1 AN ACT concerning the administration of epinephrine², amending
2 P.L.1992, c.143² and supplementing chapter 2K of Title 26 of the
3 Revised Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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1. ²(New section)² As used in this act:

9 "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Health and Senior 10 Services;

"Emergency medical service" means a program in a hospital staffed 24 hours-a-day by a licensed physician trained in emergency medicine;

"Emergency medical technician" means a person trained in basic life support services as defined in section 1 of P.L.1985, c.351 (C.26:2K-21) and who is certified by the Department of Health and Senior Services to provide that level of care.

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- 2. ²(New section)² a. An emergency medical technician who has been certified by the commissioner pursuant to subsection b. of this section to administer an epinephrine auto-injector device shall administer, maintain and dispose of the device in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the commissioner.
- Each administration of an auto-injector device pursuant to this act shall be reported to the Department of Health and Senior Services in a manner determined by the commissioner.
- b. The commissioner shall establish written standards and 26 27 application procedures which an emergency medical technician shall meet in order to obtain certification. The commissioner shall certify 28 a candidate who: provides evidence of satisfactory completion of an 29 30 educational program which is approved by the commissioner and 31 includes training in the administration of epinephrine auto-injector 32 devices; and passes an examination in the administration of the devices which is approved by the commissioner. 33
- c. The commissioner shall maintain a registry of all ²[applications for certification] persons certified pursuant to this section, which shall include, but not be limited to:

- (1) the ²person's² name and residence ²[of the applicant]²; ²and²
 - (2) the date ²[of the application; and
- (3) whether the applicant was rejected or approved and the date of that action] that certification was granted².
- d. The commissioner shall annually compile a list of emergency medical technicians who have obtained certification to administer an epinephrine auto-injector device pursuant to this section, which shall be available to the public.
- e. A fee may be charged to a person enrolled in an educational program approved by the department which includes training in the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector device in order to cover the cost of training and testing for certification pursuant to this section², if the entity that provides the educational program is not reimbursed for the cost of that training and testing from the "Emergency Medical Technician Training Fund" established pursuant to section 3 of P.L.1992, c.143 (C.26:2K-56)².

3. ²(New section)² Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the contrary, an emergency medical technician, first aid, ambulance or rescue squad, or other entity employing the services of an emergency medical technician certified to administer an epinephrine auto-injector device pursuant to section 2 of this act may purchase, store or transport the devices pursuant to an agreement with an emergency medical service, a hospital or a State licensed physician trained in emergency medicine, for the purpose of providing basic life support services as defined in section 1 of P.L.1985, c.351 (C.26:2K-21).

4. ²(New section)² The commissioner, after notice and hearing, may revoke the certification granted pursuant to section 2 of this act for a violation of any provision of this act or any rule or regulation adopted by the commissioner pursuant to this act.

5. ²(New section)² A person shall not advertise or disseminate information to the public that the person is certified to use an epinephrine auto-injector device unless the person is authorized to do so pursuant to this act.

6. ²(New section)² An emergency medical technician certified to administer an epinephrine auto-injector device pursuant to section 2 of this act, licensed physician, hospital or its board of trustees, officers and members of the medical staff, nurses, paramedics or other employees of the hospital, or officers and members of a first aid, ambulance or rescue squad shall not be liable for any civil damages as the result of an act or the omission of an act committed while in training to administer, or in the administration of, the device in good

faith and in accordance with the provisions of this act.

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7. ²(New section)² A person who violates the provisions of this act is liable to a penalty of \$200 for the first offense and \$500 for each subsequent offense. If the violation of this act is of a continuing nature, each day during which it continues shall constitute a separate offense for the purposes of this section. The penalty shall be collected and enforced by summary proceedings under the "Penalty Enforcement Law of 1999," P.L.1999, c.274 (C.2A:58-10 et seq.).

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- 8. ²(New section)² Nothing in this act shall be construed to:
- a. permit a person certified to administer an epinephrine autoinjector device pursuant to section 2 of this act to perform the duties or fill the position of another health care professional employed by a hospital:
- b. interfere with an emergency service training program authorized and operated under the provisions of the "New Jersey Highway Traffic Safety Act of 1987," P.L.1987, c.284 (C.27:5F-18 et seq.);
- c. prohibit the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector device by a person acting pursuant to a lawful prescription; or
- d. prevent a licensed and qualified member of a health care profession from administering an epinephrine auto-injector device if the duties are consistent with the accepted standards of the member's profession.

The Assembly Health and Human Services Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 341 (1R).

As amended by the committee, this bill provides for the training and certification of emergency medical technicians (EMTs) in the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector device. Each administration of an epinephrine auto-injector device under the provisions of this bill must be reported to the Department of Health and Senior Services.

The bill directs the Commissioner of Health and Senior Services to establish the written standards and procedures that an EMT must meet in order to obtain certification. A candidate for certification is required to: provide evidence of satisfactory completion of an educational program which is approved by the commissioner and includes training in the administration of epinephrine auto-injector devices; and pass an examination approved by the commissioner. The bill also requires the commissioner to maintain a registry of all persons certified to administer epinephrine auto-injector devices pursuant to the bill, and to compile a list of persons who have obtained certification that will be made available to the public.

The bill permits the use of monies in the "Emergency Medical Technician Training Fund" (EMTTF) to reimburse an entity which provides an educational program in the administration of epinephrine auto-injector devices that is approved by the commissioner pursuant to this bill, and for which that entity is not otherwise reimbursed. The bill provides that a fee may be charged to an enrollee in a training program in order to cover the cost of training and testing for certification, if the entity providing the program is not reimbursed for the cost of that training and testing from the EMTTF.

In addition, the bill provides that:

- -- the commissioner may revoke certification for violations of the bill;
- -- a person may not advertise that he is certified to administer an epinephrine auto-injector device unless authorized to do so;

- -- there will be no liability to an EMT certified to administer an epinephrine auto-injector device pursuant to the bill, or to a licensed physician, hospital or its board of trustees, officers and members of the medical staff, nurses, paramedics or other employees of the hospital, or officers and members of a first aid, ambulance or rescue squad for any civil damages as the result of an act or the omission of an act committed while in training to administer, or in the administration of, the device;
- -- a person who violates the provisions of the bill is liable to a penalty of \$200 for the first offense and \$500 for each subsequent offense; and
- -- the Commissioner of Health and Senior Services is to adopt rules and regulations to effectuate the purposes of the bill, including medical protocols for the administration of epinephrine auto-injector devices, in consultation with the State mobil intensive care advisory council and the New Jersey State First Aid Council, Inc.

Finally, the bill includes a delayed effective date (the 120th day after enactment) to permit time for the adoption of regulations to implement its provisions.

As reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 667 Aca (Chatzidakis/Bodine/Vandervalk), which the committee also reported on this date.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The committee amendments to the bill:

- C require the Commissioner of Health and Senior Services to maintain a registry of all persons certified to administer epinephrine auto-injector devices pursuant to the bill (rather than all applicants for certification);
- C permit the use of monies in the "Emergency Medical Technician Training Fund" (which was established under N.J.S.A.26:2K-56) to reimburse an entity which provides an educational program in the administration of epinephrine auto-injector devices that is approved by the commissioner pursuant to this bill, and for which that entity is not otherwise reimbursed; and
- c require that the rules and regulations adopted by the commissioner to effectuate the purposes of this bill include medical protocols for the administration of epinephrine auto-injector devices, in consultation with the State mobil intensive care advisory council and the New Jersey State First Aid Council, Inc.

The Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments, Senate Bill No. 341.

As amended by the committee, this bill provides for the training and certification of emergency medical technicians in the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector device. Each administration of an epinephrine auto-injector device under the provisions of this bill must be reported to the Department of Health and Senior Services.

The bill provides that the Commissioner of Health and Senior Services shall establish the written standards and procedures necessary to meet in order to obtain certification. Certification shall require a candidate to: provide evidence of satisfactory completion of an educational program which is approved by the commissioner and includes training in the administration of epinephrine auto-injector devices; and pass an examination approved by the commissioner. The bill also requires the commissioner to maintain a registry of all applications for certification and compile a list of persons who have obtained certification. The bill also permits the charging of a fee for the training program in order to cover the cost of training and testing for certification.

In addition, the bill provides that:

- -- the commissioner may revoke certification for violations of the bill;
- -- a person may not advertise that he is certified to administer an epinephrine auto-injector device unless authorized to do so;
- -- there shall be no liability to an emergency medical technician certified to administer an epinephrine auto-injector device pursuant to the bill, or to a licensed physician, hospital or its board of trustees, officers and members of the medical staff, nurses, paramedics or other employees of the hospital, or officers and members of a first aid, ambulance or rescue squad for any civil damages as the result of an act or the omission of an act committed while in training to administer, or

in the administration of, the device; and

-- there is a \$200 penalty for the first offense and \$500 for each subsequent offense for violations under the bill.

Lastly, the bill has a delayed effective date to permit time for the adoption of regulations to implement the provisions of the bill.

The committee amended the bill to require that the rules and regulations adopted by the Commissioner of Health and Senior Services address age appropriateness in the administration of epinephrine.

This bill is similar to Assembly Bill No. 667 (Chatzidakis/Bodine), which is pending before the Assembly Health and Human Services Committee.

This bill was prefiled for introduction in the 2002-2003 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

An emergency medical technician certified to administer an epinephrine auto-injector device pursuant to section 2 of this act, licensed physician, hospital or its board of trustees, officers and members of the medical staff, nurses, paramedics or other employees of the hospital, or officers and members of a first aid, ambulance or rescue squad shall not be liable for any civil damages as the result of an act or the omission of an act committed while in training to administer, or in the administration of, the device in good faith and in accordance with the provisions of this act.

7. A person who violates the provisions of this act is liable to a penalty of \$200 for the first offense and \$500 for each subsequent offense. If the violation of this act is of a continuing nature, each day during which it continues shall constitute a separate offense for the purposes of this section. The penalty shall be collected and enforced by summary proceedings under the "Penalty Enforcement Law of 1999," P.L.1999, c.274 (C.2A:58-10 et seq.).

- 8. Nothing in this act shall be construed to:
- a. permit a person certified to administer an epinephrine autoinjector device pursuant to section 2 of this act to perform the duties or fill the position of another health care professional employed by a hospital;

The Assembly Health and Human Services Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 667.

As amended by the committee, this bill provides for the training and certification of emergency medical technicians (EMTs) in the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector device. Each administration of an epinephrine auto-injector device under the provisions of this bill must be reported to the Department of Health and Senior Services.

The bill directs the Commissioner of Health and Senior Services to establish the written standards and procedures that an EMT must meet in order to obtain certification. A candidate for certification is required to: provide evidence of satisfactory completion of an educational program which is approved by the commissioner and includes training in the administration of epinephrine auto-injector devices; and pass an examination approved by the commissioner. The bill also requires the commissioner to maintain a registry of all persons certified to administer epinephrine auto-injector devices pursuant to the bill, and to compile a list of persons who have obtained certification that will be made available to the public.

The bill permits the use of monies in the "Emergency Medical Technician Training Fund" (EMTTF) to reimburse an entity which provides an educational program in the administration of epinephrine auto-injector devices that is approved by the commissioner pursuant to this bill, and for which that entity is not otherwise reimbursed. The bill provides that a fee may be charged to an enrollee in a training program in order to cover the cost of training and testing for certification, if the entity providing the program is not reimbursed for the cost of that training and testing from the EMTTF.

In addition, the bill provides that:

- -- the commissioner may revoke certification for violations of the bill;
- -- a person may not advertise that he is certified to administer an epinephrine auto-injector device unless authorized to do so;
- -- there will be no liability to an EMT certified to administer an epinephrine auto-injector device pursuant to the bill, or to a licensed

physician, hospital or its board of trustees, officers and members of the medical staff, nurses, paramedics or other employees of the hospital, or officers and members of a first aid, ambulance or rescue squad for any civil damages as the result of an act or the omission of an act committed while in training to administer, or in the administration of, the device;

- -- a person who violates the provisions of the bill is liable to a penalty of \$200 for the first offense and \$500 for each subsequent offense; and
- -- the Commissioner of Health and Senior Services is to adopt rules and regulations to effectuate the purposes of the bill, including medical protocols for the administration of epinephrine auto-injector devices, in consultation with the State mobil intensive care advisory council and the New Jersey State First Aid Council, Inc.

Finally, the bill includes a delayed effective date (the 120th day after enactment) to permit time for the adoption of regulations to implement its provisions.

As reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 341 (1R) Aca (Bark/Coniglio), which the committee also reported on this date.

This bill was prefiled for introduction in the 2002-2003 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amendments to the bill:

- C require the Commissioner of Health and Senior Services to maintain a registry of all persons certified to administer epinephrine auto-injector devices pursuant to the bill (rather than all applicants for certification);
- C permit the use of monies in the "Emergency Medical Technician Training Fund" (which was established under N.J.S.A.26:2K-56) to reimburse an entity which provides an educational program in the administration of epinephrine auto-injector devices that is approved by the commissioner pursuant to this bill, and for which that entity is not otherwise reimbursed; and
- C require that the rules and regulations adopted by the commissioner to effectuate the purposes of this bill:
- -- include medical protocols for the administration of epinephrine auto-injector devices, in consultation with the State mobil intensive care advisory council and the New Jersey State First Aid Council, Inc.; and
 - -- address age appropriateness in the administration of epinephrine.
