Finally, the bill appropriates \$5,000,000 to UMDNJ for costs associated with the program, which costs shall include, but not be limited to, the fellowships awarded to medical and dental participants, program administrative costs, faculty salaries, educational costs for the didactic component and support for resource units which assist with educational activities and clinical training. The bill limits the indirect administrative costs of the program to the indirect costs rate applicable for comparable training programs under federal law. Also, the bill provides that of the amount appropriated, \$2.25 million shall be allocated to the fellowship program; \$2.25 million shall be allocated to residency programs; and \$500,000 shall be allocated to continuing medical and dental education programs.

The committee amended the bill to require that fellowship applicants agree to provide medical or dental care to persons with developmental disabilities in the State following completion of the fellowship for a time period equal to the length of the applicant's fellowship training, rather than provide that the policies and procedures of the program give preference to applicants who indicate a commitment to practice in the State following completion of their fellowship.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1492 (1R).

This bill establishes a "Physician-Dentist Fellowship and Education Program to Provide Health Care to Persons with Developmental Disabilities" within the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey (UMDNJ). The purpose of the program is to provide physicians and dentists with graduate and fellowship training through academic institutions in the State and continuing medical and dental education on a Statewide basis, in the provision of medical and dental services to persons in the State with developmental disabilities to ensure that these services are accessible and adequately available to those persons.

Program elements. The program shall:

- (1) Create training sites in each of the northern, central and southern regions of the State;
- (2) Establish cooperative agreements with managed care organizations, community health centers and other health care facilities in the State, in which program participants can provide medical and dental care to persons with developmental disabilities;
- (3) Establish standards for one- to two-year fellowships that will include clinical, didactic and research components, as appropriate, and provide stipends to program fellows that are comparable to other post-graduate medical and dental fellowships offered in the State;
- (4) Establish collaborative working relationships with accredited residency programs in the State to provide training to medical and dental residents in the provision of health care to persons with developmental disabilities; and
- (5) Ensure the development and provision of continuing medical education and continuing dental education for physicians and dentists, respectively, on a Statewide basis, in the care of persons with developmental disabilities.

Program director. The bill directs the President of UMDNJ to appoint a director for the program who shall be a State licensed physician. The director may appoint regional chairmen or chairmen of medical or dental practice specialties, as the director deems necessary

for the operation of the program. One year after the date on which the bill takes effect as law, and annually thereafter, the director shall report to the Senate and General Assembly standing reference committees on Health on the status of the program.

Program advisory body. The bill establishes a 15-member Consortium on Physician and Dentist Training in Health Care for Persons with Developmental Disabilities to assist the director of the program in establishing policies and procedures for the nomination and selection of physicians and dentists as program fellows. The consortium shall otherwise advise the director on the operation of the program as the director deems necessary, and as specified in the bill.

The consortium membership shall include: one representative each from the pediatric medicine, family medicine, internal medicine, neurology and psychiatry programs at UMDNJ, one representative from the New Jersey Dental School, and one representative of the University Affiliated Program, to be appointed by the President of UMDNJ; the director of the Mainstreaming Medical Care program of The Arc of New Jersey, who shall serve ex officio; the Director of the Division of Developmental Disabilities in the Department of Human Services, who shall serve ex officio; three health care provider public members appointed by the President of UMDNJ, one each upon the recommendation of the Medical Society of New Jersey, the New Jersey Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons and the New Jersey Dental Association; and three public members appointed by the President of UMDNJ, upon the recommendation of the Director of the Division of Developmental Disabilities, two of whom shall represent community organizations that advocate for persons with developmental disabilities and one of whom shall be a family member of a person with a developmental disability or a person with a developmental disability who is a self advocate.

The President of UMDNJ shall make the appointments to the consortium within 60 days of the date on which the bill takes effect as law.

The bill provides that the President of UMDNJ shall consult with the consortium when appointing the director of the fellowship program. It also provides for consultation by the director with the consortium in any appointment of regional chairmen or chairmen of practice specialties.

Qualifications and conditions for fellowship awards. The bill requires that a fellowship applicant be a graduate of a medical school or dental school approved by the State Board of Medical Examiners or the New Jersey State Board of Dentistry, as appropriate, and receive a recommendation from the school's medical or dental staff concerning participation in the program, and in the case of a physician, have completed a professional residency training program and have received a recommendation from the medical staff of the residency training program concerning participation in the fellowship program.

Fellowship applicants must agree to provide medical or dental care

to persons with developmental disabilities, as appropriate, in the State following completion of the fellowship for a time period equal to the length of the applicant's fellowship training.

FISCAL IMPACT

The bill appropriates \$5,000,000 to UMDNJ for costs associated with the program, which costs shall include, but not be limited to, the fellowships awarded to medical and dental participants, program administrative costs, faculty salaries, educational costs for the didactic component and support for resource units that assist with educational activities and clinical training. Of the amount appropriated, \$2.25 million is to be allocated to the fellowship program, \$2.25 million is to be allocated to residency programs, and \$500,000 is to be allocated to continuing medical and dental education programs.

The bill limits the indirect administrative costs of the program to the indirect costs rate applicable for comparable training programs under federal law.

SENATE BILL NO. 1492 (FIRST REPRINT)

To the Senate:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14 of the New Jersey Constitution, I am returning Senate Bill No. 1492 (First Reprint) with my recommendations for reconsideration.

Summary of Bill

This bill seeks to address the increased demand for medical and dental professionals who are trained to provide services to the developmentally disabled. To accomplish this goal, the bill establishes a "Physician-Dentist Fellowship and Education Program to Provide Health Care to Persons with Developmental Disabilities" ("program") within the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey ("UMDNJ"). The program will train physicians and dentists in providing medical and dental services to individuals with developmental disabilities to ensure that these services are accessible and available to such individuals. The training will occur at the residency, post-doctoral fellowship and continuing education levels. The bill appropriates a \$5 million grant to UMDNJ for the costs associated with the program.

The bill directs the President of UMDNJ to appoint a director for the program who will be a State licensed physician. The director will be assisted in operating the program by a 15-member Consortium on Physician and Dentist Training in Health Care for Persons with Development Disabilities ("consortium"). Included on the consortium are the following: seven representatives from UMDNJ; three health care provider public members appointed by the President of UMDNJ at the recommendation of medical professional associations; three public members appointed by the President of UMDNJ at the recommendation of the Director of the Division of Developmental Disabilities, two of whom shall represent community organizations that advocate for persons with developmental disabilities and one of whom shall be a family member of a person with a developmental disability; one representative from the Arc of New Jersey; and one representative from the Department of Human Services' Division of Developmental Disabilities. The President of UMDNJ must make the appointments to the consortium within 60 days of the effective date of the bill.

The bill also establishes qualifications and conditions for doctors and dentists applying to the program. Applicants must agree to provide medical or dental care to persons with developmental disabilities following completion of the program for a time period equal to the length of the applicant's training.

The bill appropriates \$5 million as a grant to UMDNJ for costs associated with the program, including costs for fellowships awarded to medical and dental participants, faculty salaries, curricular costs associated with training, and program administrative costs. Of the \$5 million appropriation, \$2.25 million is to be allocated to the fellowship program, \$2.25 million is to be allocated to residency programs, and \$500,000 is to be allocated to continuing medical and dental education programs.

Recommended Action

I commend the sponsors of this bill for addressing the serious health care needs of the developmentally disabled community by establishing the Physician-Dentist Fellowship Education Program. As developmentally disabled persons begin to receive health care services in more traditional settings, the need to ensure the availability of highly trained medical professionals cannot be denied.

It is essential, however, that the program be administered by an agency that has the expertise to effectively respond to the unique needs of the State's developmentally disabled community. The Department of Human Services ("Department"), working through the Division of Developmental Disabilities, has significant experience in identifying those needs. I recommend, therefore, that funds to administer the program be appropriated to the Department to ensure that UMDNJ and the Department work together to achieve the program's goals. To enhance this joint management arrangement, I recommend that the Commissioner of the Department ("Commissioner") appoint the six public members of the consortium and that the Director of the Division of Developmental Disabilities serve as the chairman of the consortium. Further, in an effort to bring all appropriate stakeholders together in the consortium, I recommend that the Director of the Division of Medical Assistance and Health Services in the Department and the Commissioner of Health or her

designee serve as ex officio members.

In addition to taking advantage of the expertise of the Department, I believe it is important that the program utilize existing resources at UMDNJ, as well as other institutions, to assist in providing training to physicians and dentists in caring for the developmentally disabled. I recommend, therefore, that the program collaborate with various currently existing public and private programs that provide health services to the developmentally disabled.

Further, although I appreciate the need to provide support for this worthy program, I believe that the State can make a significant commitment and accomplish the objectives of this program with a \$2.5 million appropriation rather than a \$5 million appropriation. Upon the recommendation of the consortium and approval of the Commissioner, appropriate amounts will be allocated to the fellowship, residency, and continuing education components of the program. As the program is developed, I will consider making additional appropriations if the consortium and the Commissioner deem it necessary.

Finally, to provide clarification, I recommend that the bill explicitly confer voting status to all members of the consortium, including ex officio members.

Therefore, I herewith return Senate Bill No. 1492 (First Reprint) and recommend that it be amended as follows:

Gov. Christie Whitman today conditionally vetoed the following pieces of legislation:

SCS For S-1220, sponsored by the late Senator Wynona M. Lipman (D- Essex/Union) and Senator Joseph A. Palaia (R-Monmouth) and Assembly Members William D. Payne (D-Essex/Union) and Joseph V. Doria, Jr. (D-Hudson), establishes an at-risk youth mentoring program for public school students in the Department of Labor (DOL). The bill appropriates \$750,000 from the work First New Jersey - Work Activities account in the Department of Human Services to the Workforce Development Partnership Fund in the DOL to implement the provisions of the bill.

The Governor commended the sponsors of the legislation, especially the late Senator Lipman, for their efforts to establish a mentoring program for at-risk youth. She said the recommendations in her conditional veto would enhance the program's effectiveness. The Governor recommended that the bill be amended to create a three-year pilot program to allow for evaluation of the program's success and its role in relation to other public and private mentoring programs that are currently offered to at-risk youth. She said the mentoring programs also should use existing resources. The Governor recommended that the programs be designed to utilize public and private community organizations that provide employment, mental health, substance abuse, and family planning services to provide training for mentors and services for the at-risk youth served by the mentoring program. In order to provide for the effective use of available funds, Gov. Whitman recommended that the DOL have the authority to provide grants of up to \$50,000 instead of \$25,000 and that the maximum number of students served by a program be increased from 25 to 50 students.

S-2008, sponsored by Senator Diane B. Allen (R-Burlington/Camden) and Assembly Member Guy R. Gregg (R-Sussex/Hunterdon/Morris), would have amended current law to reduce the surcharge levied annually on workers' compensation insurance policy holders and self-insured employers. The bill would have modified the assignment formula to reduce the estimate used to calculate the surcharge from 150% to 125% of the estimated cost of the program. Use of an overestimate ensures that moneys will be sufficient to cover any unanticipated claims against the fund. In her conditional veto, the Governor recommended limiting the assessment formula to 100% of estimated administrative costs and requiring the Commissioner of Labor to submit an informational copy of the assessment to the Joint Budget Oversight Committee. The Governor said her action will serve to reduce the financial burden on employers and avoid overfunding, while maintaining adequate reserves for benefit payments and administrative costs.

S-912, sponsored by Senators Joseph A. Palaia (R-Monmouth) and Martha W. Bark (R-Atlantic /Burlington/Camden) and Assembly Members Joseph J. Roberts, Jr. (D-Camden/Gloucester) and George E. Geist (R-Camden/Gloucester), would have authorized certain changes to the offices of the county fire marshals and allowed for the creation of arson investigation units. The bill would have amended current laws to require county fire marshals to conduct investigations pertaining to the

elimination of fire hazards. The bill would also have amended certain statutorily defined responsibilities of a county fire marshal that a freeholder board is authorized to approve.

In her conditional veto, the Governor said that after a unanimous vote on the bill in both the Senate and Assembly, the sponsors requested that she issue a conditional veto in order to allow the part time fire marshals that serve the state's smaller counties to have greater flexibility within the new mandates. She commended the sponsors for their work in amending existing law in order to more accurately reflect the role of county fire marshals. The Governor recommended amending the bill to allow the fire marshals to determine whether to conduct or assist in an investigation pertaining to the cause and origin of a fire when requested by the fire department having jurisdiction over it.

She also recommended changing the entity to whom the fire marshal reports from the entity with control over the executive functions of the county to an authority designated by that entity. Also, the Governor recommended limiting situations for which a fire marshal may be required to render coordination and control to those for which a fire department has responsibility by way of local ordinance.

S-235, sponsored by Senator James S. Cafiero (R-Cape May/Atlantic/Cumberland) and Assembly Members Nicholas Asselta (R- Cape May/Atlantic/Cumberland) and John C. Gibson (R-Cape May/Atlantic/Cumberland), would have made certain changes in the requirements for an enforcement of cancellation of mortgages of record. Currently, when a mortgage is paid and satisfied, a mortgagee (lender) must request the mortgage be canceled as of record by the county recording officer (typically the county clerk). Upon payment of the requisite fee, the county clerk marks the mortgage cancelled and returns a copy to the mortgage. The would have placed additional requirements upon the mortgagee/lender by mandating that the lender send the borrower the following three items at the same time the lender requests the mortgage cancellation from the county clerk: (1) the original mortgage noted marked "paid in full."; (2) a copy of the mortgage marked "canceled"; and (3) a copy of the mortgagee's letter to the county recording officer requesting that the mortgage be canceled of record.

In her conditional veto, the Governor said ensuring that New Jersey citizens and their families will be free from unwarranted clouds on the titles to their property is a worthy goal. However, she said, several financial institutions, lending institutions and the New Jersey State Bar Association have expressed concern that this bill will place New Jersey in a unique position by requiring lenders to send copies of canceled mortgages and original promissory notes to borrowers.

The Governor recommended the deletion of the requirement that mortgagees forward mortgagors with the original note and a copy of the mortgage marked canceled. She recommended retaining the requirement that mortgagees forward to mortgagors copies of their transmittal letters requesting cancellation of mortgages by county recording officers.
