The Assembly Senior Issues Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 3781.

This bill concerns congregate housing facilities and adds two requirements to assist residents living in these facilities.

As amended by the committee, the bill requires that, within 120 days of its effective date, every entrance to a building located within a congregate housing facility, as defined in N.J.S.A. 52:27D-184, must be equipped with a power-assisted door opener, if the door of the entrance requires greater than 10 pounds of pull in order to be opened manually. The bill also provides that, upon the request of a resident living in a congregate housing facility, the operator of the facility must provide a system permitting the remote unlocking of the outer doors of the facility.

To be eligible to live in congregate housing, a resident must be either disabled or over age 62. These types of facilities pre-date the creation of assisted living facilities in the State, which have specific construction codes applicable to them. The purpose of the bill is to remove some barriers from congregate housing that are proving to be hardships on the residents, such as outside entrance doors that are too heavy to open, or the need for residents not located on the ground floor to navigate stairs to open the outside door to allow guests into the facility.

#### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS**

The committee amendments delete the provision that the equipping of a congregate housing facility with a power-assisted door must be a requirement of the barrier free subcode, since the subcode applies only to new construction. In addition, the amendments make technical changes to the bill's title.

To be eligible to live in congregate housing, a resident must be either disabled or over age 62.
