#### Gov. Christie Whitman today signed the following pieces of legislation:

**S-1418**, sponsored by Senators Robert E. Littell (R- Sussex/Hunterdon/Morris) and John O. Bennett (R-Monmouth) and Assembly Members Joseph Azzolina (R-Middlesex/Monmouth) and Rose Marie Heck (R-Bergen), changes the recommended contributions to the various charitable check off boxes on the New Jersey gross income tax return. The legislation changes the check off boxes from \$5 and \$10 to \$10 and \$20.

**S-824**, sponsored by Senator Louis F. Kosco (R-Bergen) and Assembly Member John V. Kelly (R-Bergen/Essex/Passaic), makes knowingly engaging in the business of electrical contracting without a business permit issued by the Board of Examiners of Electrical Contractors a crime of the fourth degree under certain circumstances. Current law classifies the practice of electrical contracting as a disorderly persons offense. A disorderly persons offense is punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 or a prison sentence of up to six months. A crime of the fourth degree is punishable by a fine up to \$10,000 or a prison sentence of up to 18 months.

**S-859**, sponsored by Senator C. Louis Bassano (R-Essex/Union) and Robert J. Martin (R-Essex/Morris/Passaic), designates the Forensic Psychiatric Hospital as the Ann Klein Forensic Center in honor of the late Ann Klein's distinguished record of public service to New Jersey and her effort to improve the lives of others. The Forensic Psychiatric Hospital, located on the grounds of the Trenton Psychiatric Hospital, is the only forensic facility of its kind in the state, providing psychiatric, nursing and medical care to persons incarcerated because of mental illness. Ann Klein, who was a Commissioner of Human Services during Governor Brendan Byrne's administration, worked to improve conditions for incarcerated persons with mental illness and proposed initiatives that led to the development of a forensic facility at Trenton Psychiatric Hospital. Ann Klein died in 1986.

#### Gov. Christie Whitman today signed the following pieces of legislation:

**S-1418**, sponsored by Senators Robert E. Littell (R- Sussex/Hunterdon/Morris) and John O. Bennett (R-Monmouth) and Assembly Members Joseph Azzolina (R-Middlesex/Monmouth) and Rose Marie Heck (R-Bergen), changes the recommended contributions to the various charitable check off boxes on the New Jersey gross income tax return. The legislation changes the check off boxes from \$5 and \$10 to \$10 and \$20.

**S-824**, sponsored by Senator Louis F. Kosco (R-Bergen) and Assembly Member John V. Kelly (R-Bergen/Essex/Passaic), makes knowingly engaging in the business of electrical contracting without a business permit issued by the Board of Examiners of Electrical Contractors a crime of the fourth degree under certain circumstances. Current law classifies the practice of electrical contracting as a disorderly persons offense. A disorderly persons offense is punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 or a prison sentence of up to six months. A crime of the fourth degree is punishable by a fine up to \$10,000 or a prison sentence of up to 18 months.

**S-859**, sponsored by Senator C. Louis Bassano (R-Essex/Union) and Robert J. Martin (R-Essex/Morris/Passaic), designates the Forensic Psychiatric Hospital as the Ann Klein Forensic Center in honor of the late Ann Klein's distinguished record of public service to New Jersey and her effort to improve the lives of others. The Forensic Psychiatric Hospital, located on the grounds of the Trenton Psychiatric Hospital, is the only forensic facility of its kind in the state, providing psychiatric, nursing and medical care to persons incarcerated because of mental illness. Ann Klein, who was a Commissioner of Human Services during Governor Brendan Byrne's administration, worked to improve conditions for incarcerated persons with mental illness and proposed initiatives that led to the development of a forensic facility at Trenton Psychiatric Hospital. Ann Klein died in 1986.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1418.

This legislation revises the dollar amount options provided on the New Jersey gross income tax return for designating voluntary contributions to the special funds authorized to receive such contributions through taxpayer checkoffs, increasing those option amounts from "\$5, \$10 or other" to "\$10, \$20 or other." The funds identified on the tax form as eligible for such contributions are the Endangered and Nongame Species of Wildlife Conservation Fund, the Children's Trust Fund, the Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Fund, the New Jersey Breast Cancer Research Fund, and the U.S.S. New Jersey Educational Museum Fund (the name of which is changed under the bill from its current name, the "Battleship New Jersey Memorial Fund"). The bill also extends for one year until December 31, 1999 the contribution provision for the Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Fund.

The bill will apply to taxable years beginning on or after January 1 next following enactment.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**:

The Department of the Treasury has not provided any estimate of the fiscal impact of this legislation. Implementation of the bill should not have an impact on the State's General Fund, but it is impossible to estimate how many taxpayers would choose to use the new options to alter the amount of their contributions.

Current gross income tax checkoffs resulted in the following amounts of contributions in tax returns filed in 1997 for tax year 1996: \$342,044 to the Endangered Wildlife Conservation Fund; \$276,555 to the Children's Trust Fund; \$119,626 to the Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Fund; \$103,990 to the Battleship New Jersey Memorial Fund; and \$206,975 to the Breast Cancer Research Fund.

Senate Bill No. 1418 of 1998 provides for changes to the tax return designation on the gross income tax return to permit taxpayers to make voluntary contributions to special funds. The bill increases the value of the amounts specified through contribution checkoffs from "\$5, \$10, or other" to "\$10, \$20, or other." The bill also changes the designated fund name for the Battleship New Jersey Memorial Fund to the "U.S.S. New Jersey Educational Museum Fund," and extends for one year until December 31, 1999 the contribution provision for the Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Fund.

The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) is unable to reliably estimate the amount of taxpayer contributions which would be donated for the purposes of the bill, but notes that the legislation will have no impact on state finances, since any contributions to the fund are voluntary and will not reduce or increase an individual's gross income tax liability. In addition, any administrative expenditures incurred by the division as a result of the bill may be reimbursed from the gross receipts collected by the fund.

The replacement of the current \$5 and \$10 checkoff boxes with \$10 and \$20 boxes should result in net additional contributions to some or all of the fund beneficiaries; however, there could be an offset of some indeterminate amount for those persons who formerly contributed \$5 but who may not wish to contribute \$10 or use the "other" category to enter a lower amount. Current gross income tax designations resulted in the following amounts of contributions in tax returns filed in 1997 for tax year 1996: \$342,044 to the Endangered Wildlife Conservation fund; \$276,555 to the Children's Trust Fund; \$119,626 to the Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Fund; \$103,990 to the Battleship New Jersey Memorial Fund; and \$206,975 to the Breast Cancer Research Fund.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2497.

Assembly Bill No. 2497 increases the value of the amounts specified for contribution to special funds made through the contribution checkoffs on the New Jersey gross income tax return from "\$5, \$10 or other" to "\$10, \$20 or other." The contributions may be designated for deposit to the Endangered and Nongame Species of Wildlife Conservation Fund, Children's Trust Fund, Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Fund, New Jersey Breast Cancer Research Fund, and the U.S.S. New Jersey Educational Museum Fund. This bill will also extend for one year until December 31, 1999 the contribution provision for the Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Fund and change the designated fund name for the Battleship New Jersey contribution deposits.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**:

There is no information available as to how many or how much would be designated by these changes. Latest available data from the Division of Taxation showed a total of approximately \$1.1 million in designated contributions for the five different funds. It can only be assumed that the total would increase under the provisions of this bill, but to what extent is unknown.

Assembly Bill No. 2497 of 1998 provides for changes to the tax return designation on the gross income tax return to permit taxpayers to make voluntary contributions to special funds. The bill increases the value of the amounts specified through contribution checkoffs from "\$5, \$10, or other" to "\$10, \$20, or other." The bill also changes the designated fund name for the Battleship New Jersey Memorial Fund to the "U.S.S. New Jersey Educational Museum Fund," and extends for one year until December 31, 1999 the contribution provision for the Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Fund.

The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) is unable to reliably estimate the amount of taxpayer contributions which would be donated for the purposes of the bill, but notes that the legislation will have no impact on state finances, since any contributions to the fund are voluntary and will not reduce or increase an individual's gross income tax liability. In addition, any administrative expenditures incurred by the division as a result of the bill may be reimbursed from the gross receipts collected by the fund.

The replacement of the current \$5 and \$10 checkoff boxes with \$10 and \$20 boxes should result in net additional contributions to some or all of the fund beneficiaries; however, there could be an offset of some indeterminate amount for those persons who formerly contributed \$5 but who may not wish to contribute \$10 or use the "other" category to enter a lower amount. Current gross income tax designations resulted in the following amounts of contributions in tax returns filed in 1997 for tax year 1996: \$342,044 to the Endangered Wildlife Conservation fund; \$276,555 to the Children's Trust Fund; \$119,626 to the Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Fund; \$103,990 to the Battleship New Jersey Memorial Fund; and \$206,975 to the Breast Cancer Research Fund.

#### Gov. Christie Whitman today signed the following pieces of legislation:

**S-1418**, sponsored by Senators Robert E. Littell (R- Sussex/Hunterdon/Morris) and John O. Bennett (R-Monmouth) and Assembly Members Joseph Azzolina (R-Middlesex/Monmouth) and Rose Marie Heck (R-Bergen), changes the recommended contributions to the various charitable check off boxes on the New Jersey gross income tax return. The legislation changes the check off boxes from \$5 and \$10 to \$10 and \$20.

**S-824**, sponsored by Senator Louis F. Kosco (R-Bergen) and Assembly Member John V. Kelly (R-Bergen/Essex/Passaic), makes knowingly engaging in the business of electrical contracting without a business permit issued by the Board of Examiners of Electrical Contractors a crime of the fourth degree under certain circumstances. Current law classifies the practice of electrical contracting as a disorderly persons offense. A disorderly persons offense is punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 or a prison sentence of up to six months. A crime of the fourth degree is punishable by a fine up to \$10,000 or a prison sentence of up to 18 months.

**S-859**, sponsored by Senator C. Louis Bassano (R-Essex/Union) and Robert J. Martin (R-Essex/Morris/Passaic), designates the Forensic Psychiatric Hospital as the Ann Klein Forensic Center in honor of the late Ann Klein's distinguished record of public service to New Jersey and her effort to improve the lives of others. The Forensic Psychiatric Hospital, located on the grounds of the Trenton Psychiatric Hospital, is the only forensic facility of its kind in the state, providing psychiatric, nursing and medical care to persons incarcerated because of mental illness. Ann Klein, who was a Commissioner of Human Services during Governor Brendan Byrne's administration, worked to improve conditions for incarcerated persons with mental illness and proposed initiatives that led to the development of a forensic facility at Trenton Psychiatric Hospital. Ann Klein died in 1986.
