1. a. For the purposes of N.J.A.C.8:24-1.5 et seq. or any other applicable rule or regulation, honey that is raw and has not been processed, infused, pasteurized, or otherwise modified or combined with any other food or product shall not be deemed to be a "cottage food product," as defined in N.J.A.C.8:24-1.5.

The Assembly Agriculture and Food Security Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 3991.

This bill would clarify that, for the purposes of N.J.A.C.8:24-1.5 or any other applicable rule or regulation, honey that is raw and has not been processed, infused, pasteurized, or otherwise modified or combined with any other food or product may not be deemed to be a "cottage food product," as defined in N.J.A.C.8:24-1.5.

"Cottage food product" is defined in the regulations as a food product that is not a TCS food product (a food product that requires time and/or temperature control for safety to limit pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin formation) that a cottage food processor prepares.

The bill would require the Department of Agriculture and the Department of Health, within 60 days after the bill's effective date, to adopt or amend rules or regulations, on an emergency basis, as may be necessary to effectuate the bill's purposes.
