AN ACT ¹[co] ¹ concerning the purchase of health benefits coverage by part-time State employees and part-time faculty members at public institutions of higher education in this State and supplementing P.L.1961, c.49 (C.52:14-17.25 et seq.).

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 9 1. a. Notwithstanding any provision of P.L.1961, c. 49 (C.52:14-10 17.25 et seq.) to the contrary, a part-time State employee ¹, or a part-time faculty member, including part-time lecturers and adjunct 11 faculty members, at a public institution of higher education in this 12 State ¹if the public institution of higher education participates in the 13 14 program, who is enrolled in a State-administered retirement system 15 shall be eligible to participate in the State Health Benefits Program and may purchase health benefits coverage under the program in the State 16 managed care plan as defined in section 2 of P.L.1961, c.49 (C.52:14-17 18 17.26) for the employee or faculty member and the dependents of the 19 employee or faculty member. If such an employee or faculty member 20 elects to enroll in the program, the employee or faculty member shall 21 pay the full cost of the coverage selected and the employer shall not be responsible for any costs in connection with the purchase of the 22 23 coverage, unless the employer shall be obligated to pay all or a portion 24 of such costs in accordance with the provisions of a binding collective 25 negotiations agreement.
- b. ¹[The Division of Pensions and Benefits may collect through 26 withholding from each employee or faculty member and remit to the 27 State treasury all employee or faculty member contributions for 28 29 premiums or periodic charges in advance of their due dates, subject to 30 the rules and regulations of the State Health Benefits Commission, or 31 the employee or faculty member may elect to pay the State managed 32 care plan directly for the premiums or periodic charges. The method of payment shall be at the discretion of the employee or faculty 33 34 member.] The State Health Benefits Commission may establish rules 35 and regulations concerning the enrollment and termination of coverage of employees and faculty members in the State Health Benefits 36 37 Program, pursuant to this section, and the procedures for the remittance to the program of the cost of coverage.¹ 38

Amounts payable by a participating employee or faculty 4 member for administrative expenses shall be collected in the same manner as premiums or periodic charges are paid ¹[, either directly 5 from the employee or faculty member by the Division of Pensions and 6 Benefits or through the employee withholding method]¹ and remitted 7 to the State treasury and shall be used for such purposes. 8

c. The State Health Benefits Commission shall advise eligible employees, and the public institutions of higher education shall advise eligible faculty members, that they may enroll in the State Health Benefits Program pursuant to this section and shall further advise eligible employees and faculty members, as may be appropriate, of any benefits to which they are entitled upon the termination of their employment. The State Health Benefits Commission shall determine the manner and form of the advisory notice to the employees and faculty members.¹

The Assembly State Government Committee reports favorably Assembly, No. 3424.

This bill provides that a part-time State employee or a part-time faculty member, including part-time lecturers and adjunct faculty members, at a public institution of higher education in this State, who is enrolled in a State-administered retirement system, will be entitled to participate in the State Health Benefits Program (SHBP) and may purchase health benefits coverage in the State managed care plan under SHBP for the employee or faculty member, and the dependents of the employee or faculty member. If such an employee or faculty member elects to enroll and purchase coverage, the employee or faculty member will pay the full cost of the coverage. The employer will not be responsible for any costs in connection with the purchase of the coverage, unless the employer is obligated to pay all or a portion of such costs in accordance with the provisions of a binding collective negotiations agreement.

with Assembly Floor Amendments (Proposed By Assemblywoman Watson Coleman)

These floor amendments make the bill identical to Senate Bill No. 988 (2R). Specifically, the amendments:

- 1) provide that part-time State employees and part-time faculty members will not qualify for employer or State-paid post-retirement health care benefits under the State Health Benefits Program (SHBP), but that upon retirement, such employees and faculty members will be permitted to enroll in the SHBP managed care plan they were enrolled in prior to retirement through the retired group at their own expense;
- 2) provide that the State Health Benefits Commission must advise eligible employees, and the public institutions of higher education must advise eligible faculty members, that they may enroll in SHBP and about any benefits to which they are entitled upon the termination of their employment;
- 3) give the State Health Benefits Commission the authority to establish such rules and regulations as may be necessary to enroll the persons covered by the bill;
- 4) permit a faculty member to participate in SHBP only if the public institution of higher education that employs the faculty member participates in the program; and
- 5) delete language giving the employee or faculty member the option to choose either to pay the cost of health care coverage directly or to have it withheld.

A State employee electing to enroll in the program shall authorize, at the time of enrollment, the employer to withhold, on an advance basis, from wages or salary the premiums or periodic charges for the coverage selected, and the withholding may be used by the State as a method to collect the premiums or periodic charges. The employee or faculty member shall also be required to pay a proportionate share of administrative expenses of the program in such amounts and at such times as shall be determined and fixed by the commission. Amounts payable by a participating employee or faculty member for administrative expenses shall be collected directly from the employee or faculty member by the Division of Pensions and Benefits or through the employee withholding method and remitted to the State treasury and shall be used for such purposes.

c. The laws and regulations governing the State Health Benefits Program, except as provided in this section, are applicable to enrollments in the program under this section and shall be construed to apply to part-time employees or faculty members and their

The Senate State Government Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate, No. 988.

This bill provides that a part-time State employee or a part-time faculty member, including part-time lecturers and adjunct faculty members, at a public institution of higher education in this State who is enrolled in a State-administered retirement system will be entitled to participate in the State Health Benefits Program (SHBP) and may purchase health benefits coverage in the State managed care plan under SHBP for the employee or faculty member and the dependents of the employee or faculty member. If such an employee or faculty member elects to enroll and purchase coverage, the employee or faculty member will pay the full cost of the coverage. The employer will not be responsible for any costs in connection with the purchase of the coverage, unless the employer is obligated to pay all or a portion of such costs in accordance with the provisions of a binding collective negotiations agreement.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amended the bill to provide that the payment of premiums or periodic charges may be either through withholding or direct payment, at the discretion of the employee or faculty member.

with Senate Floor Amendments (Proposed By Senator TURNER)

ADOPTED: MAY 29, 2003

The purpose of this amendment is to:

- 1) provide that part-time State employees and part-time faculty members would not qualify for employer or State-paid post-retirement health care benefits under the State Health Benefits Program, but that upon retirement, such employees and faculty members would be permitted to enroll in the State managed care plan they were enrolled in prior to retirement through the retired group at their own expense;
- 2) provide that the State Health Benefits Commission must advise eligible employees, and the public institutions of higher education must advise eligible faculty members, that they may enroll in the State Health Benefits Program and must further advise eligible employees and faculty members, as may be appropriate, of any benefits to which they are entitled upon the termination of their employment;
- 3) give the State Health Benefits Commission the authority to establish such rules and regulations as may be necessary to enroll the persons covered by the bill;
- 4) permit faculty members to participate in the State Health Benefits Program only if the public institution of higher education that employs the faculty members participates in the program; and
- 5) delete language giving the employee or faculty member the option to choose either to pay the cost of health care coverage directly or to have it withheld.
