The committee amended the bill to:

 redesignate the body responsible for reporting to the Commissioner of Health and Senior Services on the development and operation of the Prostate Cancer Awareness, Education and Research Program as a task force, rather than an advisory commission, which is to be allocated within the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research;

- provide that the appointment of the 10 public members of the task force shall be made by the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research, rather than by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate;
- stipulate that of the task force members appointed by the President of the Senate and Speaker of the General Assembly, respectively, one of the two appointments in each House shall be made upon the recommendation of the Minority Leader of that House;
- allocate the \$150,000 appropriation for patient education and screening for minority groups to the Office of Minority Health in the Department of Health and Senior Services for that purpose; and
- direct the task force to seek and accept donations of funds and services for the support of its activities.

As reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 1039 (2R) (Singer/Bassano), which is currently pending before the Senate.

### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS**

Amendments to the bill (1) redesignates the body responsible for reporting to the Commisioner on the development and operation of the prostate cancer program as a "task force", rather than an "advisory commission", (2) allocate the task force within the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research, (3) provide that the appointment of the 10 public members of the task force shall be made by the commission, rather than by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate, and (4) direct the task force to seek and accept donations of funds and services for the support of its activities.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

This bill appropriates \$1 million from the General Fund to effectuate the purposes of the legislation.

### ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 2055 (First Reprint)

To the General Assembly:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14 of the New Jersey Constitution, I am returning Assembly Bill No. 2055 (First Reprint) with my recommendations for reconsideration.

### A. Summary of Bill

This bill establishes a Prostate Cancer Awareness, Education and Research Program in the Department of Health and Senior Services ("DHSS") to provide support for prostate cancer medical research, physician education and awareness, and patient education and screening services, particularly for members of minority groups. The bill also creates a 15-member Prostate Cancer Task Force ("Task Force") within the New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research (the "Commission"). Under the bill, the Task Force would advise the Commission regarding the development, operation and evaluation of the Prostate Cancer Awareness, Education and Research Program. Additionally, the bill appropriates \$1,000,000 from the General Fund to the DHSS to be allocated as follows: \$600,000 for prostate cancer medical research; \$150,000 for physician education and awareness; and \$250,000 for patient education and screening services, of which \$100,000 is allocated for patient education and screening for minority groups. The bill also allows the Task Force to apply for and accept appropriate gifts, grants and donations of services.

### Recommended Action

I am advised that cancer is the second leading cause of death in New Jersey. Cancer is not one disease, but a group of diseases characterized by uncontrolled cell growth. In 1996, over 18,000 people died of cancer and 40,010 cases of invasive cancer were diagnosed among New Jersey residents. Prostate cancer is the third leading cause of cancer death among men in New Jersey, behind lung and colon/rectal cancer, claiming over 1100 lives in 1996. This disease strikes particularly hard at African-American men, whose mortality rate is over two times higher than the mortality rate for white men. Lung cancer is the leading cause of death among New Jersey women, followed by breast cancer and then colon/rectal cancer.

Given these numbers, it is imperative that we accelerate our already substantial efforts to improve the prevention and treatment for all forms of cancer, including prostate cancer. I commend the sponsors for their leadership in this effort, however, this matter has encouraged me to look at broader efforts regarding cancer research and prevention. To ensure a comprehensive approach to cancer research and education, I return this bill with my recommendation for reconsideration.

To be successful in our efforts to combat cancer, those efforts must be fully integrated. Even though lung, prostate, breast, cervical and colon/rectal cancer have different risk factors and intervention strategies, these are all forms of cancer that can, in many cases, be prevented or treated if diagnosed early. For this reason, the federal Centers for Disease Control ("CDC") are encouraging states to develop integrated cancer control strategies designed to make progress on many cancer fronts simultaneously, and the DHSS has begun developing such strategies in concert with a coalition of partners. By focusing exclusively on specific forms of cancer, we miss important opportunities to develop integrated research and early detection strategies. Accordingly, I recommend that the focus of the bill be broadened to apply to general cancer research and education to permit the DHSS to pursue an integrated approach that both recognizes the unique biological features of prostate cancer, and allows the development of integrated strategies.

Additionally, I recommend that the Prostate Cancer Task Force created by the bill as part of the Commission be eliminated. The Commission already has a prostate cancer advisory group to assist in identifying research needs, shape requests for proposals for research projects, and review applications for funding. Further, the Commission currently has the means to solicit expert advice, seek public input, and augment the advisory group as necessary to assist in addressing cancer research and prevention needs. The creation of another body to perform substantially the same functions as those presently performed by the Commission and the DHSS is not necessary and would needlessly increase costs and potentially cause confusion or conflict among the DHSS, the Commission and the existing advisory group. I therefore recommend that the provisions of the bill creating the Task Force be deleted.

Further, the FY2000 budget includes a new appropriation of \$2.7 million in new money for an expanded Cancer Screening, Education and Outreach Initiative. This initiative is intended to reduce the disparity in cancer morbidity and mortality by providing additional cancer screening services to high-risk populations, especially African Americans, who have either no health insurance or limited coverage. Approximately \$1 million of this amount is earmarked for prostate cancer screening, outreach and educational services for men over the age of 50, with special emphasis on African American men age 40 years and older. In light of that substantial commitment to prostate cancer screening, outreach and education, I recommend that the appropriation of \$150,000 for physician education and awareness, and \$250,000 for patient education and screening services be removed from the bill. Additionally, I recommend that the remaining \$600,000 appropriated by the bill be dedicated to cancer research. Of that amount, I recommend that \$250,000 be dedicated specifically to prostate cancer research. This recommended appropriation allocation effectively coordinates existing resources with the new appropriation made by the bill.

Finally, the bill would require that New Jersey's prostate cancer awareness education and research program comport with CDC recommendations. That restriction would limit the ability of the Commission and DHSS to direct education and screening services to at-risk populations that are beyond CDC's recommendations. Accordingly, I recommend that this provision be deleted so as to permit flexibility in administering these programs.

Therefore, I herewith return Assembly Bill No. 2055 (First Reprint) and recommend that it be amended as follows:

other form of cancer."
