The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill Nos. 1232/447 and Assembly Bill No. 1489 (SCS/SS).

The Senate Substitute for Senate Bill Nos. 1232/447and Assembly Bill No. 1489 (SCS) creates twelve additional Superior Court judgeships. Seven of those judgeships would be unrestricted. Of the remaining five, one each would be assigned to the following counties: Burlington, Camden, Gloucester, Passaic and Salem.

The legislation also requires that each nomination for a Superior Court judgeship indicate the name of the former judge whose vacancy the nomination is filling and if the judgeship must be filled by a resident of a specific county.

The legislation further requires that not more than 10 days after the enactment of this bill, and annually on September 1 of each year, the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) shall notify the Legislature with a list of the names of those Superior Court judges fulfilling the requirements set forth in N.J.S.2B:2-1. It also requires the AOC to include the names of all those Superior Court judges serving in these positions who are sitting out of their county of residence and the county in which these Superior Court judges are sitting. Thereafter, the AOC would be required to notify the Legislature whenever a vacancy in any Superior Court judgeship occurs.

As reported by this committee, this bill is identical to A-2841 of 1999, also reported by this committee.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This legislation make a General Fund appropriation in the amount of \$3,300,000 to the Administrative Office of the Courts for the costs associated with the additional judgeships.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2841.

Assembly Bill No. 2841 creates twelve additional Superior Court judgeships. Seven of those judgeships would be unrestricted. Of the remaining five, one each would be assigned to the following counties: Burlington, Camden, Gloucester, Passaic and Salem.

The legislation also requires that each nomination for a Superior Court judgeship indicate the name of the former judge whose vacancy the nomination is filling and if the judgeship must be filled by a resident of a specific county.

The legislation further requires that not more than 10 days after the enactment of this bill, and annually on September 1 of each year, the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) shall notify the Legislature with a list of the names of those Superior Court judges fulfilling the requirements set forth in N.J.S.2B:2-1. It also requires the AOC to include the names of all those Superior Court judges serving in these positions who are sitting out of their county of residence and the county in which these Superior Court judges are sitting. Thereafter, the AOC would be required to notify the Legislature whenever a vacancy in any Superior Court judgeship occurs.

As reported by this committee, this bill is identical to the Senate Substitute for Senate Bill Nos. 1232/447 and Assembly Bill No. 1489 (SCS), also reported by this committee.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This legislation make a General Fund appropriation in the amount of \$3,300,000 to the Administrative Office of the Courts for the costs associated with the additional judgeships.

Assembly Bill No. 1489 of 1998 provides for an additional Superior Court judge, increasing the total number of judges of that court from 416 to 417 and increasing the total number of judges of the Superior Court who at the time of their appointment or reappointment were residents of Warren County from three to four. The bill also appropriates \$275,000.

The Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) states that the salary and fringe benefits costs for a judge totals \$168,475 (\$115,000 for salaries and \$53,475 for fringe benefits). In addition, each judge's staff consists of a secretary, a law clerk, and a court clerk for a salary and fringe benefits cost of \$101,440, and a total salary and fringe benefits cost of \$269,915.

The AOC also notes that first-year start-up costs for furnishings and supplies would total \$47,000, and be reduced to \$8,000 per year thereafter, for a first-year cost of \$316,915. The AOC adds that while the bill appropriates \$275,000 for implementation, it would be able to bear the additional expense of the bill from available resources.

Gov. Christie Whitman today signed the following piece of legislation:

Senate Substitute for SCS for S-1232 and 447 and A-1489, sponsored by Senators Edward T. O'Connor, Jr. (D-Hudson) and William L. Gormley (R-Atlantic) and William E. Schluter (R- Warren/Hunterdon/Mercer) and Assembly Member Leonard Lance (R- Warren/Hunterdon /Mercer), amends state law to create 12 additional Superior Court judgeships, increasing the total number from 416 to 428. Of the 12, five of the judgeships will be restricted and seven will be unrestricted. Restricted means the seat must be filled by a resident of a specific county. Unrestricted seats can be filled by residents of any county. One of each of the five restricted judgeships will be assigned to the following counties: Burlington, Camden, Gloucester, Passaic and Salem. In addition to facilitating the reduction of backlogged cases, the judges will also help the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) to handle the increase in workload expected to be created by the federal Adoption and Safe Families Act of 1997. The act requires that hearings on the termination of parental rights be expedited. The bill appropriates \$3.3 million to the AOC for costs associated with the additional judgeships.
