#### **STATEMENT**

This bill changes the date for transmittal to the Legislature of the Governor's annual budget message speech for the next fiscal year from on or before the third Tuesday following the first meeting of the Legislature in each year to on or before the fourth Tuesday in February in each year. The different date currently set forth in the statutes for the budget message for a newly inaugurated Governor, on or before February 15, is also changed to on or before the fourth Tuesday in February.

Revenue forecasting undertaken in preparing the detailed budget message under the current statutory deadline of a late January or early February date of the Governor's budget message presents a serious impediment to reliable forecasting. The short delay proposed in this bill to the last week in February will allow the incorporation of crucial revenue data from the last quarter of the prior calendar year, thereby including key indicators of what April revenue collections are likely to be, while giving forecasters a half-year of current revenue collection data to utilize in assessing the revenue estimates that must be included in the budget message for the next fiscal year.

The bill provides the Governor and the Governor's professional budget staff ample opportunity to review and include this revenue collection data in the formulation of the budget message. Given this extension of time, it is important for the Governor to comply with the additional statutory requirement that the full, detailed revenue and appropriation proposals in line-by-line format proposed for the State budget be delivered to the Legislature after the budget message is

### STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: JANUARY 8, 2004

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 2834.

This bill establishes a new statutory deadline for delivery of the Governor's annual budget message to the Legislature.

Current law requires that the Governor, having prepared recommendations for the State budget for the ensuing fiscal year, shall transmit those recommendations in a budget message to the Legislature no later than the third Tuesday following the year's first meeting of the Legislature; for a newly inaugurated Governor, a special budget message deadline of February 15 is established. Under the bill, the fourth Tuesday in February would become the uniform deadline for delivery of the Governor's annual budget message in all years.

By law, the Commissioner of Education must, within two days after transmittal of the Governor's budget message, notify each school district of the maximum amount of State aid it may receive in the forthcoming school year. The school districts use these figures in preparing their proposed school budgets, which must in turn be submitted to the commissioner for approval by a statutory deadline; the submission deadline for Abbott districts is set seven days earlier than that for other districts. Because the delay in receipt of their State aid figures resulting from the bill's postponement of the Governor's budget message will make it difficult for Abbott districts to meet the more stringent deadline, the bill moves that deadline to be the same as that applicable to all other districts. For all districts, the bill authorizes the Commissioner of Education to make such further adjustments to the school budget calendar (and also to the date for notice to nontenured faculty regarding continued employment) as necessary to conform with the school aid notification date.

In addition to the provisions described above, the bill (1) codifies in law the longstanding tradition that delivery of the budget message be made as a presentation by the Governor in an appearance before a joint session of the Legislature, and (2) removes from the law obsolete requirements for inclusion in the budget message of various mandatory dedications.

In explaining the purpose of delaying the date of the Governor's budget message, the sponsors' statement notes that revenue estimation undertaken in preparing the detailed budget message under the current statutory deadline of late January or early February presents a serious impediment to reliable forecasting. The statement indicates that the short delay proposed in the bill will allow the incorporation of crucial revenue data from the last quarter of the prior calendar year, thereby including key indicators of what April revenue collections are likely to be, while giving forecasters a half-year of current revenue collection data to utilize in assessing the revenue estimates that must be included in the budget message for the new fiscal year. The statement indicates that the bill would provide the Governor and the Governor's professional budget staff ample opportunity to review and include this revenue collection data in the formulation of the budget message.

### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS**

Committee amendments to this bill (1) delete from the bill a requirement that the Governor's budget recommendations, in full detail, be conveyed to each member of the Legislature following the joint session at which the budget message is presented, and (2) incorporate the provisions making the Abbott districts' deadline for submitting their proposed budgets the same as that for other districts and authorizing the Commissioner of Education to adjust the school budget calendar to conform with the State aid notification date.

The short delay proposed in this bill to the last week in February will allow the incorporation of crucial revenue data from the last quarter of the prior calendar year, thereby including key indicators of what April revenue collections are likely to be, while giving forecasters a half-year of current revenue collection data to use in assessing the revenue estimates that must be included in the budget message for the next fiscal year.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 3947, with committee amendments.

Assembly Bill No. 3947, as amended, establishes a new statutory deadline for delivery of the Governor's annual budget message to the Legislature.

Current law requires that the Governor, having prepared recommendations for the State budget for the ensuing fiscal year, shall transmit those recommendations in a budget message to the Legislature no later than the third Tuesday following the year's first meeting of the Legislature; for a newly inaugurated Governor, a special budget message deadline of February 15 is established. Under the bill, the fourth Tuesday in February will become the uniform deadline for delivery of the Governor's annual budget message in all years.

By law, the Commissioner of Education must, within two days after transmittal of the Governor's budget message, notify each school district of the maximum amount of State aid it may receive in the forthcoming school year. The school districts use these figures in preparing their proposed school budgets, which must in turn be submitted to the commissioner for approval by a statutory deadline; under current law the submission deadline for Abbott districts is set seven days earlier that for other districts. Because the delay in receipt of their State aid figures resulting from the bill's postponement of the Governor's budget message will make it difficult for Abbott districts to meet the more stringent deadline, the bill moves that deadline to be the same as that applicable to all other districts.

In addition to the provisions described above, the bill (1) codifies in law the longstanding tradition that delivery of the budget message be made as a presentation by the Governor in an appearance before a joint session of the Legislature, and (2) removes from the law obsolete requirements for inclusion in the budget message of various mandatory dedications.

In explaining the purpose of delaying the date of the Governor's budget message, the sponsors' statement notes that revenue estimation undertaken in preparing the detailed budget message under the current

statutory deadline of late January or early February presents a serious impediment to reliable forecasting. The statement indicates that the short delay proposed in the bill will allow the incorporation of crucial revenue data from the last quarter of the prior calendar year, thereby including key indicators of what April revenue collections are likely to be, while giving forecasters a half-year of current revenue collection data to utilize in assessing the revenue estimates that must be included in the budget message for the new fiscal year. The statement indicates that the bill will provide the Governor and the Governor's professional budget staff ample opportunity to review and include this revenue collection data in the formulation of the budget message.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**:

The changes in deadlines prescribed under the bill have no direct fiscal impact on State revenues or expenditures.

### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:**

The amendments incorporate the provision conforming the deadline for submission by Abbott districts of their proposed budgets to the deadline applicable to other school districts and authorize the Commissioner of Education to adjust the school budget calendar and the date for the notification of nontenured personnel as necessary to conform with the State aid notification date.
