- c. Any ordinance or resolution adopted by the governing body of a municipality in violation of subsection a. of this section shall be null and void.

The Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 2360.

As amended by the committee this bill would prohibit municipal governing bodies from adopting and enforcing ordinances or resolutions which would require a bond or permit fee from a person or organization for displaying the flag of the United States of America. The bill would permit a municipal governing body to direct the removal of a flag when the flag is displayed in a manner that threatens public safety or the flag is displayed in a manner inconsistent with the rules and customs deemed the proper manner to display the flag, such as the federal Flag Code, 4 U.S.C. §§1 et seq., or any other applicable law or guideline. Municipal ordinances or resolutions adopted by the governing body of a municipality in violation of the bill would be considered null and void.

Additionally, as amended by the committee, the bill would allow a unit owner within a common interest community to display an American flag, but would allow the common interest community to impose reasonable restrictions regarding the size, location and manner of display but not to otherwise restrict the display.

The committee amended the bill to delete provisions that would have prohibited municipalities from limiting or prohibiting the display of the American flag. The committee amendments also deleted language that would have prohibited homeowners' associations formed to manage the elements of property owned in common by all members of a common interest community from adopting a rule or bylaw which, if such rule or bylaw were to be adopted by a municipality, would violate State law and replaced that language with a provision limiting the ability of a common interest community to restrict display of the American flag.

These floor amendments restore the prohibition in the bill against municipal ordinances prohibiting or limiting the display of the American flag, as well as other patriotic displays. The bill provides conditions which would permit removal of an American flag display or other patriotic disaplay by a municipality, specifically when the display threatens public safety, restricts necessary maintenance activities or interferes with the property rights of another. Section 2 of the bill is reworded to permit removal of a flag or other patriotic display by a homeowner's association under the same conditions as a municipality, namely when the display threatens public safety, restricts necessary maintenance activities, interferes with the property rights of another, or is conducted in a manner inconsistent with the rules and customs deemed the proper manner to display the flag, such as the federal Flag Code, 4 U.S.C. §§1 et seq., or any other applicable law or guideline.

The Assembly Housing and Local Government Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 3269.

This bill prohibits municipalities from adopting ordinances or resolutions which would limit or prohibit the display of the flag of the United States of America. The bill also prohibits a municipality from requiring a bond or permit fee of a person or organization for displaying the flag. The bill would permit the municipal removal of a flag when the flag is displayed in a manner that threatens public safety or the flag is displayed in a manner inconsistent with the rules and customs deemed the proper manner to display the flag, such as the federal Flag Code, 4 U.S.C. §§1 et seq., or any other applicable law or guideline. Municipal ordinances or resolutions adopted by the governing body of a municipality in violation of the bill would be considered null and void.

The bill also supplements the law regulating homeowners' associations which manage commonly owned property in condomiums, cooperatives, and other planned real estate developments. This form of real estate ownership is very popular in New Jersey, with close to a million people living under the governance of various homeowners' associations. Therefore, a homeowners' association would not be permitted to limit or prohibit the display of the American flag, or adopt other rules or bylaws that municipalities are not permitted to adopt.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amended the title of the bill, and replaced the synopsis, to make it clear that the bill affects homeowners' associations.

These floor amendments add additional conditions which would permit removal of an American flag display by a municipality, specifically where the display restricts necessary maintenance activities or interferes with the property rights of another. Section 2 of the bill is reworded to limit the bill's effect on homeowners' association rules to those rules and bylaws pertaining to flag and other patriotic displays, and permits removal of a flag or other patriotic display by an association under the same conditions as a municipality, namely when the display threatens public safety, restricts necessary maintenance activities, interferes with the property rights of another, or is conducted in a manner inconsistent with the rules and customs deemed the proper manner to display the flag, such as the federal Flag Code, 4 U.S.C. §§1 et seq., or any other applicable law or guideline.
