemen; make rules and regulations for the prevention of disorder, the preservation of safety, and the conservation of traffic on such bridges and in such tunnels and approaches thereto as the commission does or may hereafter operate; to prevent the evasion of the payment of tolls; providing a penalty for the violation of any such rules or regulations or for the evasion or the attempt to evade the payment of tolls, and repealing chapter 4 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes," approved May 9, 1957 (P. L. 1957, c. 35).

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. Section 1 of the act of which this act is amendatory (C. 32:4-6)
- 2 is amended to read as follows:
- 3 1. The Delaware River Port Authority, a body corporate and
- 4 politic, functioning under the legislation enacted by the Common-
- 5 wealth of Pennsylvania and the State of New Jersey, and the
- 6 express consent of the Congress of the United States, and its
- 7 wholly-owned subsidiary corporation through which it is effectu-
- 8 ating its authorized purposes, shall have the power, and authority
- 9 [is hereby conferred thereon] to appoint such number of police-
- 10 men as may be found necessary to keep in safety and preserve
- 11 order upon such bridges and tunnels and approaches thereto, and
- 12 upon the rapid transit systems, ferries, facilities and other prop-
- 13 erty as the [authority] Delaware River Port Authority or such Explanation—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

subsidiary corporations does or may hereafter own, lease or oper-14 ate; to administer to such policemen an oath or affirmation faith-15 16 fully to perform the duties of their respective positions or offices; and to provide for the payment of such policemen from the tolls, 17 fares, charges and other revenue of the Delaware River Port Au-18 thority or such subsidiary corporations. The policemen so ap-19 pointed shall have the power and authority to make arrests for 20 21 any crimes, misdemeanors, and the offenses [of any character] 22 committed under the laws of the State of New Jersey or the Com-23 monwealth of Pennsylvania upon said bridges or within said tunnels [and] or approaches thereto, on the rapid transit systems, 24 ferries, facilities or other property, for disorder or breach of the 25 peace, [and] or for violations of any lawful regulation which may 26be or may heretofore have been adopted by the Delaware River 27 Port Authority or such subsidiary corporations. Such policemen 28 29 shall be further authorized and empowered to make arrests for 30 evasion or attempts to evade the payment of tolls, fares or other charges which may be fixed or may have been fixed [for passage 31 32over said bridges or through said tunnels and approaches thereto] 33 for the use of such bridge, tunnel, rapid transit system, or ferry, facility or other property. To pass over any part of said bridges 34 35 or through said tunnels and approaches thereto in any vehicle for 36 which tolls shall be collectible, or for any person or vehicle to use 37 the rapid transit systems or ferries or other facilities or property 38 without passing through the toll gates or paying such toll, fares or charges shall constitute such evasion and shall subject the person 39 40 so evading or attempting to evade such payment to arrest as aforesaid. Upon the apprehension or arrest of any person or persons 41 for any of the foregoing reasons, the offender may be taken before 42 43 any [magistrate of the city and county of Philadelphia or any] proper judicial officer of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or of 44 State of New Jersey without respect to the portion of the bridge 45 46 [or tunnel and approaches thereto], tunnel, ferry facility, rapid transit system, facilities or other property upon or within which 47 such offense may have been committed or attempted or such 48 offender arrested, and thereupon such [magistrate or] judicial **4**9 50 officer shall have the power and authority to punish such offender 51 as hereinafter provided. The Delaware River Port Authority and its wholly-owned subsidiary corporations through which it is 52**5**3 effectuating its authorized purposes shall have the power to adopt such rules and regulations as [it] they may respectively deem **54** 55 expedient for the proper government of said bridges [or], tunnels, 56 [and] approaches thereto, rapid transit systems, ferries, facilities

or other property and for the preservation of good order, safe 57 58 traffic, and proper conduct thereon or therein. For any violation of any of the foregoing provisions of this act or of any rule or 59 60 regulation adopted by the Delaware River Port Authority, or its said subsidiary corporations, or for any evasion or attempt to 61 62evade payment of tolls, fares or charges the offender or offenders 63 shall be subject to a fine or penalty of not less than \$10.00 or more than \$25.00, together with costs, to be adjudged by the [magistrate] 64proper judicial officer of the city and county of Philadelphia or 65 66 other proper judicial officer of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or of the State of New Jersey before whom such offender or 67 68 offenders may be brought, and on default of payment of such fine or penalty, then to imprisonment of not less than 10 days or more 69 than 30 days in the place of incarceration decreed by said magis-70 trate or other judicial officer; and upon conviction of any sub-71sequent offense, shall be subject to a fine or penalty of not less 72than \$25.00 or more than \$50.00, together with costs, or to imprison-73 ment of not less than 30 days or more than 60 days or both at the 74discretion of the said magistrate or other judicial officer. 75

- 2. The powers vested in the Delaware River Port Authority by this act shall be construed as being in addition to and not in diminution of the powers heretofore vested in the Delaware River 4 Port Authority.
- 3. All acts and parts of acts are repealed insofar as they are inconsistent herewith.
- 4. This act shall take effect upon the enactment into law by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania of legislation having a substantially similar effect as this act, but if the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall have already enacted such legislation, this act shall
- 5 take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

In the past few years, legislation has been enacted to empower the Delaware River Port Authority to undertake projects of a different nature than the original toll bridge functions of the authority. The need for the appointment of police to perform essential law enforcement services for the authority has long been recognized and legislative authorization for appointment of such police has been enacted. However, legislation which expanded the functions of the port authority and changed the corporate structure of the authority has not amended the statutory provisions dealing with authority police. Thus the duties, authority and jurisdiction of police officers are not as clearly delineated as they should be.

The grant and exercise of police powers is of such importance that the legislation providing for such powers should be clear, complete and free of ambiguity. This legislation is intended to eliminate any ambiguities that might exist in view of the expanded duties and change in structure of the port authority.
