4 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
5 *of New Jersey:*

7 1. Section 2 of P.L.1991, c.193 (C.18A:4A-2) is amended to read  
8 as follows:

9 2. a. The New Jersey Commission on Holocaust Education is  
10 created and established in the Executive Branch of the State  
11 Government. For the purposes of complying with the provisions of  
12 Article V, Section IV, paragraph 1 of the New Jersey Constitution, the  
13 commission is allocated within the Department of Education, but  
14 notwithstanding this allocation, the commission shall be independent  
15 of any supervision or control by the department or any board or officer  
16 thereof.

17 The commission shall consist of **[21]** 25 members, including the  
18 Commissioner of Education and the chair of the executive board of the  
19 Presidents' Council, serving ex officio, and **[19]** 23 public members.

20 Public members shall be appointed as follows: three public members  
21 shall be appointed by the President of the Senate; three public  
22 members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the General Assembly;  
23 and **[13]** 17 public members shall be appointed by the Governor, no  
24 less than six of whom shall at the time of their appointment be  
25 members of the New Jersey Advisory Council on Holocaust  
26 Education, created pursuant to Executive Order No. 17 of 1982 and  
27 continued pursuant to Executive Order No. 87 of 1984, Executive  
28 Order No. 168 of 1987 and Executive Order No. 225 of 1990, and  
29 further continued pursuant to Executive Order No. 14 of 1990. The  
30 public members shall be residents of this State, chosen with due regard  
31 to broad geographic representation and ethnic diversity, who have  
32 served prominently as spokespersons for, or as leaders of  
33 organizations which serve members of religious, ethnic, national  
34 heritage or social groups which were subjected to genocide, torture,  
35 wrongful deprivation of liberty or property, officially imposed or  
36 sanctioned violence, and other forms of human rights violations and  
37 persecution at the hands of the Nazis and their collaborators during the  
38 Nazi era, or they shall be residents who are experienced in the field of  
39 Holocaust education.

40 b. Each public member of the commission shall serve for a term of  
41 three years, except that of the initial members so appointed: one

1 member appointed by the President of the Senate, one member  
2 appointed by the Speaker of the General Assembly, and four members  
3 appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of one year; one  
4 member appointed by the President of the Senate, one member  
5 appointed by the Speaker of the General Assembly, and four members  
6 appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of two years; and one  
7 member appointed by the President of the Senate, one member  
8 appointed by the Speaker of the General Assembly, and five members  
9 appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of three years. Public  
10 members shall be eligible for reappointment. They shall serve until  
11 their successors are appointed and qualified, and the term of the  
12 successor of any incumbent shall be calculated from the expiration of  
13 the term of that incumbent. A vacancy occurring other than by  
14 expiration of term shall be filled in the same manner as the original  
15 appointment but for the unexpired term only.

16 c. The members of the commission shall serve without  
17 compensation, but they shall be entitled to reimbursement for all  
18 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

19 d. The commission shall annually elect a chairman from among its  
20 members. It shall meet upon the call of the chairman or of a majority  
21 of the commission members. The presence of a majority of the  
22 authorized membership of the commission shall be required for the  
23 conduct of official business.

24 e. The commission shall appoint an executive director, who shall  
25 serve at its pleasure and shall be a person qualified by training and  
26 experience to perform the duties of the office.

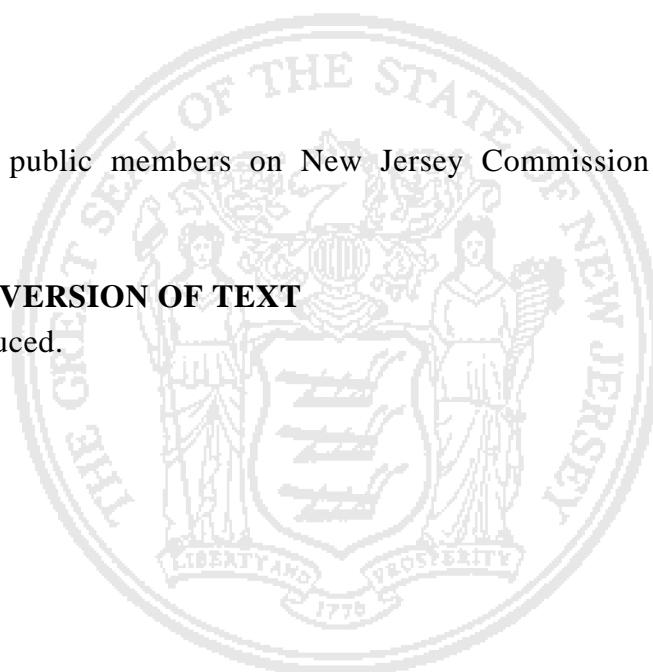
