7 1. Section 5 of P.L.1968, c.142 (C.18A:71-32) is amended to read
8 as follows:

9 5. (a) The board of directors of the fund shall consist of the
10 chairman of the Commission on Higher Education and the chairperson
11 of the Board of the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority or
12 their designees from among the public members and eight citizens of
13 this State appointed by the Governor. Citizen members of the board
14 shall be selected without regard to political affiliation and, as far as
15 may be practicable, on the basis of their knowledge of, or interest in,
16 the problems of needy students and higher education. The board shall
17 organize annually as established by rule of the board to elect a
18 chairman, vice chairman and other officers as the board shall determine
19 from among its members. The officers shall serve for a ~~one~~two-year
20 term and until their successors are elected and qualified. Vacancies in
21 the offices shall be filled in the same manner for the unexpired term
22 only.

23 (b) Each citizen member of the board shall serve for a term of four
24 years and until his successor shall have been appointed and qualified;
25 provided, that in the case of the first appointments to the board, two
26 members shall be appointed for terms expiring June 30, 1969;
27 two members shall be appointed for terms expiring June 30, 1970; two
28 members shall be appointed for terms expiring June 30, 1971; and two
29 members shall be appointed for terms expiring June 30, 1972. Any
30 vacancy in the membership of the board shall be filled in the same
31 manner as the original appointment for the remainder of the unexpired
32 term.

33 (c) The board shall develop and maintain a Statewide system for
34 the identification of potential college students from needy families;
35 devise methods for recruiting such students; advise the commission on
36 the organization, coordination and support, in cooperation with public
37 and private institutions of higher education of the State, of programs
38 of remedial education for such students; and provide financial
39 assistance as required by such students.

40 (d) Members of the board shall serve without compensation but
41 shall be entitled to be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary

The Assembly Education Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 2518.

This bill increases the terms of office of the chairman, vice-chairman and other officers on the board of directors of the New Jersey Educational Opportunity Fund from one year to two years.

The New Jersey Educational Opportunity Fund was established in 1968 to ensure access to higher education for those who come from backgrounds of economic and educational disadvantage. The fund provides supplemental financial aid to help cover college costs not covered by the State's Tuition Aid Grant Program. The fund also supports a wide array of campus-based outreach and support services for EOF students enrolled in the State's public and independent institutions of higher education. The EOF is governed by a 10 member board of directors composed of the chairpersons of the Commission on Higher Education and the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority and eight public members.
