This bill, as amended by the committee, allows the State Board of Mortuary Science of New Jersey to issue a practitioner of mortuary science license to an applicant who holds a valid license or certification in another state or possession of the United States or the District of Columbia with education and experience requirements substantially equivalent to those of this State if the applicant has been engaged in the practice of mortuary science in that jurisdiction for two years immediately prior to application and has successfully completed the law portion of the examination conducted by the board.
