As amended by the committee, this bill requires the Commissioner of Human Services to apply for a federal waiver of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefit time limit for ablebodied adults without dependents (ABAWD), either for the entire State or for any geographic areas in the State that meet federal waiver criteria. Under current federal law, ABAWDs are eligible for SNAP benefits for three months over a three-year period, unless the individual works a minimum of 20 hours per week, participates in a work program for 20 hours per week, participates in a work program, is pregnant, has a physical or mental disability that prohibits work, has a dependent under the age of 18 living in the same household, or is otherwise exempt from the general work requirements for SNAP.

The bill, as amended, also clarifies current law by requiring the commissioner to review State labor and employment data annually in order to determine whether to submit a subsequent request for a waiver of the ABAWD benefit time limit. The review conducted by the commissioner is to consider each criterion of waiver eligibility as well as the availability of opportunities that will fulfill the federal work requirement described in federal regulations. Based upon this annual review, the commissioner is to submit a waiver request for the maximum number of geographic areas in the State that are eligible for a waiver. The waiver request is to cover all geographic areas which represent the largest number of individuals eligible for a waiver of the ABAWD time limits on the receipt of SNAP benefits.

As reported by the committee with amendments, Senate Bill No. 2036 is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2362 (2R), which was also reported by the committee on this date.

#### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:**

The committee amendments remove language tying the requirements of the bill to the end of the federal public health emergency declared in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The committee amendments revise the requirements for the Commissioner of Human Services to submit subsequent waiver requests to clarify that the commissioner is to submit each such waiver request for the maximum number of areas in the State that are eligible for a waiver, and for all geographic areas which represent the largest number of individuals eligible for the waiver.

The committee amendments add language indicating that the support provided under the bill satisfies certain requirements of federal law.

The committee amendments make a technical change involving grammar.
