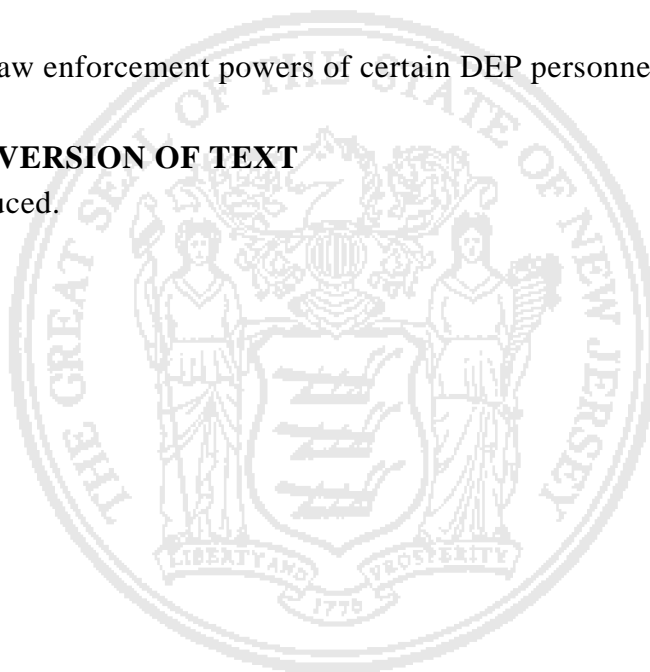

The Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 3316.

Assembly Bill No. 3316 authorizes the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to vest in State Park Rangers and other personnel of the DEP the power to effectuate arrests and carry firearms at all times. The bill also authorizes the commissioner to vest conservation officers in the Division of Fish and Wildlife in the DEP and the park rangers and law enforcement operation officers of the Division of Parks and Forestry in the DEP with the power to arrest at all times.

Under current law, DEP employees vested with such powers may effectuate arrests and carry firearms only while they are on duty.
