The mirror is to be installed at the top left rear 31 corner of the cargo box so that the operator of the van or truck has an 32 unobstructed view of the lower six feet of the entire rear width of the 33 van or truck body. The cost of a rear cross view mirror is 34 approximately \$50. 35 According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, 36 168 persons were killed and 12,000 injured nationwide in backing 37 accidents in 1994. The United States Department of Transportation estimates that up to 130 of those killed each year in these accidents are 38 39 children. It appears that Federal Express has experienced a 36 percent 40 reduction in backing accidents since installing rear cross view mirrors on its delivery vans. 41

The Assembly Transportation Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 377 (1R).

This bill, as amended by the Senate Law and Public Safety and Veterans' Affairs Committee, requires every delivery van or truck registered in this State with a cube-style, walk-in cargo box up to 18 feet long that is used in the commercial delivery of goods and services to be equipped with either an electronic rear backup monitoring device or a rear crossview mirror located at the top left rear corner of the cargo box. The mirror shall be convex and located to reflect to the vehicle operator an unobstructed, overall view of the lower six feet of the entire rear width of the van or truck body.

This amended bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2940 which was also reported by the committee today.

The Senate Law and Public Safety and Veterans' Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 377.

To reduce the number of fatalities and injuries attributable to "backing accidents," this bill requires either an electronic rear backup monitoring device or a convex-shaped, rear cross view mirror on every commercial delivery van or truck registered in this State if that vehicle is equipped with a cube-style, walk-in cargo box up to 18-feet long. The mirror is to be installed at the top left rear corner of the cargo box so that the operator of the van or truck has an unobstructed view of the lower six feet of the entire rear width of the van or truck body. The cost of a rear cross view mirror is approximately \$50.

The United States Department of Transportation estimates that up to 130 of those killed each year in backing accidents are children. It is the committee's understanding that Federal Express has experienced a 36 percent reduction in backing accidents since installing rear cross view mirrors on its delivery vans.

The committee amended the bill to provide that the vans or trucks subject to the bill may be equipped with an electronic rear backup monitoring device. As introduced, the bill required all vans or trucks subject to its provisions to be fitted with a rear cross view mirror.

This bill was prefiled for introduction in the 2002 legislative session. As reported, the bill contains the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

The Assembly Transportation Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2940.

This bill requires every delivery van or truck registered in this State with a cube-style, walk-in cargo box up to 18 feet long that is used in the commercial delivery of goods and services to be equipped with either an electronic rear backup monitoring device or a rear crossview mirror located at the top left rear corner of the cargo box. The mirror shall be convex and located to reflect to the vehicle operator an unobstructed, overall view of the lower six feet of the entire rear width of the van or truck body.

This bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 377 (1R) which was also reported by the committee today.
