1 AN ACT concerning the membership of the New Jersey Presidents'
2 Council ¹and its executive board¹ and amending P.L.1994, c.48.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. Section 7 of P.L. 1994, c.48 (C.18A:3B-7) is amended to read
8 as follows:

9 7. There is established a body corporate and politic, with corporate
10 succession, to be known as the "New Jersey Presidents' Council." Each
11 president of a public institution of higher education in the State and of
12 an independent institution which receives direct State aid shall be a
13 member of the council and shall serve ex officio. The presidents of the
14 **[two]** proprietary schools which **[enroll the largest numbers of pupils**
15 **in State]**have been authorized to offer licensed degree programs prior
16 to the effective date of P.L. , c. (C.) (now pending before
17 the Legislature as this bill) shall also serve as members of the council,
18 ex officio, to represent the interests of all such schools. The
19 presidents of the two institutions primarily involved in the preparation
20 of professional persons in the field of religion which enroll the largest
21 number of pupils in State licensed degree programs shall also serve as
22 members of the council, ex officio, to represent the interests of all such
23 schools.

26 ¹2. Section 12 of P.L.1994, c.48 (C.18A:3B-12) is amended to
27 read as follows:

28 12. a. There shall be established an executive board which
29 performs such duties as determined by the council. The executive
30 board shall be composed of **[14]** 15 members as follows:

31 The president of Rutgers, The State University;

32 The president of the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New
33 Jersey;

34 The president of New Jersey Institute of Technology;

35 Three presidents of State Colleges who shall be selected by the
36 presidents of this sector;

37 Five presidents of county colleges who shall be selected by the
38 presidents of this sector;

39 Three presidents of independent institutions who shall be selected
40 by the presidents of this sector;

1 One president of the proprietary schools which have been
2 authorized to offer licensed degree programs prior to the effective date
3 of P.L. , c. (C.) (now pending before the Legislature as this
4 bill) who shall be selected by the presidents of these proprietary
5 schools.

6 b. The chair of the executive board shall be rotated among the
7 following: one of the presidents of Rutgers, The State University of
8 New Jersey, the president of the University of Medicine and Dentistry
9 of New Jersey, and the president of New Jersey Institute of
10 Technology; a president selected by the presidents of the State
11 Colleges; a president selected by the presidents of the county colleges;
12 and a president selected by the presidents of the independent
13 institutions. The chair of the executive board shall serve for a
14 two-year period. Biennially, the executive board shall select the chair
15 in the manner provided above, but not necessarily in the order
16 provided above.

17 c. The chair of the executive board shall also serve as the chair of
18 the council.¹

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: SEPTEMBER 30, 2002

The Assembly Education Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2482 with committee amendments.

As amended, this bill provides that the presidents of the proprietary schools which have been authorized to offer licensed degree programs prior to the bill's effective date will serve as members of the New Jersey Presidents' Council. There are three proprietary schools which meet this criteria and as a result the bill will increase the current two proprietary school seats on the council to three seats.

The bill also provides that one of the presidents of the proprietary schools will serve as a member of the executive board of the New Jersey Presidents' Council. The executive board is currently composed of 14 members who are presidents of institutions of higher education. This bill will increase the executive board's membership to 15.

The committee amended the bill to provide that one president of the proprietary schools will sit on the executive board of the New Jersey Presidents' Council.

The Senate Education Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2482 (1R).

This bill provides that the presidents of the proprietary schools which have been authorized to offer licensed degree programs prior to the bill's effective date will serve as members of the New Jersey Presidents' Council. There are three proprietary schools which meet this criteria, and as a result the bill will increase the current two proprietary school seats on the council to three seats.

The bill also provides that one of the presidents of the proprietary schools will serve as a member of the executive board of the New Jersey Presidents' Council. The executive board is currently composed of 14 members who are presidents of institutions of higher education, and the bill will therefore increase the executive board's membership to 15.
