The Assembly Transportation Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2992 with committee amendments.

As amended by the committee, this bill prohibits the South Jersey Transportation Authority from charging or collecting tolls or other charges for the use of State Highway Route No. 42 or any parts or sections thereof, pursuant to any agreement between the authority and the Department of Transportation transferring the highway to the authority. The amended bill provides that whenever the department transfers jurisdiction of the highway to the authority, the department shall cause a statement containing the permanent conditions and restrictions of the transfer, including a prohibition of the imposition of tolls or other charges for use of the highway, to be attached to and recorded with the deed of the land.

The committee amended the bill so that its provisions apply only to the transfer of State Highway Route No. 42 to the South Jersey Transportation Authority.

As amended by the committee, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 1798.

This bill prohibits the South Jersey Transportation Authority from charging or collecting tolls or other charges for the use of State Highway Route No. 42 or any parts or sections thereof, pursuant to any agreement between the authority and the Department of Transportation. The bill provides that whenever the department transfers jurisdiction of the highway to the authority, the department shall cause a statement containing the permanent conditions and restrictions of the transfer, including a prohibition of the imposition of tolls or other charges for use of the highway, to be attached to and recorded with the deed of the land.

The Senate Transportation Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1798.

This bill provides that whenever the Department of Transportation transfers jurisdiction of Highway Route No. 42, or any portion of that highway, to the South Jersey Transportation Authority, the department shall provide that the highway, and all portions of it, must remain free of tolls or other charges. In the event of such a transfer the department must attach a statement to the deed of the land. The statement must make note of the permanent conditions and restrictions of the transfer, including the prohibition of the imposition of tolls or other charges for the use of the highway. The bill prohibits the South Jersey Transportation Authority from charging or collecting tolls or other charges for the use of Route 42, or any parts thereof, which it may acquire ownership of pursuant to an agreement between the authority and the department.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2992, as amended.
