1 **AN ACT** concerning the registration of certain motor vehicles and amending R.S.39:3-8 and P.L.1968, c.439.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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1. R.S.39:3-8 is amended to read as follows:

8 The applicant for registration for any passenger 9 automobile manufactured in any model year prior to the 1971 model 10 year shall pay to the director for each registration a fee of [\$14.00] \$14 for each such vehicle having a manufacturer's shipping weight of 11 less than 2,700 pounds, a fee of [\$23.00] \$23 for each such vehicle 12 13 having a manufacturer's shipping weight of 2,700 pounds or more, but 14 not greater than 3,800 pounds, and a fee of [\$44.00] \$44 for each 15 vehicle having a manufacturer's shipping weight in excess of 3,800 pounds; provided, however, an applicant who has been issued a 16 handicapped person identification card pursuant to section 2 of 17 P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-205) and is registering a private passenger 18 19 van manufactured in any model year prior to the 1971 model year 20 which has been equipped with a wheelchair lift for the handicapped, or any other specially designed mechanical device for the handicapped as 21 designated by the director ¹that specifically requires installation only 22 in a private passenger van because of the device's dimensions, 23 24 operating characteristics or manufacturer's installation requirements¹, 25 shall pay a fee of \$14 for that vehicle. The applicant for registration 26 for any passenger automobile manufactured in model year 1971 and 27 thereafter, except as determined hereinafter, shall pay to the director for each registration a fee of [\$17.00] \$17 for each such vehicle 28 29 having a manufacturer's shipping weight of less than 2,700 pounds, a fee of [\$28.00] \$28 for each such vehicle having a manufacturer's 30 shipping weight of 2,700 pounds or more, but not greater than 3,800 31 32 pounds, and a fee of [\$51.00] \$51 for each such vehicle having a 33 manufacturer's shipping weight in excess of 3,800 pounds; provided, 34 however, an applicant who has been issued a handicapped person identification card pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-35 36 205) and is registering a private passenger van manufactured in model 37 year 1971 or thereafter, except as determined hereinafter, which has 38 been equipped with a wheelchair lift for the handicapped, or any other 39 specially designed mechanical device for the handicapped as

designated by the director ¹that specifically requires installation only 1 2 in a private passenger van because of the device's dimensions, 3 operating characteristics or manufacturer's installation requirements¹, 4 shall pay a fee of \$17 for that vehicle. The applicant for registration 5 for any 1980 or thereafter model year passenger automobile registered 6 on or after March 1, 1979 shall pay to the director for each 7 registration a fee of [\$25.00] \$25 for each such vehicle having a 8 manufacturer's shipping weight not greater than 3,500 pounds and a 9 fee of **[**\$50.00**]** \$50 for each vehicle having a manufacturer's shipping 10 weight in excess of 3,500 pounds; provided, however, an applicant 11 who has been issued a handicapped person identification card pursuant 12 to section 2 of P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-205) and is registering any 13 1980 or thereafter model year private passenger van which has been 14 equipped with a wheelchair lift for the handicapped, or any other specially designed mechanical device for the handicapped as 15 designated by the director ¹that specifically requires installation only 16 in a private passenger van because of the device's dimensions, 17 18 operating characteristics or manufacturer's installation requirements ¹, 19 shall pay a fee of \$25 for that vehicle. The director shall determine 20 manufacturer's shipping weight and model year for each passenger 21 automobile on the basis of the information contained in the certificate 22 of origin, the application for registration or for renewal of registration, 23 or the records of the division, or any or all of these; and any case in 24 which the manufacturer's shipping weight of any particular passenger 25 automobile is unavailable, or in doubt or dispute, the director may 26 require that such automobile be weighed on a scale designated by him, 27 and such actual weight shall be considered the manufacturer's shipping 28 weight for the purposes of this section; but in all cases the director's 29 determination of the manufacturer's shipping weight of any such 30 automobile shall be final. The applicant for registration for passenger 31 automobile shall also pay to the director the inspection fee fixed in 32 R.S.39:8-2 in addition to the fees described hereinabove. 33

The director may also license private utility and house type semitrailers and trailers with a gross load not in excess of 2,000 pounds at a fee of \$4.00 per annum and all other such utility and house-type semitrailers and trailers at \$9.00 per annum. Application for such registration shall be made on a blank to be furnished by the division and the application shall contain a statement to the effect that the vehicle so registered will not be used for the commercial transportation of goods, wares and merchandise, or for hire.

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Except as provided in R.S.39:3-84 for recreation vehicles, no private utility or house type semitrailer or trailer with an outside width of more than 96 inches, a maximum height of 13 feet 6 inches, a maximum length for a single vehicle of more than 35 feet, a maximum length for a semitrailer and its towing vehicle of more than 45 feet, and a maximum length for a trailer and its towing vehicle of more than 50

1 feet, shall be operated on any highway in this State, except that a 2 vehicle exceeding the above limitations may be operated when a 3 special permit so to operate is secured in advance from the director. 4 A house type semitrailer or trailer with an outside width of no more 5 than 16 feet shall be entitled to operate with such a special permit if 6 the vehicle is a manufactured home on a transportation system that is 7 designed in accordance with the "Manufactured Home Construction 8 and Safety Standards," 24 CFR part 3280.901 et seq., promulgated by 9 the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, as 10 amended and supplemented, provided that the operator complies with the provisions of this Title and the rules and regulations issued 11 12 thereunder. If such a vehicle has an outside width of more than 13 16 feet, it shall be entitled to operate with such a special permit if it is 14 transported on a commercial type low-bed trailer, semitrailer or properly registered dolly wheels pursuant to rules and regulations 15 established by the director. The application for such permit shall be 16 accompanied by a fee fixed by the director. A special permit issued by 17 18 the director shall be in the possession of the operator of the vehicle for which such permit was issued. In computing any dimensions of a 19 20 vehicle, for the purposes of this section, there shall not be included in 21 the dimensional limitations safety equipment such as mirrors or lights, 22 provided such appliances do not exceed the overall limitations 23 established by the director by rule or regulation. 24 (cf: P.L.1998, c.135, s.1)

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2. Section 2 of P.L.1968, c. 439 (C.39:3-8.1) is amended to read as follows:

28 2. The director may license noncommercial trucks at the same 29 weight fees set forth in Revised Statutes 39:3-20; provided, however, 30 applicants for registration who have been issued handicapped person 31 identification cards pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-32 205) and are registering a noncommercial truck which has been 33 equipped with a wheelchair lift for the handicapped, or any other 34 specially designed mechanical device for the handicapped as designated by the director ¹that specifically requires installation only 35 36 in a noncommercial truck or van because of the device's dimensions, 37 operating characteristics or manufacturer's installation requirements ¹, 38 shall pay the same weight fees set forth in R.S.39:3-8 for similarly 39 modified passenger automobiles of the same model year. Application 40 for such registration shall be made on a form to be furnished by the 41 division and the application shall contain a statement to the effect that 42 the vehicle so registered will not be used for the commercial 43 transportation of goods, wares and merchandise, or for hire, and that 44 vehicles so registered will not contain any advertising, signs, lettering, 45 names or addresses on its exterior, excepting trademarks and labels of 46 the manufacturer and dealer.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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1. R.S.39:3-8 is amended to read as follows:

8 39:3-8. The applicant for registration for any passenger automobile 9 manufactured in any model year prior to the 1971 model year shall pay 10 to the director for each registration a fee of [\$14.00] \$14 for each 11 such vehicle having a manufacturer's shipping weight of less than 12 2,700 pounds, a fee of [\$23.00] \$23 for each such vehicle having a manufacturer's shipping weight of 2,700 pounds or more, but not 13 greater than 3,800 pounds, and a fee of [\$44.00] \$44 for each vehicle 14 having a manufacturer's shipping weight in excess of 3,800 pounds; 15 16 provided, however, an applicant who has been issued a handicapped 17 person identification card pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1949, c.280 18 (C.39:4-205) and is registering a passenger automobile manufactured 19 in any model year prior to the 1971 model year which has been 20 modified so that the automobile is fully controlled by specially 21 designed mechanical devices for the handicapped shall pay a fee of \$14 22 for that vehicle. STATEMENT

This bill addresses an inequity that exists under current law for handicapped persons who operate specially modified passenger automobiles and noncommercial trucks. These vehicles tend to be heavy, and thus, are subject to high registration fees. Under this bill, a handicapped person would pay the minimum model year registration fee for a passenger automobile or noncommercial truck, regardless of the vehicle's weight. A noncommercial truck is a motor vehicle other than a commercial vehicle that is designed to transport property.

Under current law, registration fees for passenger automobiles are set according to the model year and the weight of the vehicle. The registration fee for a vehicle manufactured prior to the 1971 model year is \$14 if the manufacturer's shipping weight of the vehicle is less than 2,700 pounds, \$23 if the weight is 2,700 pounds or more, but 3,800 pounds or less, and \$44 if the weight is more than 3,800 pounds. The registration fee for a vehicle manufactured in model year 1971 or later, but before model year 1980, is \$17 if the shipping weight is less than 2,700 pounds, \$28 if the weight is 2,700 pounds or more, but 3,800 pounds or less and \$51 if the weight exceeds 3,800 pounds. The fee for registering a vehicle manufactured in model year 1980 or later is \$25 if the vehicle is 3,500 pounds or less and \$50 if it is more than 3,500 pounds.

Registration fees for noncommercial trucks under current law are based solely on the weight of the vehicle. The registration fee for these trucks is \$53.50 if it weighs 5,000 pounds or less. If the truck weighs more than 5,000 pounds, but not more than 18,000 pounds, the fee is \$53.50 plus \$11.50 for each 1,000 pounds or portion thereof in excess of 5,000 pounds. The fee for trucks that weigh more than 18,000 pounds, but not more than 50,000 pounds, is \$53.50, plus \$12.50 for every 1,000 pounds over 5,000. The fee is \$53.50 plus \$13.50 for each 1,000 pounds over 5,000 for trucks that weigh more than 50,000 pounds.

Under the bill, the registration fee for passenger automobiles and noncommercial trucks which have been modified so that they are fully controlled by specially designed mechanical devices for the handicapped and which are being registered by persons who have been issued a handicapped person identification card would be \$14 if the vehicle was manufactured in a model year prior to 1971, \$17 if the vehicle's model year is 1971 or later, but earlier than 1980, and \$25 if the model year is 1980 or later. These fees would be applicable to all such vehicles of the specified model years, irrespective of their weight. Handicapped person identification cards are issued to persons who

Handicapped person identification cards are issued to persons who have lost a limb, are permanently disabled or have limited mobility as certified by a physician. The card holder is issued a special placard to be displayed in his or her vehicle indicating that the vehicle may be parked in special parking places designated for use by the handicapped. The card holder also may obtain special wheelchair symbol license plates.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1345 with committee amendments.

Senate Bill No. 1345 SCS, as amended, revises the law governing motor vehicle registration fees as it applies to handicapped persons who operate private passenger vans and noncommercial trucks equipped with certain modifications for their use of those vehicles. (A noncommercial truck is a motor vehicle other than a commercial vehicle that is designed to transport property.) Vehicles so equipped tend to be heavy and, under the weight-based schedules now in effect, are subject to high registration fees. Under the bill, a handicapped person operating one of these vehicles would pay the minimum model year registration fee for a passenger automobile or noncommercial truck, regardless of the vehicle's weight.

Under current law, registration fees for passenger automobiles are set according to the model year and the weight of the vehicle. The registration fee for a passenger automobile manufactured prior to the 1971 model year is \$14 if the manufacturer's shipping weight of the vehicle is less than 2,700 pounds, rising to \$44 if the weight is more than 3,800 pounds. The registration fee for a passenger automobile manufactured in model year 1971 or later, but before model year 1980, is \$17 if the shipping weight is less than 2,700 pounds, rising to \$51 if the weight exceeds 3,800 pounds. The fee for registering a passenger automobile manufactured in model year 1980 or later is \$25 if the vehicle weight is 3,500 pounds or less and \$50 if it is more than 3,500 pounds.

For noncommercial trucks, registration fees are based solely on the weight of the vehicle. The registration fee for one of these trucks is \$53.50 if it weighs 5,000 pounds or less. For each 1,000 pounds (or portion thereof) over 5,000 pounds an additional fee is imposed at a rate that increases with overall tonnage; for trucks that weigh more than 50,000 pounds, the total fee is \$53.50 plus \$13.50 for each 1,000 pounds over 5,000.

Under the bill, the registration fee for a private passenger van or noncommercial truck that (1) has been equipped with a wheelchair lift, or any other specially designed mechanical device for the handicapped that specifically requires installation in an oversized vehicle because of the device's dimensions, operating characteristics, or manufacturer's installation requirements and is designated by the director of the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV), and (2) is registered by a person who has been issued a handicapped person identification card would be \$14 if the vehicle was manufactured in a model year prior to 1971, \$17 if the vehicle's model year is 1971 or later, but earlier than 1980, and \$25 if the model year is 1980 or later. These fees would be applicable to all such vehicles of the specified model years, irrespective of their weight.

Handicapped person identification cards are issued to persons who have lost a limb, are permanently disabled or have limited mobility as certified by a physician. The card holder is issued a special placard to be displayed in his or her vehicle indicating that the vehicle may be parked in special parking places designated for use by the handicapped. The card holder also may obtain special wheelchair symbol license plates.

As amended and reported by this committee, the bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2920 as amended and reported by this committee.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The DMV has indicated that it has no estimate of the number of vehicles that this bill would impact. Consequently, the Office of Legislative Services (OLS) cannot quantify the loss of revenue to the State by requiring that only the minimum vehicle registration fee would be levied on certain vehicles owned by handicapped persons rather than the amounts stipulated in current law.

In addition to the loss of revenue, DMV also anticipates that it would incur a computer programming cost to establish a new category of registration fees. However, as the Office of Telecommunications and Information Systems has not yet developed a cost estimate for DMV for the establishment of this new registration category, OLS is unable to provide an estimate on this new, one-time cost.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The amendments provide that the specially designed device for the handicapped must be installed in a passenger van or noncommercial truck because the design requirements of the device require an oversized vehicle, clarifying the intent to provide the lower registration fees for those whose needs cannot be accommodated by a passenger automobile.

The Senate Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1345.

This bill addresses an inequity that exists under current law for handicapped persons who operate specially modified passenger automobiles and noncommercial trucks. These vehicles tend to be heavy, and thus, are subject to high registration fees. Under this bill, a handicapped person would pay the minimum model year registration fee for a passenger automobile or noncommercial truck, regardless of the vehicle's weight. A noncommercial truck is a motor vehicle other than a commercial vehicle that is designed to transport property.

Under current law, registration fees for passenger automobiles are set according to the model year and the weight of the vehicle. The registration fee for a vehicle manufactured prior to the 1971 model year is \$14 if the manufacturer's shipping weight of the vehicle is less than 2,700 pounds, \$23 if the weight is 2,700 pounds or more, but 3,800 pounds or less, and \$44 if the weight is more than 3,800 pounds. The registration fee for a vehicle manufactured in model year 1971 or later, but before model year 1980, is \$17 if the shipping weight is less than 2,700 pounds, \$28 if the weight is 2,700 pounds or more, but 3,800 pounds or less and \$51 if the weight exceeds 3,800 pounds. Under the bill, the registration fee for passenger automobiles and noncommercial trucks which have been modified so that they are fully controlled by specially designed mechanical devices for the handicapped and which are being registered by persons who have been issued a handicapped person identification card would be \$14 if the vehicle was manufactured in a model year prior to 1971, \$17 if the vehicle's model year is 1971 or later, but earlier than 1980, and \$25 if the model year is 1980 or later. These fees would be applicable to all such vehicles of the specified model years, irrespective of their weight.

Handicapped person identification cards are issued to persons who have lost a limb, are permanently disabled or have limited mobility as certified by a physician. The card holder is issued a special placard to be displayed in his or her vehicle indicating that the vehicle may be parked in special parking places designated for use by the handicapped. The card holder also may obtain special wheelchair symbol license plates.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably a committee substitute for Senate Bill No. 1345.

This substitute bill revises the law governing motor vehicle registration fees as it applies to handicapped persons who operate private passenger vans and noncommercial trucks equipped with certain modifications for their use of those vehicles. (A noncommercial truck is a motor vehicle other than a commercial vehicle that is designed to transport property.) Vehicles so equipped tend to be heavy and thus, under the weight-based schedules now in effect, are subject to high registration fees. Under this bill, a handicapped person operating one of these vehicles would pay the minimum model year registration fee for a passenger automobile or noncommercial truck, regardless of the vehicle's weight.

Under current law, registration fees for passenger automobiles are set according to the model year and the weight of the vehicle. The registration fee for a passenger automobile manufactured prior to the 1971 model year is \$14 if the manufacturer's shipping weight of the vehicle is less than 2,700 pounds, rising to \$44 if the weight is more than 3,800 pounds. The registration fee for a passenger automobile manufactured in model year 1971 or later, but before model year 1980, is \$17 if the shipping weight is less than 2,700 pounds, rising to \$51 if the weight exceeds 3,800 pounds. The fee for registering a passenger automobile manufactured in model year 1980 or later is \$25 if the vehicle weight is 3,500 pounds or less and \$50 if it is more than 3,500 pounds.

For noncommercial trucks, registration fees are based solely on the weight of the vehicle. The registration fee for one of these trucks is \$53.50 if it weighs 5,000 pounds or less. For each 1,000 pounds (or portion thereof) over 5,000 pounds an additional fee is imposed at a rate that increases with overall tonnage; for trucks that weigh more than 50,000 pounds, the total fee is \$53.50 plus \$13.50 for each 1,000 pounds over 5,000.

Under the bill, the registration fee for a private passenger van or noncommercial truck that (1) has been equipped with a wheelchair lift, or any other specially designed mechanical device for the handicapped as designated by the director of the Division of Motor Vehicles, and (2) is registered by a person who has been issued a handicapped person identification card would be \$14 if the vehicle was manufactured in a model year prior to 1971, \$17 if the vehicle's model year is 1971 or later, but earlier than 1980, and \$25 if the model year is 1980 or later. These fees would be applicable to all such vehicles of the specified model years, irrespective of their weight.

Handicapped person identification cards are issued to persons who have lost a limb, are permanently disabled or have limited mobility as certified by a physician. The card holder is issued a special placard to be displayed in his or her vehicle indicating that the vehicle may be parked in special parking places designated for use by the handicapped. The registration fee for a vehicle manufactured in model year 1971 or later, but before model year 1980, is \$17 if the shipping weight is less than 2,700 pounds, \$28 if the weight is 2,700 pounds or more, but 3,800 pounds or less and \$51 if the weight exceeds 3,800 pounds. The fee for registering a vehicle manufactured in model year 1980 or later is \$25 if the vehicle is 3,500 pounds or less and \$50 if it is more than 3,500 pounds.

Registration fees for noncommercial trucks under current law are based solely on the weight of the vehicle. The registration fee for these trucks is \$53.50 if it weighs 5,000 pounds or less. If the truck weighs more than 5,000 pounds, but not more than 18,000 pounds, the fee is \$53.50 plus \$11.50 for each 1,000 pounds or portion thereof in excess of 5,000 pounds. Trucks that weigh more than 18,000 pounds pay proportionally higher rates.

Under this bill, the registration fee for private passenger vans and noncommercial trucks which have been equipped with wheelchair lifts and which are being registered by persons who have been issued a handicapped person identification card would be assessed the minimum statutory amount charged private passenger automobile registrants. For example, if the vehicle was manufactured in a model year prior to 1971, the fee would be \$14; if the vehicle's model year is 1971 or

later, but earlier than 1980, it would be \$17; and if the model year is 1980 or later, the fee would be \$25. These fees would be applicable to all such vehicles of the specified model years, irrespective of their weight.

Handicapped person identification cards are issued to persons who have lost a limb, are permanently disabled or have limited mobility as certified by a physician. The card holder is issued a special placard to be displayed in his or her vehicle indicating that the vehicle may be parked in special parking places designated for use by the handicapped. The card holder also may obtain special wheelchair symbol license plates.

Assembly Bill No. 2920 of 1999 provides that a handicapped person issued an identification card pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-205) who registers a passenger van or a noncommercial truck would pay the statutory minimum fee of \$14 if the vehicle was manufactured in a model year prior to 1971, \$17 if the vehicle's model year is 1971 to 1979, and \$25 if the model year is 1980 or later. Currently, depending on the weight and year of a vehicle, vehicle registration fees can be as high as \$51 for passenger vehicles and \$53.50 or more for noncommercial trucks.

The Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) has indicated that it has no estimate of the number of vehicles that this bill would impact. Consequently, the Office of Legislative Services (OLS) cannot quantify the loss of revenue to the State by requiring that only the minimum vehicle registration fee would be levied on certain vehicles owned by handicapped persons rather than the amounts stipulated in current law.

In addition to the loss of revenue, DMV also anticipates that it would incur a computer programming cost to establish a new category of registration fees. However, since the Office of Information Technology has not yet developed a cost estimate for DMV for the establishment of this new registration category, OLS is unable to provide an estimate on this new, one-time cost.

This legislative fiscal estimate has been produced by the Office of Legislative Services due to the failure of the Executive Branch to respond to our request for a fiscal note.
