b. A licensee may pay reasonable compensation to a person approved by the control commission for services rendered in connection with holding, operating or conducting games, pursuant to regulations adopted by the control commission. The Senate State Government, Banking and Financial Institutions Committee reports favorably Senate, No. 1119.

This bill amends existing law to allow charitable and civic organizations which are licensed to conduct bingo games or raffles to reasonably compensate a person approved by the Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission for services rendered in connection with holding, operating or conducting bingo games or raffles. At present, only members of the organization or of an auxiliary or affiliated organization may be involved in these activities. This change would enable charitable and civic organizations to hire qualified persons in order to ensure that games are conducted in a fair and professional manner. The commission is required to adopt regulations which:

- establish the qualifications required of such persons, the duties which may be performed and schedule of compensation which may be paid;
- require that a person receive approval of the commission prior to rendering any services for which compensation will be received;
- provide that an active member will oversee the rendering of services by a person receiving compensation; and
- prohibit the payment of compensation to any person who is an active member of an organization or of an auxiliary or affiliated organization.

The bill would also permit the control commission to adopt regulations allowing charitable and civic organizations which are licensed to conduct raffles to hold events known as "armchair races" and "casino nights." An armchair race would allow players to wager on the results of a previously-filmed horse race. Merchandise or raffle tickets, but not cash, could be offered as a prize. At a casino night, players would use chips or script purchased from the licensee to wager in games of chance including blackjack, under/over, beat-the-dealer, chuck-a-luck, craps, roulette, bingo or similar games approved by the commission.
