The Assembly Regulated Professions and Independent Authorities Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 1685 (1R).

As amended, this bill amends and supplements the "Home Inspection Professional Licensing Act," P.L.1997, c.323 (C.45:8-61 et seq.).

This amended bill revises the requirements for those eligible to be grandfathered so that a person so eligible shall have been engaged in the practice of home inspections for not less than three years prior to December 31, 2003 and have performed not less than 300 home inspections for compensation prior to December 31, 2003. The bill currently requires than an individual must have either: (1) been engaged in the practice of home inspections for compensation for not less than three years prior to June 3, 2002 and performed not less than 300 home inspections for compensation prior to June 3, 2002; or (2) performed not less than 400 home inspections for compensation prior to June 3, 2002.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

- C The amendments add three members to the Home Inspection Advisory Committee, including one construction or subcode official licensed pursuant to the "State Uniform Construction Code Act," P.L.1975, c.217 (C.52:27D-119 et seq.), one licensed professional engineer and one representative of a county college or school offering a home inspection vocational training program.
- C In addition, the amendments stipulate that as a condition for biennial license renewal as a home inspector or associate home inspector, an individual shall complete 40 credit hours of continuing education. The advisory committee shall establish standards for continuing home inspection education, including the subject matter and content of courses of study and the selection of instructors, and approve programs offering continuing education credits.

- Under current law, to be eligible for licensure as a home inspector or associate home inspector an applicant is required to pass the examination offered by the American Society of Home Inspectors (ASHI). As provided in these amendments, to be eligible to be so licensed an individual would have to pass an examination administered or approved by the advisory committee.
- Current law also requires an applicant seeking licensure as a home inspector to have been engaged as a licensed associate home inspector for not less than one year, and have performed not less than 250 home inspections for compensation. The amendments provide that in order to satisfy the requirements for licensure as a home inspector, an applicant may, instead, successfully complete a course of instruction in home inspection, which shall include not less than 10 home inspections, offered by county colleges licensed by the New Jersey Commission on Higher Education or by schools approved by the New Jersey Department of Education offering vocational training programs.
- Furthermore, these amendments provide that certain building inspectors licensed in accordance with the "State Uniform Construction Code Act" shall, upon application, be issued a home inspector license under certain circumstances. To be eligible for licensure as a home inspector, the building inspector shall have a specialty in high-rise and hazardous structures (H.H.S.) or a specialty in industrial and commercial structures (I.C.S.), provided that the building inspector has not less than five years of experience relating to the construction industry, is of good moral character, has successfully completed high school or its equivalent, and has passed an examination administered or approved by the advisory committee.
- C The amendments also provide that the requirement to be licensed as a home inspector not be operative until December 31, 2003 and require the Home Inspection Advisory Committee to report annually by December 1 of each year, to the Assembly Regulated Professions and Independent Authorities Committee and the Senate Commerce Committee, or their successors, on the activities of the committee and may include in the report any recommendations for legislative action that it deems appropriate. As amended, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 567 (1R).

The Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1685.

This bill changes the "Home Inspection Professional Licensing Act," P.L.1997, c.323 (C.45:8-61 et seq.), regarding those individuals qualified to be "grandfathered" as licensed home inspectors.

The bill revises the dates, time frames, and work experience required of those eligible to be grandfathered. Under current law, the period during which a home inspector must have obtained practical experience to qualify for immediate licensure without first being an associate home inspector ended in July, 1998, the effective date of P.L.1997, c.323. Furthermore, the current law provides that a person eligible for licensure under the grandfather provision shall have been engaged in the practice of home inspections for compensation for not less than three years prior to July 1998 and shall have performed not less than 300 home inspections for compensation. This bill specifies, instead, that a person eligible for licensure under the grandfather provision shall have been engaged in the practice of home inspections for compensation for not less than three years prior to July 1, 2003 or shall have performed not less than 300 home inspections for compensation prior to July 1, 2003.

(New section) Upon payment to the board of a fee and the submission of a written application provided by the board, the committee shall issue a home inspector license to any building inspector licensed pursuant to the "State Uniform Construction Code Act," P.L.1975, c.217 (C.52:27D-119 et seq.) with a specialty in highrise and hazardous structures (H.H.S.) or a specialty in industrial and commercial structures (I.C.S.), provided that the applicant has not less than five years of experience relating to the construction industry and meets the requirements of subsections a., b., and d. of section 8 of P.L.1997, c.323 (C.45:8-68).

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8. This act shall take effect immediately.

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STATEMENT

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This bill amends and supplements the "Home Inspection Professional Licensing Act," P.L.1997, c.323 (C.45:8-61 et seq.). The bill adds three members to the Home Inspection Advisory Committee, including two construction or subcode officials licensed pursuant to the "State Uniform Construction Code Act," P.L.1975, c.217 (C.52:27D-119 et seq.), and one representative of a county college.

In addition, the bill stipulates that, as a condition for biennial license renewal as a home inspector or associate home inspector, an individual shall complete 20 credit hours of continuing education. The advisory committee shall establish standards for continued home inspection education, including the subject matter and content of courses of study and the selection of instructors, and approve programs offering continuing education credits.

Under current law, to be eligible for licensure as a home inspector or associate home inspector an applicant is required to pass the examination offered by the American Society of Home Inspectors (ASHI). As provided in this bill, to be eligible to be so licensed an individual would have to pass the examination offered by ASHI or any other examination administered or approved by the advisory committee.

Current law also requires an applicant seeking licensure as a home inspector to have been engaged as a licensed associate home inspector 44 for not less than one year, and have performed not less than 250 home inspections for compensation. This bill provides that in order to satisfy the requirements for licensure as a home inspector, an applicant

The Assembly Regulated Professions and Independent Authorities Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 567.

As amended, this bill amends and supplements the "Home Inspection Professional Licensing Act," P.L.1997, c.323 (C.45:8-61 et seq.). The bill adds three members to the Home Inspection Advisory Committee, including one construction or subcode official licensed pursuant to the "State Uniform Construction Code Act," P.L.1975, c.217 (C.52:27D-119 et seq.), one licensed professional engineer and one representative of a county college or school offering a home inspection vocational training program.

In addition, the bill stipulates that as a condition for biennial license renewal as a home inspector or associate home inspector, an individual shall complete 40 credit hours of continuing education. The advisory committee shall establish standards for continuing home inspection education, including the subject matter and content of courses of study and the selection of instructors, and approve programs offering continuing education credits.

Under current law, to be eligible for licensure as a home inspector or associate home inspector an applicant is required to pass the examination offered by the American Society of Home Inspectors (ASHI). As provided in this bill, to be eligible to be so licensed an individual would have to pass an examination administered or approved by the advisory committee.

Current law also requires an applicant seeking licensure as a home inspector to have been engaged as a licensed associate home inspector for not less than one year, and have performed not less than 250 home inspections for compensation. This bill provides that in order to satisfy the requirements for licensure as a home inspector, an applicant may, instead, successfully complete a course of instruction in home inspection, which shall include not less than 10 home inspections,

offered by county colleges licensed by the New Jersey Commission on Higher Education or by schools approved by the New Jersey Department of Education offering vocational training programs.

Furthermore, this bill provides that certain building inspectors licensed in accordance with the "State Uniform Construction Code Act" shall, upon application, be issued a home inspector license under certain circumstances. To be eligible for licensure as a home inspector, the building inspector shall have a specialty in high-rise and hazardous structures (H.H.S.) or a specialty in industrial and commercial structures (I.C.S.), provided that the building inspector has not less than five years of experience relating to the construction industry, is of good moral character, has successfully completed high school or its equivalent, and has passed an examination administered or approved by the advisory committee.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2002-2003 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

- Change the additional new membership of the Home Inspection Advisory committee to include one construction or subcode official, one licensed professional engineer and one representative of a county college or school offering a home inspection vocational training program instead of two construction or subcode officials and one representative of a county college.
- C Provide that to be eligible to be licensed as a home inspector or associate home inspector, an individual pass an examination administered or approved by the committee and thereby eliminate reference to an examination offered by the American Society of Home Inspectors (ASHI).
- C Provide that in order to satisfy the requirements for licensure as a home inspector, an applicant may, in part, complete a course of instruction in home inspection which shall include not less than 10 home inspections, rather than 50 home inspections, and that these inspections shall be under the direct, on-site supervision of licensed home inspectors rather than in the presence of these home inspectors.
- C Provide that the requirement to be licensed as a home inspector not be operative until December 31, 2003.
- C Revise the requirements for those eligible to be grandfathered so that a person so eligible shall have been engaged in the practice of home inspections for not less than three years prior to December 31, 2003 and have performed not less than 300 home inspections for compensation prior to December 31, 2003.
- C Require that, as a condition for biennial license renewal, a home inspector or associate home inspector complete 40 hours, instead of 20 hours, of continuing education.

Require the Home Inspection Advisory Committee to report annually by December 1 of each year, to the Assembly Regulated Professions and Independent Authorities Committee, or their successors, on the activities of the committee and may include in the report any recommendations for legislative action that it deems appropriate.
