BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

Notwithstanding any law or regulation to the contrary, whenever a rental dwelling unit reserved for occupancy by an adult aged 55 or over is to be newly constructed and such construction is financed, in whole or in part, or through the allocation of low-income federal tax credits by the New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency, the agency shall require that each shower or bathtub within the dwelling unit be equipped with safety rails which shall be reachable by a person of average height, in order to assist the person in maneuvering in or out of the shower or bathtub, as the case may be.

STATEMENT

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1795 (1R).

Senate Bill No. 1795 (1R) requires that newly-constructed rental dwelling units reserved for seniors aged 55 or over be equipped with safety rails in showers and bathtubs in those units.

Current State regulations require safety rails in bathtubs or showers only if the rental unit is part of an assisted living facility. As introduced, the bill would have been limited to requiring the installation of shower rails in newly-constructed rental dwelling units reserved for seniors aged 55 which units were financed by the New Jersey Housing Mortgage and Finance Agency. The bill now expands the application to all newly-constructed rental dwelling units reserved for seniors.

As reported, this bill is identical to A-2441 (1R), as amended and reported by the committee.

The Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 1795.

As amended by the committee, this bill would require that newly-constructed rental dwelling units reserved for seniors aged 55 or over be equipped with safety rails in showers and bathtubs in those units.

Current State regulations require safety rails in bathtubs or showers only if the rental unit is part of an assisted living facility. As introduced, the bill would have been limited to requiring the installation of shower rails in newly-constructed rental dwelling units reserved for seniors aged 55 which units were financed by the New Jersey Housing Mortgage and Finance Agency. The Assembly Housing and Local Government Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2441.

This bill, as amended, supplements the "State Uniform Construction Code Act," P.L.1975, c. 217 (C. 52:27D-119 et seq.) to require that newly-constructed rental dwelling units reserved for seniors aged 55 or over be equipped with safety rails in the shower or bathtub

Slipping and falling in showers and bathtubs ranks high among causes of injuries for seniors. Current State regulations require safety rails in bathtubs or showers only if the rental unit is part of an assisted living facility. The bill recognizes that seniors in independent living apartments, even though they are not considered infirm, may need protection against slipping in the tub or shower.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

Committee amendments to the bill:

The committee amended the bill to require that all newly-constructed dwelling units reserved for seniors aged 55 or over be equipped with safety rails in the shower or bathtub, not just those units constructed with financing from the New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2441 (1R), with committee amendments.

Assembly Bill No. 2441 (1R), as amended, requires that newly-constructed rental dwelling units reserved for seniors aged 55 or over be equipped with safety rails in showers and bathtubs in those units.

Current State regulations require safety rails in bathtubs or showers only if the rental unit is part of an assisted living facility. As introduced, the bill would have been limited to requiring the installation of shower rails in newly-constructed rental dwelling units reserved for seniors aged 55 which units were financed by the New Jersey Housing Mortgage and Finance Agency. The bill, as amended, expands the application to all newly-constructed rental dwelling units reserved for seniors.

As amended and reported, this bill is identical to S-1795 (1R) as also reported by the committee.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This legislation was not certified as requiring a fiscal note.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The amendments are technical in nature to correct the title and synopsis to be identical to Senate Bill No. 1795 (1R).

SENATE BILL NO. 1795 (Third Reprint)

To the Senate:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14 of the New Jersey Constitution, I am returning Senate Bill No. 1795 (First Reprint) with my recommendations for reconsideration.

A. Summary of Bill

This bill would amend the State Uniform Construction Code Act to require that whenever a rental dwelling unit reserved for occupancy by individuals 55 years of age and older is newly constructed, each shower or bathtub within the dwelling unit must be equipped with safety rails which shall be reachable by a person of average height, in order to assist the individual in maneuvering in or out of the shower or bathtub, as the case may be. As originally introduced in the Legislature, this bill would not have amended the State Uniform Construction Code Act, but rather provided that when newly constructed projects consisting of rental dwelling units reserved for occupancy by individuals 55 years of age and older are financed in whole or in part, or through the allocation of low-income tax credits, by the New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency (HMFA), then the HMFA shall ensure that shower and bathtub safety rails are installed in such projects.

B. Recommended Action

I commend the sponsors of this bill and the Legislature for their efforts intended to enhance health and safety in newly constructed rental units reserved for occupancy by people 55 years of age and older. I am concerned, however, that the amended version of this bill goes far beyond directing the HMFA to ensure the presence of safety rails in the age-restricted lowincome rental projects that the agency finances. Instead, the bill would create a new requirement to be included in the State Uniform Construction Code governing all new rental units reserved for occupancy by people aged 55 years and older. To assure that the State's construction codes meet the goals of the Uniform Construction Code Act, New Jersey adopts nationally recognized model codes, such as those of the International Code Council. The State relies upon the established procedures of the national bodies to assess changes in specific standards and their implications for safety, health and affordability. The change proposed by this bill is not the result of such a review and, therefore, may have unanticipated consequences with respect to other aspects of the code. Currently, the code appropriately requires that showers and bathtubs be constructed in a manner that would permit the installation of rails, ensuring that safety rails can be installed relatively easily and inexpensively by building owners in the event that an individual tenant wants or needs safety railings in a rental unit.

As a result of the above considerations, I recommend that the bill be amended in order to return it to the form in which it was introduced. Accordingly, I herewith return Senate Bill No. 1795 (First Reprint) and recommend that it be amended as follows:

Page 2, Section 1, Line 8:

Delete "It shall be required pursuant to the provisions of the State Uniform Construction Code Act, P.L.1975, c. 217 (C. 52:27D-119 et seq.)" and insert

"Notwithstanding any law or regulation to the contrary"

Page 2, Section 1, Line 12:

After "constructed" insert "and such construction is financed, in whole or in part, or through the allocation of low-income federal tax credits by the New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency, the agency shall require"
