4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

7 1. R.S.39:3-4 is amended to read as follows:

8 39:3-4. Except as hereinafter provided, every resident of this State  
9 and every nonresident whose automobile or motorcycle shall be driven  
10 in this State shall, before using such vehicle on the public highways,  
11 register the same, and no automobile or motorcycle shall be driven  
12 unless so registered.

13 Such registration shall be made in the following manner: An  
14 application in writing, signed by the applicant or by an agent or officer,  
15 in case the applicant is a corporation, shall be made to the director or  
16 the director's agent, on forms prepared and supplied by the director,  
17 containing the name, street address of the residence or the business of  
18 the owner, mailing address, if different from the street address of the  
19 owner's residence or business, and age of the owner, together with a  
20 description of the character of the automobile or motorcycle, including  
21 the name of the maker and the vehicle identification number, or the  
22 manufacturer's number or the number assigned by the director if the

The Assembly Transportation Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 773 (1R).

As reported, this bill requires a lessor doing business in this State to notify in writing the lessee of a motor vehicle registered pursuant to Title 39 (the motor vehicle code) of any change in its policies or procedures affecting the registration of the motor vehicle. There is no such requirement under current law, and persons have been cited for unknowingly driving a motor vehicle with an expired registration.

As reported, this bill eliminates the current requirement that a lessor of a leased motor vehicle is to notify the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles in writing of the termination of a lease or of a change of the lessee within seven days after the termination or change.

As reported by the committee, Senate Bill No. 773 (1R) is identical to Assembly Bill No. 3659, which also was reported by the committee on this date.

The Senate Transportation Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 773 with committee amendments.

This amended bill requires a lessor doing business in this State to notify in writing the lessee of a motor vehicle registered pursuant to Title 39 (the motor vehicle code) any change in its policies or procedures affecting the registration of the motor vehicle. There is no such requirement under current law, and persons have been cited for unknowingly driving a motor vehicle with an expired registration.

In addition, the amended bill omits the current requirement that a lessor of a leased motor vehicle is to notify the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles in writing of the termination of a lease or of a change of the lessee within seven days after the termination or change.

The amendments approved by the committee deleted the requirement of notification of the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles of the termination of the lease or change of the lessee.

As reported, this bill eliminates the current requirement that a lessor of a leased motor vehicle is to notify the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles in writing of the termination of a lease or of a change of the lessee within seven days after the termination or change.

As reported by the committee, Assembly Bill No. 3659 is identical to Senate Bill No. 773 (1R), which also was reported by the committee on this date.
