The Assembly Transportation Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 175 (1R).

The Senate Senior Citizens, Veterans' Affairs and Human Services Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 175.

As amended by committee, this bill authorizes the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles in the Department of Transportation to issue special license plates to recipients of the Navy Cross, a decoration awarded by the United States Navy for exceptional heroism in action. Current law provides for the issuance of special plates to recipients of the Silver Star, a United States military decoration awarded for gallantry in action.

The license plates authorized by this bill would bear a design approved by the director identifying the registrant as a recipient of the Navy Cross, in addition to other markings or identification otherwise prescribed by law. There would be a fee of \$15 in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of motor vehicles. From the fees collected, the director shall retain the sums necessary to provide for all costs incurred by the division in producing and issuing the Navy Cross license plates.

Also, the bill authorizes the director to promulgate rules and regulations governing the issuance and use of these plates.

The bill would also allow surviving spouses of deceased Navy Cross recipients to retain the special license plates.

The committee amended the bill to add a fee of \$15 to pay the cost of producing and issuing these license plates. The amount of the fee is consistent with the fee charged for other license plates issued to recognize military service.

Senate Bill No. 175 (1R) of 1998 authorizes the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles to issue special license plates to recipients of the Navy Cross, a decoration awarded by the United States Navy and the Marine Corps for exceptional heroism in action. There would be an application fee of \$15 for the special plates, which shall be in addition to fees otherwise required by law.

The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) cannot determine how many recipients of the Navy Cross reside in New Jersey and would be interested in obtaining these special license plates. Therefore, OLS cannot estimate the additional revenue that would be generated by the \$15 application fee. However, based on costs for similar license plates, OLS would estimate a cost of about \$1,000 for a new plate die and costs of about \$10 to produce and issue each set of special plates.

This fiscal estimate has been prepared pursuant to P.L.1980, c.67.

Gov. Christie Whitman today signed the following pieces of legislation:

**A-2370**, sponsored by Assembly Members George F. Geist (R- Camden/Gloucester) and Leonard Lance (R-Warren/Hunterdon/Mercer) and Senators William E. Schluter (R-Warren/ Hunterdon /Mercer) and Edward T. O'Connor, Jr. (D-Hudson), expands the definition of a candidate under the New Jersey Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act to include an individual considering whether to be a candidate for public office. The bill requires persons who are "testing the waters" for candidacy for public office to file reports with the ELEC???like officially declared candidates. The bill eliminates exploratory committees typically used by candidates for governor or other offices to examine their prospects before formally opening a campaign. Under previous law, candidates were not required to reveal the amount or source of contributions to an exploratory committee.

**S-175**, sponsored by Senator John O. Bennett (R-Monmouth), authorizes the director of the Division of Motor Vehicles to issue special license plates to recipients of the Navy Cross, a decoration awarded by the United States Navy for exceptional heroism in action. The special license plants will bear the word "Navy Cross" and depict the Navy Cross emblem. In addition to fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of motor vehicles, there will be a \$15 fee for the cost of producing and issuing the special license plates.
