The Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 2784.

As amended by committee, this bill provides that a long-term care facility that provides specialized care for patients diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders shall compile and maintain daily records for each shift in the facility and provide to a member of the public, upon request, information that indicates for each shift, as appropriate:

- -- the number of nurses, including the aggregate total of registered professional nurses and licensed practical nurses, providing direct care to patients diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders; and
- -- the number of certified nurse aides providing direct care to patients diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.

In addition, the bill provides that the facility must provide a member of the public seeking placement of a person diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease or related disorders in the facility with a clear and concise written list that indicates:

- -- the activities that are specifically directed toward patients diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders, including, but not limited to, those designed to maintain dignity and personal identity, enhance socialization and success, and accommodate the cognitive and functional ability of a patient;
 - -- the frequency of these activities; and
- -- the safety policies and procedures and any security monitoring system that is specific to patients diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.

The committee amended the bill to delete language that made compliance with the requirements of the bill a condition of facility licensure. Other amendments clarify that the provisions apply to patients "diagnosed" with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No.3694 (1R) (Stanley/R. Smith/Guear), which is pending before the General Assembly.

The Assembly Senior Issues Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 3694.

As amended by the committee, this bill provides that, as a condition of licensure, a long-term care facility that provides specialized care for patients with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders shall compile and maintain daily records for each shift in the facility and provide to a member of the public, upon request, information that indicates for each shift, as appropriate:

- C the number of nurses, including the aggregate total of registered professional nurses and licensed practical nurses, providing direct care to patients with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders; and
- C the number of certified nurse aides providing direct care to patients with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.

In addition, the bill provides that the facility must provide a member of the public seeking placement of a person with Alzheimer's disease or related disorders in the facility with a clear and concise written list that indicates:

- C the activities that are specifically directed toward patients with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders, including, but not limited to, those designed to maintain dignity and personal identity, enhance socialization and success, and accommodate the cognitive and functional ability of a patient;
- C the frequency of these activities; and
- C the safety policies and procedures and any security monitoring system that is specific to patients with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amended the bill to require long-term care facilities to compile and maintain daily records for each shift in the facility and provide to a member of the public, upon request, information that indicates for each shift, the number of nurses and aides (registered professional nurses, licensed practical nurses and certified nurse aides)

providing direct care to patients with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders. The amendments eliminated the requirement that a list including staffing ratios be provided to a person seeking placement of a person with Alzheimer's disease or related disorders in a long-term care facility.

STATEMENT TO

[First Reprint] **ASSEMBLY, No. 3694**

with Assembly Floor Amendments (Proposed By Assemblyman STANLEY)

ADOPTED: DECEMBER 15, 2003

This floor amendment deletes language that would make compliance with the bill's requirements a condition of licensure, but does not change the bill's requirement that a long-term care facility that provides specialized care of patients diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders compile and maintain certain daily records and provide, in the manner prescribed in the bill, information to a member of the public.

The amendment also clarifies that the bill refers to patients who are diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.
