a. Morristown Memorial Hospital currently offers the full array of services for, and meets all of the licensure criteria that apply to, a children's hospital, and has met and complied with all of the appropriate certificate of need and licensure requirements to obtain State authorization to offer the component services that constitute a children's hospital; and

b. It is, therefore, appropriate that the Commissioner of Health and Senior Services designate Morristown Memorial Hospital as the State's specialty acute care children's hospital for Morris and Union counties.¹

This bill designates Morristown Memorial Hospital (MMH) as the State's specialty acute care children's hospital for Morris and Union counties. MMH's Department of Pediatrics is a regional referral program which provides area physicians with a wide range of medical, diagnostic, psychological-social and therapeutic services. MMH also offers a full complement of pediatric specialty services, a program of diagnostic, evaluation and treatment services for children and adolescents with developmental disabilities, and a rehabilitation services program that provides care for children with special needs which is unmatched in Morris and Union counties. MMH provides educational programs for area physicians through its Department of Pediatrics and operates a free-standing pediatric residency program which is approved by the Accreditation Council on Graduate Medical Education.

MMH is in substantial compliance with the criteria for minimum staff requirements and required service capabilities for designation as a children's hospital developed by the advisory committee to the Department of Health and Senior Services on pediatric care, and compares favorably in that respect with those hospitals that already have been designated by statute as specialty acute care children's hospitals in the State. These hospitals include: Children's Hospital of New Jersey for northern New Jersey; Cooper Hospital/University Medical Center for southern New Jersey; Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital/St. Peter's University Hospital in New Brunswick for the counties of Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth and Somerset; and St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center in Paterson for the counties of Bergen, Passaic, Sussex and Warren.

The Assembly Health and Human Services Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 3062, with committee amendments .

As amended by the committee, this bill designates Morristown Memorial Hospital as the State's specialty acute care children's hospital for Morris and Union counties. In order to allow for this designation, the bill amends N.J.S.A.26:2H-18e to revise the region for which St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center in the City of Paterson is designated as the State's specialty acute care children's hospital to include the counties of Bergen, Passaic, Sussex and Warren, but exclude Morris county.

The bill would add Morristown Memorial Hospital to the list of hospitals that already have been designated by statute as specialty acute care children's hospitals in the State. These include:

- -- Children's Hospital of New Jersey for northern New Jersey (N.J.S.A.26:2H-18a);
- -- Cooper Hospital/University Medical Center for southern New Jersey (N.J.S.A.26:2H-18c);
- -- Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital/St. Peter's University Hospital in New Brunswick for the counties of Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth and Somerset (N.J.S.A.26:2H-18d); and
- -- St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center in Paterson for the counties of Bergen, Passaic, Sussex and Warren (N.J.S.A.26:2H-18e).

In addition, Hackensack University Medical Center and Jersey City Medical Center have qualified for designation as children's hospitals pursuant to P.L.1999, c.394.

As reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 1448 Sca (Bucco/Suliga), which is pending before the Senate.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amendments to the bill:

c add a Legislative findings and declarations section to the bill (new section 1), which states that it is appropriate for Morristown Memorial Hospital to be designated as the State's specialty acute care children's hospital for Morris and Union counties because the hospital currently offers the full array of services for, and meets all

- of the licensure criteria that apply to, a children's hospital, and has met and complied with all of the appropriate certificate of need and licensure requirements to obtain State authorization to offer the component services that constitute a children's hospital; and
- make a technical correction in section 2 of the bill to specify that "a majority of" acute care hospitals providing inpatient pediatric services in the two counties are to execute written transfer agreements with Morristown Memorial Hospital (which makes the language of the bill consistent with that of the other statutes designating specialty acute care children's hospitals in the State).

The Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 1448.

As amended by committee, this bill designates Morristown Memorial Hospital (MMH) as the State's specialty acute care children's hospital for Morris and Union counties. In order to allow for this designation, the bill amends the region for which St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center in the City of Paterson is designated as the State's specialty acute care children's hospital to include the counties of Bergen, Passaic, Sussex and Warren, but exclude Morris county.

Under current law, the following hospitals are designated as specialty acute care children's hospitals in the State:

- -- Children's Hospital of New Jersey for northern New Jersey;
- -- Cooper Hospital/University Medical Center for southern New Jersey;
- -- Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital/St. Peter's University Hospital in New Brunswick for the counties of Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth and Somerset; and
- -- St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center in Paterson for the counties of Bergen, Morris, Passaic, Sussex and Warren.

In addition, pursuant to P.L.1999, c.394, the following hospitals qualified for designation as children's hospitals: Hackensack University Medical Center and Jersey City Medical Center.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 3062 ACA (Conaway), which is currently pending before the General Assembly.

The committee amended the bill to add a Legislative findings and declarations section (new section 1), which states that it is appropriate that Morristown Memorial Hospital be designated the State's specialty acute care children's hospital for Morris and Union counties because the hospital currently offers the full array of services for, and meets all of the licensure criteria that apply to, a children's hospital, and has met and complied with all of the appropriate certificate of need and

licensure requirements to obtain State authorization to offer the component services that constitute a children's hospital.

Other amendments make a technical correction in section 2 of the bill to specify that "a majority of" acute care hospitals providing inpatient pediatric services in the two counties shall execute written transfer agreements with the Morristown Memorial Hospital. This wording makes the language of the bill consistent with that of the other statutes designating specialty acute care children's hospitals in the State.
