1. R.S.23:4-55 is amended to read as follows:

8 23:4-55. No person shall [sell,] trap, take, capture, kill or have in 9 possession [after the same has been trapped, taken, captured or 10 killed, a beaver [, and no person shall have in his possession or sell 11 a raw pelt of a beaver, whether caught within or without the jurisdictional limits of this State, unless the same has been tagged by 12 the regular salaried fish and game warden of the county wherein such 13 pelt is had in possession, or sale is to be made, and no person shall set 14 15 a trap within 20 feet of any beaver lodge or beaver dam, except persons holding permits as hereinafter prescribed in this section, under 16 17 a penalty of \$100.00 for each beaver so trapped, taken, sold, captured, 18 killed or had in possession or for the violation of any other provision 19 of this section; provided, that the Division of Fish and Game may issue 20 permits up to and not exceeding 100 in any 1 calendar year to bona 21 fide residents of the State to trap not more than the number of beaver 22 permitted], except as authorized by a valid permit at a time and in a manner prescribed by the State Fish and Game Code [during the 23 24 period permitted therefor by said code; or, in 1. In the absence of 25 [such] provisions for a season and limit in [said] the code, [not more than 5 beaver between February 1 and February 28. 1 the season shall 26 27 be January 15 through and including February 15 of each year, and the 28 season limit shall be five beavers per permit. Permits shall expire on the last day of the open season. The Division of Fish, Game and 29 30 Wildlife may issue up to and not exceeding 200 permits in any one 31 <u>calendar year.</u> The fee for this permit [shall be \$5.00, and no beaver 32 or raw pelt of same taken under this permit shall be sold without first 33 having been tagged by the warden above referred to, under a penalty of \$100.00 for each offense. **]** is \$15.00. The Senate Economic Growth Agriculture and Tourism Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2156.

This bill increases the number of beaver trapping permits that may be issued by the Division of Fish, Game and Wildlife each calender year. Currently the number of permits is set at 100 and this bill increases that to 200. The bill also provides that the season, manner of taking beaver and limit on the number of beavers taken shall be prescribed by the State Fish and Game code. In the absence of a set season and of limits on the number of beavers to be taken per season in the code, this bill provides that the season will be from January 15 through and including February 15 each year, and that the season limit will be 5 beavers per permit. The bill provides that a permit will cost \$15, which is an increase from the current statutory cost of \$5, and would expire on the last day of the season. The penalty for violations would be a fine of not less than \$100 and not more than \$200. The bill also authorizes the Division to issue permits to owners or lessees of land, whether it is under cultivation or not, to control beavers that are destroying their property. Current law authorizes the Division to issue a permit only if the land is under cultivation.
