1	AN ACT concerning late payment charges for service by utilities and cable
2	television companies and supplementing Title 48 of the Revised
3	Statutes.

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5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey: 6

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1. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of any law, rule, regulation or order to the contrary, the board shall not allow a utility to assess a late payment charge on an unpaid bill unless such charge is provided for in the utility's applicable rate schedule approved by the board. A late payment charge shall not be approved by the board if it is applicable to bills less than 25 days after rendering. A late payment charge shall not be approved for a rate schedule applicable to a State, county or municipal government entity or any residential ratepayer.

As used in this subsection, a "utility" means a public utility, as public utility is defined in R.S.48:2-13 and including a natural gas pipeline utility as natural gas pipeline utility is defined in section 2 of P.L.1952, c.166 (C.48:10-3), and a municipally-operated utility, insofar as the board's jurisdiction is extended to the municipally-operated utility under any applicable law.

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b. The board may adopt, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), rules and regulations necessary to effectuate the purposes of subsection a. of this section.

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- 2. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of any law, rule, regulation or order to the contrary, the board shall not allow a cable television company that provides cable television reception service within this State and is subject to the jurisdiction of the board, to approve a specified due date for payments for such service that is less than 15 days from the date of the bill. In the event a cable television company imposes an additional fee, charge or penalty to a subscriber for billing balances which are considered past due or late, the cable television company shall clearly specify the amount of the fee, charge or penalty on the subscriber's bill. The cable television company shall also specify the method of calculation of the fee, charge or penalty on the subscriber's bill. A cable television company shall not impose an additional fee, charge or penalty on any account balance of such subscriber that is less than 30 days past due or late.

1 AN ACT concerning payment of gas and electric utility, telephone and 2 cable television service bills by senior citizens and supplementing 3 Title 48 of the Revised Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 8 1. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of P.L.1999, c.23 (C.48:3-49 et seq.) or any other law, rule, regulation or order to the contrary, a public utility providing basic generation or basic gas supply service, pursuant to P.L.1999, c.23 (C.48:3-49 et seq.), shall establish a 12 payment plan that allows senior citizens at least 30 days from the date of their utility bill to submit their payment to the utility without 14 incurring late fees, interest or penalties of any kind. As used in this section, "senior citizen" means any person 62 years of age or older who is a customer of a public utility providing basic generation service or gas supply service to the senior citizen.
 - b. The Board of Public Utilities shall adopt, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), rules and regulations necessary to effectuate the purposes of subsection a. of this section.

Notwithstanding the provisions of P.L.1948, c.90 (C.48:2-1 et seq.) or any other law, rule, regulation or order to the contrary, a telephone company which is subject to the jurisdiction of the Board of Public Utilities and provides telephone services within this State, shall establish a payment plan that allows senior citizens at least 30 days from the date of their telephone bill to submit their payment to the telephone company without incurring late fees, interest or penalties of any kind. As used in this section, "senior citizen" means any person 62 years of age or older who is a customer of a telephone company providing telephone services to the senior citizen.

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b. The Board of Public Utilities shall adopt, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), rules and regulations necessary to effectuate the purposes of subsection a. of this section.

The Assembly Telecommunications and Utilities Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 252.

As reported, this bill requires certain public utilities providing basic (electric) generation or basic gas supply service, telephone companies providing telephone services and cable television companies providing cable television services to establish payment plans that allow senior citizens at least 30 days from the date of utility, telephone and cable television bills to submit payment to a utility, telephone company or cable television company without incurring late fees, interest or penalties of any kind.

Senior citizens living on a fixed incomes are often unable to pay their utility, telephone and cable television bills in less than 30 days because of their reliance on monthly social security or pension income. The intent of this bill is to provide at least 30 days from the date of utility, telephone or cable television bills for senior citizens to submit payments without incurring late fees, interest or penalties of any kind.

This bill was prefiled for introduction in the 2002-2003 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

The Senate Economic Growth, Agriculture and Tourism Committee reports favorably a Senate committee substitute for Assembly Bill No. 252.

This bill, as substituted, prohibits the Board of Public Utilities ('board") from allowing a public utility, as public utility is defined in R.S.48:2-13 and including a natural gas pipeline utility as natural gas pipeline utility is defined in section 2 of P.L.1952, c.166 (C.48:10-3), and a municipally-operated utility that is subject to the jurisdiction of the board, to assess a late payment charge on an unpaid bill unless such charge is provided for in the utility's applicable rate schedule approved by the board. A late payment charge shall not be approved by the board if it is applicable to bills less than 25 days after rendering. A late payment charge shall not be approved for a rate schedule applicable to a State, county or municipal government entity or any residential ratepayer.

The substitute bill prohibits a cable television company that provides cable television reception service within this State and is subject to the jurisdiction of the board, to approve a specified due date for payments for such service that is less than 15 days from the date of the bill. In the event a cable television company imposes an additional fee, charge or penalty to a subscriber for billing balances which are considered past due or late, the cable television company shall clearly specify the amount of the fee, charge or penalty on the subscriber's bill. The cable television company shall also specify the method of calculation of the fee, charge or penalty on the subscriber's bill. A cable television company shall not impose an additional fee, charge or penalty on any account balance of such subscriber that is less than 30 days past due or late.
